BOSTON BRUINS

All-Time Wild Record: 19-10-5 (9-5-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 10-5-2 at Boston)

2024-25: Minnesota went 1-1-0 against Boston...The Bruins won the series-opening game, 3-0, at TD Garden (2/4), and Minnesota earned a 1-0 win in Saint Paul (3/2)...RW Freddy Gaudreau scored the lone goal for Minnesota, with assists coming from LW Marcus Johansson and RW Mats Zuccarello...G Marc-Andre Fleury stopped 32-of-34 shots faced for the Wild in the first meeting...G Filip Gustavsson stopped all 28 shots faced in the second matchup...C Matthew Poitras led the Bruins with two points (0-2=2)...C Trent Frederic (1-0=1), C Morgan Geekie (1-0=1) and D Charlie McAvoy (1-0=1) all scored for Boston...G Jeremy Swayman went 1-1-0 with a 0.51 GAA, a .983 SV% and one shutout in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: Johansson leads the Wild with 21 points (9-12=21) in 34 career games against Boston...Zuccarello owns 16 points (3-13=16) in 24 games...RW Vladamir Tarasenko has 15 points (6-9=15) in 20 games...LW Marcus Foligno owns 11 points (3-8=11) in 32 games.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 1-1-0 with a 2.03 GAA, .938 SV% and one shutout in two games...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced Boston.

BRUINS LEADERS: C **Elias Lindholm** has 19 points (5-14=19) in 26 games vs. the Wild...RW **David Pastrnak** (8-7=15 in 16 games) and RW **Viktor Arvidsson** (6-9=15 in 27 games) have 15 points each...D **Hampus Lindholm** owns 13 points (3-10=13) in 28 games.

BRUINS GOALIES: Swayman is 1-3-0 with a 1.78 GAA, a .942 SV% and one shutout in four career starts vs. Minnesota...G **Joonas Korpisalo** is 0-3-0 with a 3.65 GAA and a .847 SV% in three starts.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Wild President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** skated in 142 games in two seasons (2000-02) with Boston, collecting 129 points (69-60=129) and 213 PIM...Wild Head Coach **John Hynes** played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship...Wild Associate Coach Jack Capuano played two games with the Bruins in 1991-92...Minnesota Assistant General Manager Michael Murray is from Dover, Mass....Minnesota Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher** is from Belmont, Mass., and played four seasons (1994-98) at Boston University and in one game for the Bruins during the 2001-02 season...Johansson recorded three points (1-2=3) in 10 regular season games and 11 points (4-7=11) in 22 Stanley Cup playoff games with Boston in 2018-19...LW Matt Boldy was born in Milford, Mass., and played two seasons (2019-21) at Boston College...C Marat **Khusnutdinov** was selected by Minnesota in the second round (37th overall) of the 2020 NHL Draft and collected 11 points (3-8=11) in 73 games with the Wild (2023-25)...C Casey Mittelstadt is from Eden Prairie and played one season at the University of Minnesota (2017-18)...LW Alex Steeves was born in St. Paul.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has collected a point in six of its last eight contests against Boston (5-2-1), including sweeping the season series in two of the past four seasons (2021-22, 2023-24)...10 of the 17 all-time games played in Saint Paul have been decided by one goal.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Ranks T-4th in the NHL with 41 points (18-9-5)...Owns an active 11-game home point streak (9-0-2) since Nov. 1, the second-longest streak in the NHL this season and tied for the fourth-longest run in franchise history... Is 15-3-2 (.800) since Nov. 1, ranking T-2nd in the NHL in wins and third in points...Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team GAA (1.81) and team SV% (.938) and ranks T-4th with a plus-22 goal differential...Has killed 45-of-52 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks fifth the NHL with a 86.5 PK% in that span...Has scored first in 20 games this season, T-3rd in the NHL...Leads the NHL with six shutouts.

Matt Boldy: Owns six points (2-4=6) in his last four games...Posted three points (1-2=3) vs. DAL (12/11) and reached 119 career goals, tying Andrew Brunette for seventh on the Wild's all-time goal list...Since Nov. 6, owns 12 goals (T-7th in the NHL) and 22 points (12-10=22) in 18 games...For the season, leads Wild in points (17-18=35) and assists and ranks second in goals...Ranks T-9th in the NHL in shots (106), T-11th in goals and T-12th in PPP (5-8=13).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Scored the GWG with 22 seconds remaining vs. OTT (12/13)...Owns active three-game goal and point streaks (3-3=6), one game shy of tying his career-long goal streak...Currently at 321 career points (143-178=321), tied with Andrew Brunnettte for ninth in franchise history...Leads the NHL in total faceoffs taken (686) and ranks third in faceoffs won (348). **Filip Gustavsson:** Is 5-1-1 in his last seven starts since 11/16, posting a 1.82

GAA, .930 SV% and one shutout...Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history...T-3rd in the NHL with two shutouts this season.

Brock Faber: Since 10/26, ranks T-6th among NHL defensemen in goals. **Marcus Johansson:** Owns an active three-game point streak (3-2=5)...Ranks T-4th in the NHL with four GWG this season...Leads the team with a plus-15

rating and ranks third in points (11-14=25) and goals.

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranks T-7th in the NHL with 18 goals and seven PPG...Leads the Wild in goals and ranks second in points (18-16=34)...Owns 69 career PPG, tied with Zach Parise for the franchise record...Currently at 420 career points (203-217=420), three shy of tying Jared Spurgeon (118-305=423) for third in franchise history...Currently at 203 career goals, two shy of tying Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history...Ranks third in franchise history with 143 power-play points (69-74=143), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).

Jared Spurgeon: Owns an active three-game assist streak (0-3=3).

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 154 hits.

Jesper Wallstedt: Is 9-1-2 (.833) on the season and leads the NHL with a 1.95 GAA, .937 SV% and four shutouts...Owns shutouts in four out of his last eight games...Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38)...Went 7-0-0 in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games...Became the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21)...Set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2) from 10/13 - 12/2, besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09)... Wallstedt's 10-game point streak from 10/13 - 12/2 is tied for the fourthlongest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the fourthlongest goalie point streak in Wild history...Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old)...Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Newly acquired Wild defenseman **Quinn Hughes** was selected to the United State's preliminary roster. The native of Orlando, Fla., has represented the United States in numerous international tournaments, including the 2019 and 2018 IIHF Men's World Championship and the 2019 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK

- The Wild is 4-3-0 this season when playing in the first game of a back-to-back, and 2-1-3 when playing in the second game of a back-to-back.
- Today's game vs. Boston wraps up the 28th time in team history the Wild has played back-to-back home games. When playing back-toback home games, the Wild holds a 19-7-2 all-time record in the first contest and a 16-4-7 all-time record in the second contest.
- The Wild holds an 134-146-54 (.482) all-time record when playing the second game of back-to-backs. Since the 2006-07 season, Minnesota is 120-100-41 (.538) in the second game of back-to-backs.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- Leads NHL with six shutouts this season.
- Leads the NHL with 1.85 goals against/game and 37 goals allowed since November 1.

- Has killed 45-of-52 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks fifth the NHL with a 86.5 PK% in that span
- Did not allowed a PPG in nine consecutive games (23-for-23) since 11/19, tied for the longest overall streak in the NHL this season (also UTA, 10/28 - 11/17). The nine-game streak without allowing a PPG was tied for the fourth-longest run in franchise history.
- The full streak ended after 24 consecutive kills (11/19 12/8) when Seattle scored a second-period PPG.
- Minnesota hasn't allowed a PPG in 15 out of 20 games played since Nov. 1.
- Is allowing 2.41 opponent power-play opportunties per game this season, first in the NHL.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 20 games this season, T-3rd in the NHL.
- Owns a 14-3-3 record (.775) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 670-179-109 all-time record (.756) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

HEATING UP

- Owns an active 11-game home point streak (9-0-2) since Nov. 1, the second-longest streak in the NHL this season and tied for the fourthlongest run in franchise history.
- Is 15-3-2 (.800) since Nov. 1, ranking T-2nd in the NHL in wins and third in points.
- Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team GAA (1.81) and team SV% (.938) and ranks T-4th with a plus-22 goal differential.
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 3/15/23.
- Posted a seven-game win streak from 11/15 11/28/25, tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history and the team's longest since an eight-game run from 11/24 12/9/21.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

SETTLING IN FOR THE SECOND

- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 23 second-period goals allowed this season and is T-6th with a plus-seven goal differential in the middle frame.
- Minnesota's .932 team save percentage in the second period ranks
 T-1st in the NHL this season.
- The Wild has held opponents scoreless in 16 of 32 second periods this season.

IN EXTRA TIME

- Ranks T-5th in NHL with six extra-time victories (three OTW, three SOW).
- Since losing three out of four extra-time games to start the season, has won five out of seven extra-time games.
- T-4th in NHL with three SOW this season.



KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks T-7th in the NHL with 18 goals and seven PPG.
- Leads the Wild in goals and ranks second in points (18-16=34).
- Owns 69 career PPG, tied with Zach Parise for the franchise record.
- Currently at 420 career points (203-217=420), three shy of tying Jared Spurgeon (118-305=423) for third in franchise history.
- Currently at 203 career goals, two shy of tying Mikkó Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possesion of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.

- Kaprizov recorded a seven-game point streak (7-2=9) from 11/16 11/29.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

- **Quinn Hughes** leads all NHL skaters with a 27:25 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (22:23) and power play TOI/G (4:49) this season.
- Notched his 20th assist of the season in his 19th game of the season at ANA (11/26), joining Bobby Orr (6x), Paul Coffey (5x), Cale Makar (3x), Phil Housley (3x), and Denis Potvin (3x) as the only defencemen in NHL history to record 20 or more assists in their first 20 games of a season.

- Jesper Wallstedt is 9-1-2 (.833) on the season and leads the NHL with a 1.95 GAA, .937 SV% and four shutouts.
- Owns shutouts in four out of his last eight games.
- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
