

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 15, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. WINNIPEG JETS [4] (SO)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Winnipeg Jets to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Saturday for a Hockey Night in Canada showdown, falling 4–3 in a shootout. After a scoreless first period, the teams erupted for four goals in a span of just over six minutes early in the second. Mark Scheifele opened the scoring just past the midway point of the middle stanza, before Jake Bean answered 33 seconds later, only for Tanner Pearson to restore the Jets' lead at 8:25. Kevin Bahl would deadlock the game for the second time at 13:29 with his second of the year, with Matt Coronato and Morgan Frost picking up the assists. Winnipeg regained the lead again just over a minute into the third as Cole Perfetti put the Jets ahead 3–2. Calgary pushed late and would force overtime after Matt Coronato capitalized on a Flames powerplay at 18:46, set up by Rasmus Andersson and Jonathan Huberdeau. The extra frame would solve nothing, and in the shootout, the Jets would claim the extra point.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Blackhawks. Calgary fell in their first meeting on November 7 at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 0-8-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 2-11-1 against Western Conference opponents.

FROSTY THE SNOWMAN:

With his two-assist effort on Saturday night against Winnipeg, Morgan Frost recorded the 100th and 101st assists of his NHL career. Frost has become the 11th player from the 2017 NHL Draft class to reach the 100-assists plateau. The Aurora, ON native collected his first career assist in his second NHL game on November 21, 2019, in Carolina, setting up the game-winning goal as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers.

RICK AND MORTY:

On Monday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of Sam Morton from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. In 16 American Hockey League contests this season, Morton has registered 12 points from four goals and eight assists, including a helper in his most recent outing on Sunday night in Henderson. The Lafayette, CO native skated in 70 games for the Wranglers in 2024-25, posting 20 goals and 25 assists for 45 points in his first full professional campaign. He also produced four game-winning goals, tied for the third-most on the team last season. Morton made his NHL debut last season, suiting up for the Flames season finale in Los Angeles on April 17th, celebrating the occasion by scoring his first NHL goal.

ON THE HUNT:

Monday morning also saw the Flames announce the recall of forward Dryden Hunt from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Hunt has appeared in 15 games for the Wranglers this season, recording five goals and 11 assists for a team-leading 16 points. Last season, he skated in five games with the Flames and registered three assists, while producing 49 points (16G, 33A) in 49 AHL contests. The 29-year-old has played 235 career NHL games — including 33 with Calgary — and has totaled 18 goals and 36 assists for 54 points, along with 121 penalty minutes.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman opened the scoring on Thursday against San Jose, recording his 14th game-opening goal since joining Calgary in 2021–22. Only Mikael Backlund and Jonathan Huberdeau have more over that span (both with 15). His tally also stood as the game-winner, giving him 17 GWGs during his Flames tenure — the most by any Calgary skater in that timeframe. Coleman currently has 298 points through his career and with two more can become the fourth Texas-born skater in NHL history to reach the 300-point milestone.

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Calgary Flames are prepared to open their fourth back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season tonight in Chicago before travelling to Buffalo for a clash with the Sabres tomorrow night. Calgary's last back-to-back set came on November 1st when they faced the Nashville Predators at Bridgestone Arena before heading to Philadelphia the following night. The Flames have five more back-to-back sets remaining this season after tonight and tomorrow, with their next coming on November 22nd when they welcome the Dallas Stars to the Scotiabank Saddledome before heading to Rogers Arena for their second meeting with the Vancouver Canucks on November 23rd.

HOWLIN FOR YOU:

With his 16-save effort against San Jose on November 13, Dustin Wolf became just the second California-born goaltender to record a shutout against a California-based team in NHL history, joining Thatcher Demko (Dec. 6, 2021 vs. LAK). Wolf now has four NHL shutouts in his career, tying Pat Riggin for the third-most by a Flames goaltender before age 25. Only Dan Bouchard (11) and Trevor Kidd (10) had more at that age.

HUBY DOO:

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 791 points in his NHL career and is just nine-shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,010) and Mark Scheifele (828). There are 25 active skaters who have surpassed 800 points in the NHL.



FIRE AWAY:



In Calgary and Chicago's first meeting, Matt Coronato registered a game-high 11 shots on goal — the highest single-game total by a Flames skater since Blake Coleman on January 4, 2022, in Florida. Including Calgary and Chicago's first meeting, Coronato leads the NHL in shots with 30 since November 7. Coronato's 11-shot effort marked just the 10th instance of a player recording 11 or more shots in a single game in Flames franchise history:

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Adam Klapka, Matt Coronato, Sam Morton, Yan Kuznetsov, Sam Honzek, and Dustin Wolf were all teammates on the Calgary Wranglers during the 2024 Calder Cup Playoffs. Klapka paced the club with seven points in six postseason games, while Coronato (1-5—6) and Morton (3-1—4) finished second and fourth on the team in playoff scoring, respectively. Between the pipes, Dustin Wolf started all six contests, posting a .924 save percentage, a 2.84 goals-against average, and one shutout.
