#### ANAHEIM DUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 44-32-7 (22-13-6 at Xcel Energy Center, 22-19-1 at Anaheim)

**2023-24:** Minnesota is 1-1-0 against the Ducks this season...Anaheim won the series-opening game, 3-2, at Xcel Energy Center (1/27)...The Wild earned a 2-0 victory in St. Paul in the second game (3/14)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** (0-2=2), LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (2-0=2) and D **Jonas Brodin** (0-2=2) lead Minnesota with two points each...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 22-of-25 shots faced for the Wild in the first game...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** saved all 16 shots faced to earn the shutout victory in the second meeting...C Adam Henrique (0-2=2) and RW **Troy Terry** (2-0=2) lead the Ducks with two points each...C **Ryan Strome** (1-0=1) has also scored...G **Lukas Dostal** is 1-1-0 with a 2.04 GAA and a .941 SV% in two starts against the Wild this season.

**WILD LEADERS:** Zuccarello leads Minnesota with 27 points (8-19=27) in 31 games vs. Anaheim...D **Alex Goligoski** has 24 points (6-18=24) in 55 games...Kaprizov owns 16 points (6-10=16) in 16 games...C **Ryan Hartman** has 15 points (8-7=15) in 25 games.

**WILD GOALIES:** Fleury is 23-5-0 with a 1.82 GAA, a .932 SV% and four shutouts in 28 career starts against Anaheim...Gustavsson is 2-1-0 with a 2.62 GAA and .911 SV% in three starts against the Ducks.

**DUCKS LEADERS:** D **Cam Fowler** (8-7=15 in 45 games) and RW **Jakob Silfverberg** (8-7=15 in 31 games) each own 15 points vs. Minnesota...C **Ryan Strome** has 11 points (2-9=11) in 23 games...RW **Frank Vatrano** has 10 points (3-7=10) in 12 games.

**DUCKS GOALIES:** G **John Gibson** is 7-6-4 with a 2.51 GAA, a .925 SV% and three shutouts in 18 starts against the Wild...Dostal is 1-2-0 in four appearances (three starts) with a 2.46 GAA and a .934 SV%.

**CONNECTIONS:** Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** skated in four games with Anaheim in 2007-08...Ducks D **Jackson LaCombe** is from Eden Prairie and played four seasons (2019-23) at the University of Minnesota...F **Ben Meyers** is from Delano and played three seasons (2019-22) at the University of Minnesota.

**FAST FACTS:** Minnesota won 13 consecutive games, the longest winning streak against an opponent in team history, from 1/20/21 to 12/21/22...The Wild is 14-2-0 in the last 16 games against Anaheim...The Wild is 11-2-0 in its last 13 games at Honda Center, outscoring Anaheim, 41-21...Minnesota was swept by Anaheim in the 2003 Western Conference Final and lost 4-1 in the 2007 First Round.

#### **NOTES & MILESTONES**

**Team:** Is 5-0-2 in its last seven games played, the team's longest point streak of the seasoan...Since March 3, T-1st in the NHL in points (12) and ranks T-4th in goals allowed per game (1.86).

Jonas Brodin: With an assist vs. ANA (3/14), reached 236 career points (54-182=236) and tied Matt Dumba (79-157=236) for the third-highest career point total among Wild defensemen...Scored the 54th goal of his career vs. NSH (3/10), moving within one goal of Matt Dumba and Brent Burns (55 goals each with MIN) for third-most goals by a Wild defenseman.

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Recorded a four-game point streak (1-5=6) from 3/3 to 3/10...T-1st on the Wild with 12 PPGs and ranks second with 60 points (29-31=60) and a career-high 29 goals this season...Ranks T-10th in the NHL in PPGs and 14th with 232 shots on goal...Has 35 points (14-21=35) in his last 29 games played.

**Brock Faber:** Leads all NHL rookies with 25:09 TOI per game, 133 blocked shots and 32 assists, and is second with 38 points (6-32=38)... Seventh among all NHL skaters in TOI/game... With an assist vs. ARI (3/12), moved within one point of Matt Boldy (15-24=39 in 2021-22) for the second-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending March 17 after going 2-0-1 with a 0.97 GAA, .961 SV% and one shutout in three games...Is 9-2-1 with a 1.92 GAA, .928 SV% and one shutout in 14 games played (12 starts) since Jan. 13. Ranks second in the NHL in GAA and T-2nd in SV% during that span (min. 10 GP)...Posted the 75th shutout of his NHL career vs. ANA (3/14) and needs one more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.

**Ryan Hartman:** Holds a plus-11 rating since Feb. 23, the T-6th in the NHL during that span...Posted a three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 3/10 to 3/14...Recorded a season-high six shots on goal vs. ARI (3/12).

**Kirill Kaprizov:** Leads Minnesota with 76 points (35-41=76) and 35 goals this season...Ranks T-9th in the NHL with seven GWG and T-10th with 12 PPGs... Leads the NHL with 22 goals since Jan. 19 and is third with 40 points (22-18=40)...Owns an active seven-game point streak (9-4=13), the second-longest active streak in the NHL...Tied his season high with eight shots on goal vs. ANA (3/14)...Has 52 points (27-25=52) and a plus-17 rating in his last 34 games played.

**Marat Khusnutdinov:** Made his NHL debut vs. ANA (3/14), winning six-of-nine faceoffs taken and blocking four shots...Became the eighth Russian-born player to appear in a regular-season game for the Wild.

**Marco Rossi**: Among NHL rookies is T-1st in GWG (two), second in goals (18) and shots on goal (139) and third in points (18-17=35).

Mats Zuccarello: Leads the Wild with 44 assists this season.

#### **HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES**



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 312-272-67 (.531) in 651 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, is in his first season with Minnesota, where he holds a 28-17-4 (.612) record in 49 games. Prior to joining the Wild, he served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.

#### KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov leads Minnesota with 76 points (35-41=76) and 35 goals this season.
- Ranks T-9th in the NHL this season with seven GWG and T-10th with 12 PPGs.
- Leads the NHL with 22 goals since Jan. 19 and is third with 40 points (22-18=40).
- Owns an active seven-game point streak (9-4=13). Has 52 points (27-25=52) and a plus-17 rating in his last 34 games played.
- Tied his season high with eight shots on goal vs. ANA (3/14).
- With two goals and an assist vs. ARI (3/12), recorded his 25th career multi-goal game, tying Zach Parise for second-most in franchise history. Also posted the 29th three-point game of his career vs. ARI (3/12), tying Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.
- Posted his 30th goal of the season at ARI (3/7), joining Marian Gaborik (2005-06 to 2007-08) and Brian Rolston (2005-06 to 2007-08) as the only Wild players with three consecutive 30-goal seasons.
- Recorded his third hat trick (3-0=3) of the season vs. SJS (3/3), tying Marian Gaborik (three hat tricks, 2002-03) and Zach Parise (three hat tricks, 2015-16) for the single-season franchise record. Ranks T-5th in the NHL with five hat tricks since entering the league in 2020-21.
- Reached 300 career points (143-157=300) vs. SJS (3/3) in his 258th career game, becoming the fastest player in franchise history and the fifth fastest active NHL player to reach the milestone (Crosby, 219; Ovechkin, 237; McDavid, 240; Malkin, 240).
- Kaprizov recorded the 28th three-point game of his career vs. SJS (3/3, 3-0=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 2/26
  after posting six goals and 12 points in four contests (6-6—12),
  marking his third First Star honor of the season. Became the first player
  in franchise history to earn NHL First Star of the Week honors three
  times in a single season (also 12/24/23 and 1/21/24).
- Kaprizov has now been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his
  career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He
  is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).
- With three points (2-1=3) at SEA (2/24), recorded his 80th career multi-point game to move past Zach Parise (79 MPG with MIN) for sole possession of third-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.
- With a 3-1=4 line in the third period vs. VAN (2/19), Kaprizov also tied the franchise records for single-period goals and single-period points.
- Became the first player in franchise history to reach 50 points in four consecutive seasons with an assist at ARI (2/14).
- With a goal vs. PIT (2/9), Kaprizov reached 20 for the season and became the first player in franchise to record four consecutive 20-goal seasons with the club.
- Kaprizov received his third NHL All-Star honor on 1/4/24, becoming the second player in franchise history to be selected to three All-Star games and first to do so in three consecutive seasons.
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending Jan.
   21 after ranking T-1st in the NHL in scoring (4-4=8) and goals in four games.
- Notched his third career regular-season hat trick (3-0=3) at CAR (1/21).
- Currently with 51 career PPGs, Kaprizov is the fifth player in franchise history to reach 50 PPGs in a Wild sweater, joining Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koiyu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).

### HE'S GOING STREAKING

Currently owning an active seven-game point streak (9-4=13), Kaprizov recorded an eight-game point streak (7-11=18) from 2/9 to 2/24, tied for the second-longest of his career.

#### **CROWN JOEL**

- Joel Eriksson Ek ranks T-1st on the Wild with 12 PPGs and ranks second with 60 points (29-31=60) and a career-high 29 goals this season.
- Ranks T-10th in the NHL in PPGs and 14th with 232 shots on goal.
- Has 35 points (14-21=35) in his last 29 games played.
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9 to 2/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12 to 2/19.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the singlegame franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunnette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.
- Recorded a six-game point streak (6-5=11) from 1/15 to 1/25.
- Posted a career-best plus-4 rating at CAR (1/21).
- Recorded a career-high 25:30 in TOI at CBJ (1/6).
- Eriksson Ek tied his career high with eight shots on goal at WPG (12/30) and vs. VAN (12/16).
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded 14 multi-point games this season, second on the team.

#### **NEW GUY IN TOWN**

- Marat Khusnutdinov made his NHL debut vs. ANA (3/14), skating 11:54
  of ice time.
- The native of Moscow, Russia, won six-of-nine faceoffs taken (66.6 pct.), marking the highest faceoff percentage by a Wild player making his NHL debut (min eight faceoffs taken).
- Khusnutdinov also registered four blocked shots, becoming one of only three Wild players to post four-plus blocks in his NHL debut, and the only forward.
- Khusnutdinov recorded 20 points (6-14=20) and 10 penalty minutes (PIM) in 49 games with HK Sochi of the Kontinental Hockey League (KHL) during the 2023-24 season, ranking fifth on the club in assists, seventh in points and serving as the team's captain. Khusnutdinov began the season with SKA St. Petersburg of the KHL, skating in six games, before being traded to HK Sochi on Oct. 10.
- He totaled 41 points (11-30=41) and 18 PIM in 63 games for SKA St. Petersburg during the 2022-23 KHL season, ranking second on the team in assists, sixth in goals and T-7th in points. He tied Artemi Panarin for the seventh-highest single-season point total in KHL history by a player 20 years or younger and became the youngest player in SKA St. Petersburg history to reach 50 career points (20 years, six months and 13 days), doing so in his 116th career game.

#### **BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL**

- **Matt Boldy** is T-15th in the NHL with 23 goals scored since Nov. 28 and has 20 points (8-12=20) in his last 18 games.
