



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

March 14, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. NEW YORK ISLANDERS [3]

The Calgary Flames mounted a third-period push but ultimately fell 3–2 to the New York Islanders on Saturday night at UBS Arena. The Islanders built a three-goal lead in the opening period on tallies from Casey Cizikas and two from Simon Holmstrom. After a scoreless middle frame, Calgary responded in the third with goals from Mikael Backlund and Blake Coleman to cut the deficit to one, outshooting New York 17–9 in the final period. Calgary’s comeback effort would ultimately fall just short and the Flames will close out their five-game Eastern Conference road swing tonight in Detroit.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Red Wings. Calgary fell 4-0 to Detroit in these clubs' first matchup on January 10 at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-7-2 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 12-13-4 against Eastern Conference opponents.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund scored his 230th-career goal on Saturday in New York to move him past Kent Nilsson (229) for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history. The goal also gave Backlund the most tallies by a Swedish-born skater in Flames history:

On Thursday in New Jersey, Backlund recorded his 600th NHL point and become the 26th skater of Swedish descent in NHL history to reach 600-points. He also became the sixth player in Flames franchise history to record 600 points with the club, and is eight away from tying Johnny Gaudreau for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history:

Olli Määttä recorded an assist on Mikael Backlund's third-period marker on Saturday in New York to record his 200th NHL point. Määttä has become the 14th defenceman from the 2012 NHL Draft to reach the 200-point milestone, and third Finish skater from his draft class to achieve 200 points. Since joining the Flames, Määttä has recorded four points (0-4 – 4) in five games with Calgary.

Yegor Sharangovich scored his 14th goal of the season on Thursday night against his former club, the New Jersey Devils. The goal marked the 221st point of his NHL career which ranks as the third-most among all players of Belarusian-descent in NHL history. He now sits just one point away from tying Andrei Kostitsyn (222) for the second-most points by a Belarusian in the history of the league.

John Beecher scored Calgary's league-leading 11th shorthanded goal of 2025-26 on Thursday in New Jersey. In the past 25 years, the Flames have scored more shorthanded goals in just the 2018-19 season (28), 2006-07 season (15) and 2013-14 season (12). Blake Coleman and Joel Farabee are tied with a team-high four shorthanded goals, while nine different skaters have recorded a shorthanded point for Calgary this season.

FUTURE WATCH:

Flames prospects Cole Reschny and Eric Jamieson were named to the NCHC 2025-26 All-Rookie Team while Ethan Wyttenbach earned a unanimous selection to both the ECAC All-Rookie Team and All-ECAC First Team. Jonathan Castagna was named First-Team All-Ivy and All-ECAC First Team. Free agent signing Tyson Gross earned a spot on the All-NCHC First Team.

In his first collegiate season with the University of North Dakota, Reschny leads all NCHC freshmen with 33 points from five goals and 28 assists, also NCHC freshmen high, in 32 games. The Macklin, SK native has excelled in the faceoff dot, ranking third among NCHC rookies with 265 faceoff wins, while his 54.3-win-percentage is second among freshman centers. He was twice named NCHC Forward of the Week and once Rookie of the Week in 2025-26 and tops all NCHC rookies with a +13 plus/minus on the year. Reschny was selected 18th overall by the Flames at the 2025 NHL Draft.

Also in his first collegiate campaign, Eric Jamieson amassed 16 points from seven goals and nine assists in 37 games with the University of Denver. His seven goals led all NCHC freshman blueliners, while his 16 points were the third-most among NCHC rookie defensemen. The Calgary, AB native also topped NCHC freshman rearguards with a + 11 rating and ranked second in blocked shots with 49. He was the Flames sixth round selection (177th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft.

Freshman Ethan Wyttenbach was the only unanimous selection to the ECAC All-Rookie Team following his debut season with Quinnipiac. The Roslyn, NY native led the entire NCAA in scoring, posting 57 points in 36 games. He scored 24 goals which ranked second the NCAA along with 33 assists which also ranked second among NCAA skaters. In conference play, Wyttenbach averaged 1.64 points-per-game, scoring 15 goals while adding 21 assists for 36 points in ECHC contests. He was selected by the Flames in the fifth-round (144th overall) in the 2025 NHL Draft.

Flames recent acquisition Jonathan Castagna was unanimous named First-Team All-Ivy after leading Cornell in scoring with 32 points from a team-high 14 goals and 18 assists, the second-most on the club. Castagna recorded 11 points (6-5—11) in Ivy play, tied for third in the league in scoring. He also paced the Ivy League in both faceoff wins (126) and faceoff wins per game (12.60), which included registering a season-high 22 faceoff wins against Princeton on Jan. 16. In addition to being All-Ivy, he was named to the All-ECAC First Team.

On March 12, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of college free agent centre Tyson Gross. Gross, a Calgary, AB native was a finalist for NCHC Player of the Year, Forward of the Year and Defensive Forward of the Year following his third season with St. Cloud State University, and first as captain. Gross registered a team-leading 41 points from 18 goals and 23 assists, sitting tied for fifth in NCHC scoring. The 23-year-old excelled in the faceoff dot, leading his conference in faceoff wins with 489. The local product earned an NCHC Forward of the Week selection in February following a weekend series against Arizona State when he recorded a shorthanded tally in back-to-back contests.
