## **Post-Game Notes**

- The Tampa Bay Lightning defeated the Vancouver Canucks by a score of 4-3 at AMALIE Arena on Thursday night.
- Tampa Bay improved to 2-2-1 this season, including a 2-0-0 record on home ice.
- The Lightning won their seventh consecutive game against the Canucks and are 8-2-0 over their last 10 matchups.
- The Bolts have also scored four or more goals in eight of their last 10 games against the Canucks.
- Tampa Bay outshot the Canucks 36-29, including an 18-6 advantage in the second period.
- The Lightning improved to 2-0-0 when they outshoot their opponent and score the game-opening goal.
- Nikita Kucherov and Steven Stamkos each led the Bolts with seven shots on goal, the most by any Lightning players so far this season.
- Tanner Jeannot dished out four hits to lead Tampa Bay skaters. Jeannot's 16 hits this season are good for the team lead.
- Tampa Bay blocked 23 shots on Thursday night, including six by Nick Perbix.
  The last time the Lightning blocked 23 or more shots in a home game was on April 26, 2022 against the Blue Jackets (25 BkS).
- The Lightning won 26 of 59 faceoffs (44%) but were led at the dot by Anthony Cirelli who won eight of his 11 draws (73%).
- Entering the night, Anthony Cirelli ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the NHL for faceoff wins with 36.

- Stamkos has now pointed in 15 of his 19 career games against Vancouver (16-12—28 pts.).
- Kucherov has tallied multi-point efforts in nine of his last 12 games against the Canucks (8-10—18 pts.).
- Hagel has posted four points in his three career games against Vancouver (1-3— 4 pts.).
- Perbix has posted three assists in two career games against the Canucks.
- Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson stopped 26 of the 29 shots he faced to improve his record to 2-1-1.
- Nick Paul opened the scoring and gave the Bolts a 1-0 lead with a power-play goal at 11:10 of the first period.
- Paul has scored three goals this season (3-1—4 pts.), all coming via the power-play.
- Steven Stamkos notched the lone assist on the play, marking his fifth point of the season (2-3—5 pts.).
- Brock Boeser and Tyler Myers each scored goals within the first 1:02 of the second period to give Vancouver a 2-1 lead.
- Mikey Eyssimont scored on the rush from the left circlet 15:43 of the second period to tie the game 2-2.
- Eyssimont's goal was his first of the season and his second point.
- Conor Sheary notched his first point in a Lightning sweater with the primary assist on the play.
- Nick Perbix also collected his first point of the season with the secondary assist.
- One minute and nine seconds after Eyssimont's game-tying goal, Nikita Kucherov gave the Bolts a 3-2 lead, firing a shot through traffic from the right circle.
- Brandon Hagel tallied his sixth point of the season (4-2—6) with the primary assist on Kucherov's go-ahead goal.
- Darren Raddysh picked up the secondary assist on the play to mark his second point of the season (0-2—2).

- Nikita Kucherov scored his second goal of the game and fourth goal of the season, converting on a one-timer on the power play at 4:42 of the third period to give Tampa Bay a 4-2 lead.
- Nick Paul tallied his second point of the night and his fifth point of the season (3-2—5) with the primary assist on Kucherov's power-play marker.
- Brayden Point notched his fifth assist and point of the season with the secondary helper on the play.
- J.T. Miller scored at 18:11 of the third period to cut the Bolts' lead to 4-3.
- The Lightning continue their five-game homestand on Saturday night at AMALIE Arena when they take on the Toronto Maple Leafs.
- Tampa Bay is 45-52-8 with two ties all-time against the Leafs, including a home record of 23-26-3 with one tie.
