PROSPECT REPORT - APR. 3, 2025

TEN DUCKS PROSPECTS REMAIN IN THE POSTSEASON

Ten Anaheim prospects are currently in their respective league's postseason, including Beckett Sennecke (OHL), Maxim Masse (QMJHL), Ethan Procyszyn (OHL), Alexandre Blais (QMJHL), Carey Terrance (OHL), Tarin Smith (WHL), Konnor Smith (OHL), Rodwin Dionicio (U20-Elit), Vojtech Port (WHL) and Artyom Galimov (KHL).

BECKETT SENNECKE (Anaheim first round, third overall in 2024) recorded 36-50=86 points in 56 games with the Oshawa Generals this season, with career-highs in scoring, goals and assists. He finished the regular season at a point-per-game average (1.54) and led the Generals in both scoring and goals. He has recorded 2-3=5 points in three postseason contests. Oshawa currently leads their first-round series with Brampton 2-1.

MAXIM MASSE (Anaheim third round, 66th overall in 2024) recorded 33-26=59 points in 47 games with the Chicoutimi Saguenéens this season. He finished the regular season at a point-per-game average (1.26) and led Chicoutimi in goals. He has earned two assists in four postseason contests. Chicoutimi currently leads their first-round series with Acadie-Bathurst 3-1.

ETHAN PROCYSZYN (Anaheim third round, 68th overall in 2024) recorded 34-30=64 points in 68 games with the North Bay Battalion this season, with career-highs in scoring, goals and assists in his first season as the club's captain. He ranked third overall among OHL leaders in power-play goals (17) and led North Bay in both scoring and goals. He has recorded one goal in three postseason contests. North Bay currently trails 3-0 in their first-round series with Brantford.

ALEXANDRE BLAIS (Anaheim fourth round, 100th overall in 2024) recorded 20-53=73 points in 60 games with the Rimouski Oceanic this season. He ranked sixth among QMJHL leaders in assists and finished the regular season at a point-per-game average (1.22) while he led Rimouski in scoring. He has recorded 1-3=4 points in four postseason contests. The Oceanic swept their first-round series vs. Charlottetown 4-0.

CAREY TERRANCE (Anaheim second round, 59th overall in 2023) recorded 20-19=39 points in 45 games with the Erie Otters as the club's captain this season. He finished the season ranking tied for fifth among Erie leaders in goals and sixth in points. Erie currently leads their first-round series with Saginaw 2-1.

TARIN SMITH (Anaheim third round, 78th overall in 2023) recorded 16-44=60 points in 65 games with the Everett Silvertips this season, with career-highs in scoring, goals and assists as the club's alternate captain. Smith ranked tied for seventh among WHL defensemen in points, ninth in power-play goals (6) and 10th with a +35 rating. He has recorded 1-3=4 points in three postseason contests. The Silvertips currently trail 2-1 in their first-round series vs. Seattle.

KONNOR SMITH (Anaheim fourth round, 97th overall in 2023) recorded 10-16=26 points in 40 games split between the Brampton Steelheads and Owen Sound this season. His totals in scoring, goals and assists were career-bests. He has recorded two assists in three postseason contests. Brampton currently trails 2-1 in their first-round series with Oshawa.

RODWIN DIONICIO (Anaheim fifth round, 129th overall in 2023) split his season between San Diego (AHL) with 5-4=9 points in 24 GP, EHC Biel-Bienne (NL) with six assists in nine GP and EHC Biel-Bienne U20 (U20-Elit). He has recorded 6-5=11 points in 12 postseason contests with EHC Biel-Bienne U20.

VOJTECH PORT (Anaheim sixth round, 161st overall in 2023) recorded 2-12=14 points in 59 games split between the Lethbridge Hurricanes and Moose Jaw Warriors this season. He has recorded 1-4=5 points in four postseason contests. Lethbridge currently leads their first-round series with Brandon 3-1.

ARTYOM GALIMOV (Anaheim fifth round, 129th overall in 2020) recorded 35-24=59 points in 68 games with Ak Bars Kazan this season, with career-bests in scoring, goals and assists. He co-led the KHL with a +31 rating, ranked second among league leaders in goals and fifth in scoring. Galimov also led Kazan skaters in goals and scoring. He has recorded 2-1=3 points in five postseason contests.

Three of the Ducks five CHL selections in the 2024 NHL Draft finished their regular-season Canadian Hockey League schedule at a point-per-game average, including Sennecke, Masse and Blais. Overall, eight Ducks prospects ranked among the top-10 leaders in their respective league's regular season with the additions of **DARELS ULJANSKIS** ranking second among J20 Nationell defensemen in points (9-30=39), third in assists and fifth in goals and **DAMIAN CLARA** ranking tied for fourth among Liiga goaltenders with a .910 SV%. The Ducks also had six prospects lead their respective club's in goals, points or both categories with the addition of **AUSTIN BURNEVIK** (led St. Cloud in goals and scoring with 13-15=28 points in 35 GP).

STIAN SOLBERG made his AHL debut Mar. 21 @ Henderson and earned his first career AHL points with his assist Mar. 22 @ Henderson. He collected his first AHL goal with the game-winning tally Mar. 29 vs. Calgary. Solberg has recorded 2-2=4 points in six games with the Gulls.

IAN MOORE made his AHL debut Mar. 21 @ Henderson. He recorded his first AHL points with his first multi-point/assist outing Mar. 26 vs. San Jose (0-2=2) and scored his first career AHL goal (PPG) Mar. 28 vs. Tucson. Moore has recorded 1-3=4 points in six games with San Diego.



VILLE HUSSO posted a six-game win streak Mar. 5-29, including his fourth shutout of the season and second with San Diego, stopping all 28 shots Mar. 21 @ Henderson. Husso ranks tied fifth among AHL leaders in shutouts on the campaign. Since joining the Gulls, Husso is 7-2-0 with a 2.55 GAA and .907 SV%.

TRISTAN LUNEAU ranks sixth among all AHL skaters in assists (41) while ranking second among league defensemen in assists, second in point-per-game (.92) and fourth in scoring (7-41=48). He also leads active AHL rookie skaters in assists, while ranking third in scoring and points-per-game.

BECKETT SENNECKE finished the regular season 14th among OHL leaders in goals (36) and tied 14th in scoring (36-50=86). He led the Generals in points, goals and PPG (11) while ranking third in assists. He recorded a point-per-game average (1.54) with career-highs in scoring, goals and assists.

MAXIM MASSE led Chicoutimi in points-per-game (1.26) and goals (33), while ranking second in scoring (33-26=59).

ALEXANDRE BLAIS finished the regular season sixth among QMJHL leaders in assists (53) and recorded a point-per-game average (1.22). He led Rimouski in scoring (20-53=73) and assists while ranking fifth in goals.

TARIN SMITH finished the season tied seventh among WHL defensemen in scoring (16-44=60) and assists while ranking ninth in power-play goals (6) and 10th with a +35 rating. Smith recorded career-highs in scoring, goals and assists.



ETHAN PROCYSZYN finished the regular season ranked third among OHL leaders in power-play goals (17) and led North Bay in both scoring and goals. He recorded career highs in scoring, goals and assists as the Battalion's captain this season.
