January 11, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. LOS ANGELES KINGS [1]

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Los Angeles Kings to the Scotiabank Saddledome for Hockey Night in Canada. The Kings would score the only goal of the first with Jacob Moverare giving the visitors a 1-0 edge. In the second, the Flames would find an equalizer with Matt Coronato placing a perfect shot over the shoulder of David Rittich to level this contest through 40. In the third, the Flames would strike on the man advantage with Jonathan Huberdeau making it goals in back-to-back games and Calgary had their first lead of the night. The home side would shut the door from there and knock off the Kings 2-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Blackhawks. Calgary has won both previous matchup Chicago so far in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 6-4-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 12-9-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING WITH CHICAGO:

The Calgary Flames finished off a five-game homestand prior to the Christmas break by welcoming the Chicago Blackhawks to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Calgary would open the scoring just past the midway point of the first with Jonathan Huberdeau being sprung on a shorthanded breakaway and sliding home his 13th to give the Flames the lead. Nazem Kadri would double the home side's advantage just over a minute later and Calgary headed into the first intermission up 2-0. The Flames offense would erupt in the second, with Connor Zary, Matt Coronato, and Blake Coleman all finding the back of the net to counter a Connor Bedard goal to give Calgary a 5-1 lead through 40. Chicago would push in the third, but the Flames would hang on and head into the Christmas break with a 6-4 win.

HUBY DOO:

With his goal on Saturday against Los Angeles, Jonathan Huberdeau has now registered the game-winning goal in back-to-back games. Huberdeau has a team leading 4 GWG's this season and has found the back of the net 10 times in his last 14 outings, with 20 points in his last 20 games.

WEEGSY BABY:

With two assists in his last outing against Chicago, MacKenzie Weegar recorded his 100th point since joining the Flames in 2022-23. With 100 points in his-then 197th game in a Flames sweater, Weegar became the fourth defenseman to reach the milestone with the franchise in under 200 games over the past 25 years, and joined Dion Phaneuf (162 GP), Dennis Wideman (174 GP) and Dougie Hamilton (178 GP).

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

Following his 31 save effort on Saturday, Dustin Wolf has improved his save percentage to .936 at home this season. Wolf's .936 save percentage is the highest by a Flames goalie through the first 14 home games of a season in franchise history, topping the previous high set by Miikka Kiprusoff when he posted a .935 through his first 14 contests at the Saddledome in 2003-04. Wolf has also now recorded the second-most wins through a goalie's first 40 games as a member of the Flames franchise with 22, only Miikka Kiprusoff (25) has more.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK:

On Friday, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of centre Rory Kerins from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Kerins is enjoying a breakout season with the Wranglers, posting an AHL-leading 21 goals along with 13 assists for 34 points, ranking him second in the AHL scoring race. The 22-year-old came out of the gates fast, scoring two goals in the Wranglers season opener, before topping that with a hattrick two games later, and began the season with seven goals through his first four outings. Kerins would finish the month with 11 points through Calgary's first 10 contests and was named the AHL Player of the Month for October. The native of Caledon, ON was recently selected to represent Team Pacific at the 2025 AHL All-Star Classic in Palm Desert, CA.

CHICAGO CALGARY TIES:

Blackhawks blueliner T.J. Brodie was drafted by the Flames in the fourth round (114th overall) in the 2008 NHL Draft. The Chatham, ON native would spend 10 seasons with the Flames organization, establishing himself as a full-time NHLer beginning in the 2013-14 campaign. Chicago forward Taylor Hall was born in Calgary and is looking to skate in his 37th contest against his hometown team.



Flames Head Coach Ryan Huska played his lone NHL game as a member of the Chicago Blackhawks, their opponent on that night was the Calgary Flames. Flames forwards Walker Duehr and Matt Coronato and goaltender Dan Vladar all spent time with the Chicago Steel of the USHL. Both Duehr and Vladar spent one season with the Chicago Steel (Vladar: 2015-16), (Duehr: 2016-17) while Coronato spent both the 2019-20 and 2020-21 campaigns with the Steel. In his second season in the USHL, Coronato would help guide Chicago to a USHL Championship, earning USHL Forward of the Year honours along the way.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Kevin Rooney scored his first NHL goal against the Chicago Blackhawks as a member of the New Jersey Devils on January 14th, 2019.

The Flames (20-14-7) required the fewest games to reach 20 wins in a season since 2021-22 (38 GP).

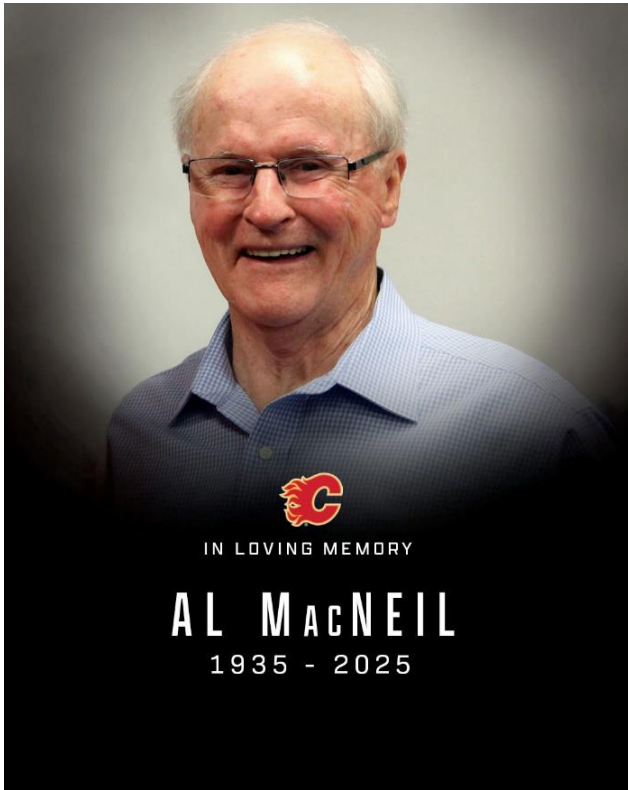

The Calgary Flames sadly announce the passing of long-time Flames executive and former head coach Al MacNeil.

Al, a Stanley Cup winning Head Coach, National Hockey League player and Calgary Flames executive and consultant whose name is engraved on the Stanley Cup four times, including the Flames 1989 championship, passed away at the age of 89 years, on January 5, 2025, surrounded by his family in Calgary.

An Original Six player, Al was a rugged defenceman and open-ice hitter who played 524 NHL games for the Toronto Maple Leafs, Montreal Canadiens, Chicago Blackhawks, New York Rangers, later concluding his NHL playing career as a Pittsburgh Penguin following his selection in the 1967 expansion draft.

Recognizing Al's potential as a Head Coach, legendary Montreal Canadiens General Manager Sam Pollock acquired his rights from the Penguins and Al subsequently spent the last two seasons of his professional hockey career mentoring young players as a Player Coach, first for the Houston Apollos of the CHL in 1968-69 and in his final year for the Canadiens then top farm team, the Montreal Voyageurs of the AHL in 1969-70.

Al won his first Stanley Cup as the rookie Head Coach of the Montreal Canadiens in 1971, his second and third Cups as the Director of Player Personnel for the Canadiens' in their 1978 and 1979 Stanley Cup victories, and his fourth as the Assistant General Manager of the Calgary Flames' 1989 Stanley Cup winning team.

As a long-time NHL player, coach and executive, Al took tremendous pride in developing and coaching hundreds of NHL hockey players over many decades.

As the General Manager and Head Coach of the Montreal Canadiens' farm team, the Nova Scotia Voyageurs, he guided the team to three Calder Cup Championships in 1972, 1976 and 1977. He was named American Hockey League Coach of the Year two times, in 1972 and 1977 and was inducted into the American Hockey League Hall of Fame in 2014.

Al was an Assistant Coach of Team Canada winning the 1976 Canada Cup, and was also an Assistant Coach of the 1981 Canada Cup team.

As a junior player with the Toronto Marlboros, he won two Memorial Cups in 1955 and as team captain in 1956. Al was the last Head Coach of the NHL's Atlanta Flames and the first Head Coach of the Calgary Flames for their first two seasons in our city.

Committed to the team and the City of Calgary, Al was a part of the Flames' hockey operations for many years. He returned to the NHL bench as an Interim Head Coach for the Flames for 13 games in the 2002-2003 season.

Al is survived by his wife of 58 years, Norma, son Allister, a scout for the Flames, and his daughter Allison and son-in-law Paul Sparkes. He has two grandsons Jack Sparkes, a 2022 draft pick of the Los Angeles Kings, and Ben Sparkes, a university student in Nova Scotia who plays Junior B hockey. Al has a large extended family based in Nova Scotia, and across Canada and the United States.
