January 30, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. ANAHEIM DUCKS [1]

The Calgary Flames continued a four-game week by welcoming the Anaheim Ducks to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Through 20 minutes, the visitors would find themselves up 1-0 thanks to a goal from Frank Vatrano. Calgary would find a response just 15 seconds into the middle stanza with Adam Klapka making a slick move to the backhand and beating John Gibson to level things at one a piece. Then with 14 seconds remaining in the second, Blake Coleman would deflect a Matt Coronato shot to give the Flames their first lead of the night, and the scoreboard read 2-1 to the home side through 40. In the third, Calgary would pull away courtesy of a pair of Matt Coronato strikes and knocked off the Ducks 4-1.

On Thursday the Calgary Flames acquired left winger Joel Farabee and centre Morgan Frost from the Philadelphia Flyers in exchange for forwards Andrei Kuzmenko, Jakob Pelletier and Calgary's second-round pick in 2025 and a seventh-round pick in 2028.

THE NEW GUYS:

Joel Farabee, a 24-year-old left winger, was a first round draft pick (14th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2018 NHL Draft. The following season he earned Hockey East and NCAA Rookie of the Year awards as he led Boston University with 36 points in 37 games as a freshman. After starting his NHL career in 2019-20, Joel has scored 90 goals along with 111 assists for 201 points and 219 penalty minutes in 383 games along with two 20+ goal seasons. This year he has netted eight goals and 11 assists for 19 points in 49 games.

Morgan Frost, a 25-year-old centreman, was also a first round pick (27th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2017 NHL Draft. He was an OHL First Team All-Star in both 2018 and 2019 as a member of the Soo Greyhounds before starting his NHL career the following season. In 277 career games with the Flyers, Morgan scored 50 goals and added 85 assists for 135 points and has had two 40+ point seasons. This season he was fourth in Flyers scoring with 11 goals and 14 assists for 25 points in 48 games and has a 51.8% win percentage in face-offs.

ROONEY 300:

Kevin Rooney skated in his 300th NHL game on Thursday's 4-1 win over Anaheim. The Canton, MA native made his NHL debut on March 2nd, 2017 against the Washington Capitals as a member of the New Jersey Devils. Rooney joined the Flames organization in July of 2023, and has skated in 90 contests in Flames colours, with nine points from six goals and three helpers.

JUNIOR CONNECTIONS:

Flames rearguard Jake Bean and Red Wings Centre Michael Rasmussen were teammates on the WHL's Tri-City Americans for the back half of the 2017-18 season. Rasmussen was in his fourth season with the Americans and enjoyed a career-best 59-point campaign. Bean was a midseason acquisition from the Calgary Hitmen and would skate in 32 games in an Americans uniform, putting up 21 points. The pair would both skate in 14 postseason matchups as the Americans reached the Western Conference Finals of the 2018 WHL Playoffs, eventually falling to an Everett Silvertips team which featured a rookie Dustin Wolf.



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Matt Coronato recorded the third multi-goal performance of his career (also Oct. 15, 2024 & Nov. 5, 2024) in Thursday's 4-1 win over the Ducks.

Yegor Sharangovich scored his first goal as a member of the Flames against Detroit on October 22, 2023.

Morgan Frost is looking to become the 25th player to wear the number 16 in Flames franchise history. Joel Farabee carries over his number 86 with the Flames, while Rory Kerins will now wear number 6 with the Calgary Flames to match his number 6 with the Calgary Wranglers.
