NEW YORK RANGERS

All-Time Wild Record: 15-15-6 (9-7-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 6-8-3 at New York)

2024-25: Minnesota went 0-0-2 in the season series against the Rangers... New York earned a 3-2 overtime win at Madison Square Garden (3/13) and a 5-4 overtime win in Saint Paul (4/2)... LW **Marcus Johansson** led Minnesota with four points (2-2=4)... D **Brock Faber** (1-1=2) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (0-2=2) had two points each... G **Filip Gustavsson** went 0-0-2 with a 3.93 GAA and a .886 SV%... LW **Artemi Panarin** led the Rangers with four points (1-3=4)... D K'Andre Miller had three points (1-2=3)... D **Braden Schneider** (2-0=2) and C **Vincent Trochek** (2-0=2) had two goals each... G **Igor Shesterkin** went 2-0-0 with a 2.94 GAA and a .885 SV%.

WILD LEADERS: Johansson leads Minnesota with 26 points (11-15=26) in 39 career games against the Rangers... LW **Marcus Foligno** owns 15 points (4-11=15) in 28 matches... RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** has 13 points (8-5=13) in 21 games... C **Ryan Hartman** (2-6=8, in 17 games) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (4-4=8, in 10 games) have eight points each.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 0-1-2 with a 4.14 GAA and a .879 SV% in four career starts vs. the Rangers... G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced New York.

RANGERS LEADERS: Panarin leads New York with 30 points (9-21=30) in 23 career games against the Wild... C **J.T. Miller** owns 20 points (10-10=20) in 24 games... Trochek has 13 points (6-7=13) in 17 games... RW **Mika Zibanejad** has 11 points (6-5=11) in 21 games.

RANGERS GOALIES: Shesterkin is 4-1-0 with a 2.95 GAA and a .903 SV% in five career starts vs. Minnesota... G **Jonathan Quick** is 17-11-8 with a 2.59 GAA and a .904 SV%.

CONNECTIONS: Zuccarello recorded 352 points (113-239=352) in 509 games in nine seasons (2010-19) with the Rangers... Tarasenko collected 21 points (8-13=21) in 31 games with New York in 2022-23... Wild Player Development Coach **Derek Stepan** was drafted by the Rangers in the second round (51st overall) of the 2008 NHL Draft and collected 360 points (128-232=360) in 515 games in seven seasons with New York (2010-17)... Former Wild player **Antti Miettinen** is a Player Development Assistant - Europe for the Rangers. He skated in 234 games with the Wild in three seasons (2008-11)... New York Director of Player Development **Jed Ortmeyer** played in 39 games with Minnesota (2010-12)... F **Tyler Pitlick** skated in 34 games and registered four points (1-3=4) for New York during the 2023-24 season... D **Will Borgen** is from Moorhead and played three seasons at Moorhead High (2012-15) and three seasons at St. Cloud State University (2015-18)... C **Jonny Brodzinski** is from Ham Lake and played three seasons at St. Cloud State University (2012-15)... D **Carson Soucy** was selected by Minnesota in the fifth round (157th overall) of the 2013 NHL Draft, and collected 31 points (8-23=31) in three seasons with the Wild (2017-18, 2019-21).

FAST FACTS: The Wild has recorded a point in seven of its last eight games at Madison Square Garden (4-1-3), out scoring the Rangers 28-23... Minnesota has points in 12 of its last 14 games overall (7-2-5) against New York since the start of the 017-18 season... The Wild is 9-5-2 in its last 16 games against the Rangers in Saint Paul, with nine of those games decided by one goal.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Leads the NHL with a 38.5 power-play percentage (PP%) and 10 PPG (26 PPO), trailing only the 2010-11 season (44.4 PP%, 12 PPG) for the highest marks in franchise history through a season's first six games.

Matt Boldy: Ranks fourth in NHL with six PPP (3-3=6) and T-6th in NHL with nine points (4-5=9)... Posted a five-game point streak from 10/9-10/17, tied for the fifth-longest season-opening streak in franchise history... According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.

Zeev Buium: T-1st among NHL rookies with five points (1-4=5) and four assists and ranks second in TOI/G (20:43) and third in shots (12)... Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with four PPA and T-5th with five PPP (1-4=5), while leading all defensemen in both categories... Ranks T-6th in points among NHL defensemen.

Joel Eriksson Ek: T-7th in NHL with four PPP (1-3=4).

Ryan Hartman: Has scored 99 career goals with the Wild.

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranks third in the NHL in PPP (4-3=7), T-6th in points (4-5=9) and T-9th in goals... Opened the season with a four-game point streak from 10/9 - 10/14... Per #NHL Stats, became the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons... With a two PPP (1-1=2) at DAL (10/14), reached 138 career power-play points (66-72=138) and tied Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history... Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Parise, 69).

Jake Middleton: Ranks T-9th with 15 blocked shots on the season.

Tyler Pitlick: Made his Wild debut at PHI (10/18), becoming the 330th player (308th skater) and 36th Minnesota-born player to appear in a regular-season game for the franchise.

Marco Rossi: Has played in 173 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 299 career assists, could join Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach 300 assists with the Wild... Scored a power-play goal vs. LAK (10/13) to reach 133 career powerplay points (35-98=133) and tie Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for sixth-most in Wild history.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Scored his first goal in a Wild sweater at PHI (10/18)... Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with four PPA and T-7th with four PPP (0-4=4)... His 305 career goals leads the current Wild roster... Ranks T-36th among active NHL players in goals.

Yakov Trenin: Recorded seven hits in consecutive games (at WSH, 10/17; at DAL, 10/14), tying the fourth-highest total of his NHL career in each... Ranks fourth in the NHL with 28 hits this season... Currently at 98 career points (55-43=98).

The Wild announced former players Pierre-Marc Bouchard, Marian Gaborik, Brian Rolston and Stephane Veilleux will attend the team's first 25th anniversary celebration night on Tuesday, October 28 when it hosts the Winnipeg Jets at 7:00 p.m. Fans who purchase a special 25th Anniversary Bobblehead ticket will receive a Marian Gaborik bobblehead and have the opportunity to get an autographs from Bouchard, Gaborik, Rolston or Veilleux at a special pre-game signing.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



ON THE POWER PLAY

- Leads the NHL with a 38.5 power-play percentage (PP%) and 10 PPG (26 PPO), trailing only the 2010-11 season (44.4 PP%, 12 PPG) for the highest marks in franchise history through a season's first six games.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

ROAD DAWGS

- Recorded a 23-13-5 record on the road last season, establishing a franchise record with 51 road points.
- Ranked fourth in the NHL in road points, road point percentage (.622) and T-4th in road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild was 16-4-2 last season (.773) when scoring first in a road game, the seventh-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild went 29-0-0 when leading through two periods last season, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Was 21-4-2 when leading through one period last season.
- The Wild scored first in 45 games last season, tied for fourth-most in the NHL, and held a 31-11-3 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild went 41-9-5 (.791) when scoring two-plus goals in regulation last season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild went 33-2-4 (.897) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation last season, T-9th best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- The Wild owned 21 comeback wins (trailed at any point) last season, T-5th most in the NHL.
- The Wild posted seven wins last season in games where it has trailed by two or more goals, fourth-most in the NHL. Minnesota owned a .214 point percentage (7-27-1) in games where it trailed by two-plus goals, T-4th best point percentage in the NHL.
- Minnesota owned a 9-30-5 (.261) record when trailing at any point in the third period. It's .261 point percentage in such situations ranked sixth-highest in the NHL.



PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks third in the NHL in PPP (4-3=7), T-6th in points (4-5=9) and T-9th in goals.
- Opened the season with a four-game point streak from 10/9 - 10/14. Per #NHL Stats, became the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons.
- With a two PPP (1-1=2) at DAL (10/14), reached 138 career power-play points (66-72=138) and tied Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Parise, 69).
- Currently at 395 career points (189-206=395), five shy of tying Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth in franchise history.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).
- Along with Matt Boldy, became the first players in Minnesota history to open a season with consecutive three-plus point games (10/9-10/11).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) in the season opener at STL (10/9), becoming the second player in franchise history to achieve the feat (Bouchard, 0-3=3, 10/5/05).
- Has now registered a point in six consecutive season openers (1-9=10), the longest streak in Wild history.
- Moved his career assist total to 204 at STL (10/9), passing Andrew Brunnette and Jonas Brodin (202 each) for eighth in franchise history.
- Currently with 41 career multi-assist games, needs one more to tie Mats Zuccarello (42) for third-most in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.
- Recorded his 50th point of the season with a goal vs. CHI (12/23/25), established a new franchise mark for fewest games to 50 points in a season (34 GP), besting his previous mark set in 2021-22 (38 GP).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) had more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov notched a point in 16-of-20 road games played in 2024-25 (11-20=31), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 - 11/8/25, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark.
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1/25.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** notched his first career shootout goal vs. LAK (10/13), the game winner.
- Has played in 173 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.
- Opened the season with two points (1-1=2) at STL (10/9).
- Led the team in PPG (seven), ranked second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24) last season.
- Reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SJS (4/9/25).
- Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6/25), his third GWG of the 2024-25 season.
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28/25) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5, 2025.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** ranks fourth in NHL with six PPP (3-3=6) and T-6th in NHL with nine points (4-5=9).
- Posted a five-game point streak from 10/9-10/17, tied for the fifth-longest season-opening streak in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.
- Posted a four-game goal streak from 10/9 - 10/14, becoming the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games.
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.
- Recorded the 20th three-point game (1-2=3) of his career vs. CBJ (10/11), one shy of tying Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.

- **Filip Gustavsson** posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9), reaching 12 for his career and tying Manny Fernandez for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Is the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and is the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 74-49-17 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-3rd in the NHL during that span with 12 shutouts and fourth with a .914 save percentage (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
