

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****April 14, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] vs. ARIZONA COYOTES [5]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Arizona Coyotes to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Sunday night. The Coyotes would jump out to an early 2-0 lead 3:55 into the contest, but the Flames would battle back with goals from Andrie Kuzmenko and Matt Coronato to draw level before the midway point of the first. Arizona would add a third late in the frame to lead 3-2 through 20. In the second, the teams traded goals with Connor Zary and Yegor Sharangovich lighting the lamp for the home side, but Arizona would also net a pair and they led 5-4 through 40. Nazem Kadri would score two goals in the final frame to help Calgary rally to knock off Arizona 6-5.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Canucks. Calgary has a record of 1-2-0 in their previous three matchups with Vancouver.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 12-11-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 22-23-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames began a back-to-back set on Saturday night in Vancouver on March 23rd. The Canucks would open the scoring 48 seconds into the contest and lead 1-0 through 20. In the second, the Canucks would double their advantage before Rasmus Andersson got the Flames on the board and cut the deficit to one heading into the third. Vancouver would add a powerplay marker and hold on for a 4-2 win.

BELARUSSIAN HISTORY:

With his goal in Sunday night's 6-5 win over Arizona, Yegor Sharangovich recorded his 59th point of 2023-24 (31G, 28A) to become the all-time highest scoring Belarusian in a single season. Mikhail Grabovski previously held the record with 58 points from 29 goals and 29 assists during the 2010-11 campaign as a member of the Toronto Maple Leafs. This season, Sharangovich also became the first player of Belarusian descent to score 30 goals in a single season when he did so on April 6th vs. Edmonton.

NAZ-HIM KADRI:

With two goals and an assist on Sunday night against Arizona, Nazem Kadri became the first Flames player since Elias Lindholm (2 GP from Dec. 18-20, 2022) to record back-to-back three-point outings. The last player to extend their streak to three contests for Calgary was Doug Gilmour from Oct. 31 – Nov. 5, 1988 (3 GP). Kadri now has 29 tallies on the season and is looking to reach the 30-goal plateau for the third time in his career (32 in 2016-17 and 32 in 2017-18).

KYLINGTON 200:

Oliver Kylington is slated to skate in his 200th NHL game tonight in Vancouver. The Stockholm, Sweden native made his NHL debut on April 9th, 2016 in Minnesota where he played in 17:22 of ice-time with one shot. Kylington was the Flames second-round pick in the 2015 NHL draft and has a chance to become the 18th-active Swedish defenceman to reach 200 NHL games and join Rasmus Andersson as two of 21 defenceman from the 2015 draft class to reach 200 NHL games in their careers.

KLAP YOUR HANDS:

On Monday morning, the Flames announced the recall of forward Adam Klapka from the Calgary Wranglers of the American Hockey League. The 6'8" winger ranks second in AHL scoring among Czechia natives, with 21 goals and 24 assists for 45 points in 64 games. Klapka is in the midst of a career-year for the Wranglers with his 45 points leading the team. Earlier this season, the 23-year-old made his NHL debut, skating in four games for the Flames from January 20-27. Klapka was a free agent signing by Calgary in May of 2022.



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Rasmus Andersson is currently at 199 points and just one point shy of becoming the 11th active Swedish-born defenceman to reach the 200-point plateau, and sixth rearguard from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat.

Andrei Kuzmenko's 12 points (7G, 5A) in April are tied for the second-most in the NHL in the month.

Joel Hanley scored his first goal as a member of the Flames in these clubs' most recent meeting on March 23rd in Vancouver.
