NASHVILLE PREDATORS

All-Time Wild Record: 36-37-12 (22-15-5 at Xcel Energy Center, 14-22-7 at Nashvile)

2022-23: Minnesota went 1-1-1 in the season series against Nashville... The Wild lost, 2-1, at Bridgestone Arena in the series-opening game (11/15), earned a 4-3 victory at Xcel Energy Center in the second meeting (2/19) and fell 4-3 in overtime at Nashville in the finale (4/13)...C **Frederick Gaudreau** led Minnesota with four points (3-1=4)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** had three points (2-1=3)...C **Ryan Hartman** (1-1=2) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (0-2=2) had two points each...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** stopped 23 of 25 shots faced in the first meeting...G **Filip Gustavsson** was 1-0-1 with a 3.42 GAA and a .877 SV% in two starts...C **Tommy Novak** led Nashville with four points (1-3=4)...D **Roman Josi** had three points (1-2=3)...C Matt Duchene (1-1=2), C Ryan Johansen (0-2=2) and RW Nino Niederreiter (2-0=2) all had two points...G **Juuse Saros** went 2-1-0 with a 2.64 GAA and a .913 SV% in three starts.

WILD LEADERS: D **Alex Goligoski** leads Minnesota with 26 points (5-21=26) in 42 games against Nashville...LW **Marcus Johansson** owns 14 points (2-12=14) in 20 games...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 14 points (3-11=14) in 40 contests...Zuccarello owns 12 points (1-11=12) in 20 games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 11-9-2 with a 2.30 GAA, a .916 SV% and three shutouts in 22 career games (21 starts) against the Predators...Gustavsson is 1-0-1 with a 3.42 GAA and a .877 SV% in his two starts.

PREDATORS LEADERS: Josi owns 33 points (14-19=33) in 40 games against the Wild...C **Ryan O'Reilly** has 33 points (16-17=33) in 54 games...LW **Filip Forsberg** owns 29 points (16-13=29) in 30 games...D **Tyson Barrie** has 19 points (4-15=19) in 37 games.

PREDATORS GOALIES: Saros is 6-2-0 with a 1.86 GAA, a .942 SV% and two shutouts in eight career starts against the Wild...G **Kevin Lankinen** is 0-1-1 with a 2.80 GAA and a .926 SV% in three games (two starts) against Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Wild Head Coach John Hynes went 134-96-18 in parts of four seasons (2020-23) as Nashville's Head Coach...Gaudreau tallied eight points (3-5=8) in 84 games with Nashville in three seasons (2016-19)...C Ryan Hartman recorded 26 points (13-13=26) in 85 games in parts of two seasons with the Predators (2017-19)...Predators Head Coach Andrew Brunette recorded 321 points (119-202=321) in 489 games with the Wild (2001-04, 2008-11)...He also spent five seasons in Minnesota's hockey operations department (2014-19) as an Assistant Coach, Hockey Operations Advisor, Assistant General Manager and Director of Player Personnel... Nashville Assistant Coach Todd Richards served as Wild Head Coach for two seasons (2009-11)...D Ryan McDonagh hails from Saint Paul...Novak played four seasons at the University of Minnesota (2015-19) and is from St. Paul...C Gustav Nyquist recorded five points (1-4=5) in three regular season games and five points (0-5=5) in six Stanley Cup Playoff games with Minnesota last season...LW Cole Smith is a native of Brainerd.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 6-3-1 in its last 10 games played at Xcel Energy Center.

Jonas Brodin: Is averaging 24:31 of TOI per game, eighth-highest in the Western Conference...Has blocked 56 shots this season, T-4th in the Western Conference and T-7th in the NHL.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history...Currently at 547 career wins, needs five wins to pass Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Leads Minnesota with 12 goals and six PPGs this season... Is T-4th in the NHL in PPGs this season...Owns an active four-game point streak (3-1=4) and an active three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurance).

Brock Faber: Leads all NHL rookies with 23:13 TOI per game, a plus-6 rating and 34 blocked shots while ranking third among rookie defenseman with eight points (1-7=8).

Kirill Kaprizov: With a goal vs. COL (11/24), reached 120 career goals and surpassed Andrew Brunette (119 goals) for sole possession of fifth-most in franchise history.

Pat Maroon: Currently at 298 career points (119-179=298).

Marco Rossi: T-2nd among NHL rookies in goals (six), T-5th in shots (38) and T-6th in points (6-5=11).

Jared Spurgeon: Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.

Mats Zuccarello: Leads the Wild with 22 points and 17 assists this season... Owns an active seven-game point streak (2-7=9)...Has recorded a point in 10 consecutive home games (5-8=13) to open the season, a franchise record...Currently at 595 career points (191-404=595).

HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES





John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 285-255-63 (.525) in 602 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, most recently served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.





PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov is second on the Wild with 12 assists and four PPGs and T-2nd with 18 points this season (6-12=18).
- Kaprizov scored the 120th goal of his career vs. COL (11/25) to move past Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 43 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd three-point game of his career vs. EDM (10/24, 0-3=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Kaprizov led the Wild with 75 points (40-35=75) last season.
- The left winger led the Wild in both multi-goal games (seven) and three-point games (seven) was tied for first in multi-point games (18).
- Kaprizov recorded his 100th career goal at CAR (1/19/23), becoming the third-fastest active player to reach that mark (180 games), trailing Patrik Laine (179 games) and Alexander Ovechkin (167 games).
- Kaprizov was the first player in Wild history to record his first 200 career points with the franchise in fewer than 200 games.


STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. CBJ (2/26/23) marked his sixth overtime goal since entering the NHL in 2020-21. The total is tied for seventh-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Kaprizov currently stands at 10 career overtime points in a Wild sweater, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.

 Kaprizov is tied for first in franchise history with six OT goals, matching teammate Matt Dumba. Six of his 13 career game-winning goals have come in overtime.



MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- Mats Zuccarello leads the Wild with 22 points (5-17=22) and 17 assists in 20 games played this season.
- According to NHL Stats, only two players have recorded a higher point total through a season's first 20 games: Marian Gaborik (24 in 2005-06 & 23 in 2008-09) and Kirill Kaprizov (24 in 2022-23).
- Owns an active seven-game point streak (2-7=9) and an active 10game home point streak (5-8=13), the longest in Wild franchise history to start a season and the longest home point streak of Zuccarello's career.
- Recorded the 400th assist of his NHL career against OTT in Sweden (11/18), becoming the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest seasonopening point streak in franchise history.
- The 36-year old Norwegian's 22 points this season ranks third in the NHL among players age 33 or older, while his 17 assists lead all players in the same age range.
- Zuccarello posted 22-45=67 during the 2022-23 season, leading the team in assists, ranking second in points and fourth in goals.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (595), third in career goals (191) and third in career games played (786).

SPURGEON GENERAL

- Jared Spurgeon led the Wild with 179 blocked shots, 25.6 shifts per game and a plus-32 rating last season.
- His single-season blocked shot total ranked third in franchise history behind Greg Zanon (212, 2010-11 season; 196, 2009-10 season).
- He finished sixth in the NHL in blocked shots during the 2022-23 season
- His plus-32 rating ranked 12th in the NHL and fourth in the Western Conference. Among defenseman, Spurgeon was sixth in the NHL and second in the Western Conference.
- His plus-110 career rating is first in Wild history.
- Spurgeon has played the second most games in franchise history sits third on the team's all-time assist list.

- The Edmonton native was named the second full-time captain in team history on Jan. 3, 2021.
- He is the franchise leader in goals, points, shots on goal, PPG, GWG and blocked shots by a defenseman and ranks second in assists, PPA, PPP, and hits among defensemen.



CROWN JOEL

- Joel Eriksson Ek leads the Wild with 11 goals and six power-play goals this season and ranks T-4th in the NHL in PPGs.
- Owns an active four-game point streak (3-1=4) and an active three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurance).
- Set a new career high with 23:53 of TOI at OTT (11/18) in Stockholm, Sweden.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded five multi-point games this season, tied for the team lead.
- Currently at 31 career PGGS, two behind Jared Spurgeon (33 career PPGs) for seventh in franchise history.
- Currently at 103 career goals, needs four goals to surpass Pierre-Marc Bouchard (106 goals) for 10th-most in franchise history.

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi is T-2nd among NHL rookies in goals (six), T-5th in shots (38) and T-6th in points (6-5=11).
- Recorded a four-game point streak (1-3=4) from 11/12 12/24/23, a career long.
- He scored the first goal of his NHL career at TOR (10/14), becoming the ninth Austrian-born player to score a goal in a NHL regular-season game.
- Rossi joined Thomas Vanek (39 goals with Minnesota) and Christoph Brandner (four goals with Minnesota) as the only Austrian-born players to score goals for the Wild.

SHOT THROUGH THE HART

- **Ryan Hartman** is second on Minnesota with seven goals this season and is tied for fourth on the team with 11 points (7-4=11).
- Hartman was awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.
- Recorded five points (3-2=5) vs. EDM (10/24), marking his second career hat trick (first with MIN) and tying his career-best in points in a game.




PLAYER NOTES

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- Marcus Foligno is T-9th in the NHL with 58 hits this season. He led Minnesota with 237 hits last season.
- Foligno has recorded five 200-hit seasons in his career, including three with the Wild.
- His 3.6 hits per game played were tied for seventh-most in the NHL last season (min. 50 games played).
- Since entering the league in 2011-12, Foligno ranks eighth among NHL players with 2,240 hits.

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** leads all NHL rookies with 23:13 TOI per game, a plus-6 rating and 34 blocked shots while ranking third among rookie defenseman with eight points (1-7=8).
- Faber scored his first NHL goal and recorded his first NHL point with a first-period goal vs. FLA (10/12).
- Faber made his NHL debut with the Wild at CHI (4/10), leading the team in time on ice (21:49) and blocked shots (six) while recording a plus-one rating and one shot on goal.
- Faber's six blocked shots were tied for most among players making their NHL debut since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06.
- He is one of 33 Minnesota-born players (31 skaters) to wear the Wild sweater in a regular-season game.



IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Currently at 247 career wins, needs four wins to tie (five to surpass)
 Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Currently at 994 career games played, Fleury played in his 972nd career game vs. VGK (2/9) to move past Terry Sawchuk for fourth place in NHL history among goalies. Roy currently ranks third with 1,029 career game appearances.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
