FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

January 13, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] at VEGAS GOLDEN KNIGHTS [1]

Game Summary | Event Summary

The Calgary Flames travelled to T-Mobile Arena to finish off a quick two game trip against the Vegas Golden Knights. The Flames would once again start strong, with Blake Coleman and Nazem Kadri both finding their way onto the scoresheet in the first to give the visitors a 2-0 lead through 20. In the second, Andrew Mangiapane would spring Mikael Backlund who slid a backhand around Logan Thompson to make it 3-0 Flames through 40. Vegas get one back in the third, but Jacob Markstrom stood tall in the final stanza, stopping 14 of the 15 third-period shots he faced to help the Flames make it three-straight wins with a 3-1 victory.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Coyotes. The Flames won meeting number one in Arizona 6-2.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-7-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 13-11-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his tallies in Arizona and Vegas last week, Mikael Backlund recorded his 100th road goal and surpassed Al MacInnis (99) for the sole possession of the sixth most in franchise history. He joines five players with 100+ road goals for the franchise: Jarome Iginla (257), Theo Fleury (160), Joe Nieuwendyk (135), Gary Roberts (110) and Lanny McDonald (102). In their last meeting, Mikael Backlund skated in his 950th NHL game which passed Mark Giordano for sole-possession of the second-most games played in Flames franchise history, celebrating with a goal. Backlund's tally came just 20 seconds into the contest to give him four career opening minute goals. The Vasteras, SWE natives four opening minute goals are the seventh-most in franchise history, the only players with more are Eric Vail (7), Theo Fleury (7), Jarome Iginla (6), Colin Patterson (6), Joe Mullen (5) and Kent Nilsson (5).

FIVE DAYS AGO:

The Calgary Flames travelled to Mullett Arena to face the Arizona Coyotes last Thursday night for meeting number one of the season-series. The Flames would come out of the gates flying, with four first period tallies courtesy of Mikael Backlund, Yegor Sharangovich, Rasmus Andersson, and Blake Coleman and left the opening 20 up 4-1. Arizona would get one back in the second, but in the third, Yegor Sharangovich would score a pair to record his second-career hat trick as the Flames left Mullett Arena with a 6-2 victory.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman was named the NHL's Second Star of the week for January 8-14th. Coleman has registered three-straight multi-point games and is currently riding a three-game goal streak with four goals and three assists for seven points last week. In Vegas on Saturday, Coleman matched his career-high goal streak (3GP) for the second time this season and has notched three straight multi-point games for the first time in his career. The 32-year-old leads the Flames in goals and points this season (19-18—37 in 43 GP) and sits one tally shy of his third career 20-goal campaign.

MANGIAPANE 200:

With his assists on Mikael Backlund's insurance goal on Saturday night in Vegas, Andrew Mangiapane recorded his 200th career point. Mangiapane has become the 11th active skater drafted in the sixth-round to reach the 200-point plateau, joining Mark Stone (555), Cam Atkinson (472), Anders Lee (433), Jared Spurgeon (384), Nick Bonino (358), Jesper Fast (240), Kevin Labanc (223), and Connor Brown (219). Mangiapane has registered 103 goals along with 97 assists so far in his NHL career.

SHARAN-GOAL-VICH:

In their first meeting with Arizona, Yegor Sharangovich recorded his second-career hat trick and earned First Star honors in a 6-2 triumph over the Coyotes. Yegor Sharangovich's hat trick was the second of his career, and the first hat trick by a Flames skater since April 12, 2023 (Nikita Zadorov, 3G vs. SJS). The Minsk, BLR native also became the 67th Flames skater to record a hat trick.

CANADIAN ARMED FORCES APPRECIATION NIGHT:

The Calgary Flames will host their Canadian Armed Forces Appreciation Night tonight. This year marks the 18th annual celebration of service members within the Canadian Armed Forces all while raising funds for the Calgary Military Family Resource Centre (CMFRC) and the official charity of the Canadian Armed Forces; Support our Troops. The Calgary Flames will welcome over 400 Canadian Armed Forces members and their families from units across Southern Alberta to the Scotiabank Saddledome. 2024 marks 100 years of service for the Royal Canadian Air Force as a distinct military element.

DOME SWEET DOME:

The Flames get set for a six game homestand starting tonight against the Arizona Coyotes. This is tied for the Flames longest homestand with their other six-game stretch at the 'Dome coming from November 27th to December 9th when they went 3-3-0. Following tonight, the Flames will welcome the Toronto Maple Leafs and the Edmonton Oilers this week, before playing host to the St. Louis Blues, the Columbus Blue Jackets, and Chicago Blackhawks next week.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Arizona's last 10 trips to the Scotiabank Saddledome, the Flames have gone 8-2-0 against the Coyotes, outscoring their Central Division foe 39-22.
