

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****April 2, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. ANAHEIM DUCKS [5]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Anaheim Ducks to the Scotiabank Saddledome to wrap up a brief two-game homestand on Tuesday night. The visitors would score the only goal of the opening frame, with Mason McTavish giving the Ducks a 1-0 lead through 20. Yegor Sharangovich would draw the Flames level just 2:30 into the second, followed by a slick individual effort from Andrei Kuzmenko to give the Flames their first lead of the night. The Ducks would tie things up, and nothing separated these clubs through 40. In the third, the Ducks scored three to prevail 5-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Jets. The Flames have won both prior matchups against Winnipeg at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-11-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 20-20-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Winnipeg Jets to the Scotiabank Saddledome for a Family Day matinee affair on February 19th. Oliver Kylington would score his first of the season after slicing right through the Jets defence and finishing with a backhand under the glove of Hellebuyck to give the Flames an early lead. The Jets would respond with three-straight to go up 3-1, before Blake Coleman buried his then 22nd goal of the campaign, and the Flames trailed 3-2 through a busy opening 20. Calgary would score the only two markers of the middle stanza with Nazem Kadri and Jonathan Huberdeau both finding the back of the net to give the Flames a 4-3 lead through 40. In the third, the home side tacked on two more as the Flames knocked off the Jets for the second time this season, 6-3.

SHARKNADO:

With his tally on Tuesday against Anaheim, Yegor Sharangovich is now just one goal away from joining Kent Nilsson (40 in 1979-80), Michael Cammalleri (39 in 2008-09), Lanny McDonald (34 in 1981-82), Bob MacMillan (31 in 1977-78) and Hakan Loob (30 in 1983-84) as the sixth player in Flames history to record 30 or more goals in their first season with the club. Sharangovich's 29 goals are tied with Blake Coleman for the most among all Flames skaters so far through the 2023-24 campaign.

THE KUZMENKSHOW:

With two goals on Tuesday night against Anaheim, Andrei Kuzmenko has now registered six points over his last three games (4G, 2A) with three consecutive two-point nights. Kuzmenko recorded his third multi-goal game as a member of the Flames, which is the most among all Calgary players since he made his team debut on Feb. 6.

WINNIPEG TIES TO CALGARY:

Jets centre Sean Monahan spent the first nine seasons of his NHL career as a member of the Calgary Flames after being drafted sixth-overall by the Flames during the 2013 NHL Draft. Monahan's 656 games in a Flames sweater are the ninth-most in franchise history, and the Brampton, ON native recorded 212 goals and 250 assists for 462 points during his time in Calgary. Jets recent acquisition Tyler Toffoli spent 119 games in a Flames sweater, scoring 45 goals and 51 assists for 96 points and was teammates with Monahan in Calgary during the second half of the 2021-22 season. Winnipeg blueliner Josh Morrissey was born in Calgary and coming into today's game has skated in 26 contests against his hometown team.

JUNIOR CONNECTIONS:



Flames forward Walker Duehr and Jets defenceman Neal Pionk were teammates on the USHL's Sioux City Musketeers during the 2014-15 season. Duehr was a rookie and played in 49 games, registering two goals and five assists for seven points while Pionk was in his final season of junior hockey and posted a career best 48 points from seven goals and 41 assists. Flames blueliner MacKenzie Weegar and Jets forward Nikolaj Ehlers were teammates on the Halifax Mooseheads of the QMJHL in 2013-14. Weegar posted a career-best 59 points with 12 goals and 47 assists while Ehlers finished second on the Mooseheads in scoring with 104 points.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Flames 5.50 goals-for per-game against the Jets this season is the highest they have against any single opponent during the 2023-24 campaign. The last time the Flames had a higher goals-for per-game against a single opponent was during the 2021-22 season when they registered 6.00 goals-for per-game against the Columbus Blue Jackets.

In the Flames and Jets most recent meeting, Oliver Kylington scored his first of the season. The goal was Kylington's first regular season tally since April 18th, 2022 in Chicago and first goal in NHL action since Game 3 vs. Edmonton during Round 2 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs on May 22nd, 2022.
