

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 25, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. OTTAWA SENATORS [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames opened up a four-game road trip on Monday night in Ottawa. The Flames would strike first with Jonathan Huberdeau depositing a powerplay marker 14:32 into the contest to give the Flames the lead. The Sens would find a response shortly after to tie things up heading into the first intermission. In the second, Ottawa would score a pair to go up 3-1, before Yegor Sharangovich made it goals in three-straight games late in the middle stanza to bring Calgary within one heading into the third. In the final frame, both teams scored as the Senators knocked off the Flames 4-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Red Wings. Calgary fell in both meetings with Detroit in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-1-2 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 6-2-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

SHARK ATTACK:

With his goal on Monday night in Ottawa, Yegor Sharangovich extended his goal-streak to three games, a streak which began on November 21 against the New York Rangers. Since he joined the Flames prior to the start of last season, his 36 goals are the most on the club, with Nazem Kadri (35) and Blake Coleman (34) sitting second and third. Sharangovich has also recorded seven shots in each of his last two outings, and since the start of his three-game goal streak on Nov. 21 has fired a team-leading 18 shots.

CALGARY/DETROIT TIES:

Former Flames Erik Gustafsson (D) and Cam Talbot (G) both now play for the Detroit Red Wings. Gustafsson was a trade acquisition by the Flames at the 2020 trade deadline, and skated in seven games for Calgary, registering three helpers. Cam Talbot was signed as a free agent by the Flames ahead of the 2019-20 campaign and played 26 games for Calgary, posting a 12-10-1 record with a .919 save-percentage along with a 2.63 goals-against average. The pair shared the ice in 10 playoff contests for the Flames in the Stanley Cup Playoff Bubble in August of 2020.

POWER PLAY:

Following their powerplay goal Monday night in Ottawa, the Flames have struck on the man advantage in four-straight games. Since November 19th, the Flames are tied with a league-leading five powerplay markers, the only other club with as many are the New Jersey Devils. Calgary has a 50% efficiency on the man advantage since November 19th.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund enters play tonight with 102 road goals in his NHL career, tied with Lanny McDonald for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history. With one more goal, Backlund can take soul-possession of fifth spot and the only players to score more road goals for the Flames are: Jarome Iginla (257), Theo Fleury (160), Joe Nieuwendyk (135), and Gary Roberts (110). Backlund leads all Swedish-born skaters in Flames franchise history in goals away from home, with Hakan Loob (96), and Kent Nilsson (87) sitting second and third respectively.

JUNIOR CONNECTIONS:



Flames rearguard Jake Bean and Red Wings Centre Michael Rasmussen were teammates on the WHL's Tri-City Americans for the back half of the 2017-18 season. Rasmussen was in his fourth season with the Americans and enjoyed a career-best 59-point campaign. Bean was a midseason acquisition from the Calgary Hitmen and would skate in 32 games in an Americans uniform, putting up 21 points. The pair would both skate in 14 postseason matchups as the Americans reached the Western Conference Finals of the 2018 WHL Playoffs, eventually falling to an Everett Silvertips team which featured a rookie Dustin Wolf.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Yegor Sharangovich scored his first goal as a member of the Flames at Little Caesars Arena in Calgary's last visit to Detroit on October 22, 2023.

Flames centre Nazem Kadri and Red Wings forward JT Compher were teammates on the 2022 Stanley Cup winning Colorado Avalanche.
