

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 25, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. SEATTLE KRAKEN [3] (OT)****[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)**

Calgary returned home from a four-game road trip for a pair of contests, starting by welcoming the Seattle Kraken to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Tuesday night. Adam Klapka would score the only marker of the first after making a power move to the net and collecting a rebound to register his second of the season. In the second, Seattle would strike twice to flip the script and take a 2-1 lead into the third. The third would see the Flames battle back, with Nazem Kadri scoring on a Flames powerplay to even things at twos. Shortly after, Rasmus Andersson rifled a point shot in to give the home side their first lead since the opening period with under five minutes left to play. However, Seattle found an equalizer with the net empty to force overtime. In the extra frame, Dustin Wolf would stop Vince Dunn point blank, Matt Coronato collected the rebound and sprung Nazem Kadri on a breakaway, and the London, ON native made a slick move to call game and lift the Flames over the Kraken 4-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Stars. Calgary has fallen in both prior matchups with Dallas in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-10-2 against Central Division teams and a record of 19-14-5 against Western Conference opponents.

NAZ-HIM KADRI:

With a pair of goals on Tuesday against Seattle, Nazem Kadri reached 300 in his NHL career to become the fifth skater from the 2009 NHL Draft to reach the 300-goal mark, joining; John Tavares (drafted 1st overall by NYI), Matt Duchene (drafted 3rd overall by COL), Evander Kane (drafted 4th overall by ATL), and Chris Kreider (drafted 19th overall by NYR).

Kadri's 300 goal breakdown:

TOR: 161G in 561GP (2009-2019)

COL: 58G in 178GP (2019-2022)

CGY: 81G in 234GP (2022-pres.)

The second of Kadri's two goals on Tuesday was the overtime winner, which makes him the first player in Flames franchise history with an overtime goal in consecutive games and third in the league to achieve the feat in 2024-25 along with Dylan Guenther (UTA) and Nick Suzuki (MTL).

COMEBACK KIDS:

The Flames battled back from a third period deficit on Tuesday against Seattle to earn their fourth-consecutive comeback win dating back to March 18th. The four-game run is the third longest stretch in Flames franchise history behind a six-game run in 2016-17 and five-game run in 1988-89. Calgary also registered their third third-period comeback win in March, which is the most among all teams this month.

MATTY 100:

Matt Coronato skated in his 100th NHL game on Tuesday against Seattle, recording two assists in a 4-3 Flames overtime victory. Coronato has become the 13th player from the 2021 draft class to reach 100 NHL games. The Greenlawn, NY native was drafted 13th overall by the Flames that year, and made his NHL debut on April 12, 2023 after finishing his college career with Harvard where he posted 72 points in 68 career NCAA games. Coronato reached the 20-goal plateau on Saturday in New York to become the first Flames player age 22 or younger to reach the mark since Matthew Tkachuk scored 23 in 2019-20.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

With his third period marker on Tuesday against the Kraken, Rasmus Andersson recorded his 10th goal of the season and now sits just one tally away from tying his career-high of 11 which he set during the 2022-23 campaign. Andersson's goal was also his 53rd in the regular season and playoffs combined for the Flames, which moves him past T.J. Brodie (52) and gives him the seventh-most by a blueliner in Flames franchise history (in the regular season + playoffs).

HOWLIN FOR YOU:

With his 26-save effort on Tuesday against Seattle, Dustin Wolf (24-14-5 in 43 GP) has tie Jordan Binnington (24 in 2018-19 w/ STL) for the second-most wins in a season by a rookie goaltender since 2017-18, behind Stuart Skinner (29 in 2022-23 w/ EDM). Wolf also earned his 32nd career win and surpassed Bob Mason (31) for the seventh most by an American rookie. The list is topped by Jimmy Howard (38).



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Connor Zary made his NHL debut and scored his first NHL goal against the Dallas Stars in the club's last meeting at the Scotiabank Saddledome on November 1st, 2023.

Dan Vladar played his 100th NHL game in the Flames and Stars last meeting on March 6th.

Thanks to Adam Klapka's game-opening goal on Tuesday's victory over Seattle, the Flames improved their record to 25-7-5 when scoring first in 2024-25.
