VANCOUVER CANUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 48-38-15 (27-18-6 at Xcel Energy Center, 21-20-9 at Vancouver)

2023-24: Vancouver won the series-opening contest, 2-0, at Rogers Arena (12/7)...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 15-of-17 shots faced for Minnesota...C **Teddy Bleuger** (1-0=1) and LW **Nils Hoglander** (1-0=1) scored goals for the Canucks...G **Casey DeSmith** stopped all 26 shots faced to earn the shutout victory for Vancouver.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Mats Zuccarello** leads the Wild with 23 points (8-15=23) in 21 contests vs. the Canucks...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 19 points (4-15=19) in 41 games...D **Alex Goligoski** owns 13 points (3-10=13) in 39 matches...C **Ryan Hartman** (8-4=12 in 17 games) and LW **Marcus Johansson** (6-6=12 in 19 games) have each logged 12 points.

WILD GOALIES: G **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 15-3-2 with a 2.49 GAA, a .915 SV% and two shutouts in 20 career starts vs. the Canucks...Gustavsson is 2-2-1 with a 2.52 GAA, a .917 SV % and one shutout in five games (four starts).

CANUCKS LEADERS: C **J.T. Miller** leads Vancouver with 14 points (7-7=14) in 20 games against the Wild...RW **Brock Boesser** (2-6=8 in 14 games), D **Tyler Myers** (1-7=8 in 32 games) and C **Elias Pettersson** (5-3=8 in 12 games) each own eight points vs. Minnesota.

CANUCKS GOALIES: G **Thatcher Demko** is 0-3-2 with a 3.40 GAA and a .900 SV% in five career starts against Minnesota...DeSmith is 5-0-0 with a 1.78 GAA and a .943 SV% with one shutout in five starts.

CONNECTIONS: Wild Assistant Coach **Darby Hendrickson** skated in 27 games with the Canucks (1998-99)...Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** was selected by Vancouver in the seventh round (212th overall) of the 2001 NHL Draft and recorded 23 points (12-11=23) in 55 games in parts of two seasons with the Canucks (2002-04)...King also served as an Assistant Coach for Vancouver for three seasons (2020-23) and five seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Canucks AHL affiliate in Utica(2016-20)...Canucks Assistant Coach **Mike Yeo** served as Wild Head Coach for parts of five seasons (2011-16)...Boesser is from Burnsville...D **Ian Cole** recorded eight points (1-7=8) in 52 games with Minnesota in 2020-21...D **Carson Soucy** posted 31 points (8-23=31) in 108 games with the wild from 2017-21.

FAST FACTS: The Wild won eight consecutive meetings against Vancouver, outscoring the Canucks 28-16, before the 2-0 loss on 12/7/23...Minnesota is 16-8-1 in its last 25 games against the Canucks, beginning in the 2014-15 season...The Wild is 9-4-0 in 13 games played in Vancouver since 2014-15...The Wild is 7-4-1 in the last 12 games played in Saint Paul since 2014-15...Minnesota's 111 points vs. the Canucks are its third-most against a team.

Matt Boldy: T-2nd in the NHL with seven goals scored since Nov. 28 and T-6th with a plus-7 rating during that span...Owns an active three-game goal streak (3-1=4), tied for his career long.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Currently at 548 career wins, needs four wins to pass Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Leads Minnesota with 14 goals and six PPGs this season...T-3rd in the Central Division in goals scored...Is T-9th in the NHL in PPGs this season...Currently has 106 career goals, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard for 10th-most in franchise history.

Pat Maroon: Currently at 299 career points (120-179=299).

Marco Rossi: Among NHL rookies is second in goals (10) and points (10-7=17), is T-4th with a plus-6 rating and ranks fifth in shots on goal (54).

Jared Spurgeon: T-3rd in the NHL with a plus-9 rating since Nov. 28...Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.

Mats Zuccarello: Leads the Wild with 28 points and 22 assists this season...Recorded a point in 11 consecutive home games (6-10=16) to open the season, a franchise record...Reached 600 career points (192-408=600) with an assist at CGY (12/5).

TEAM NOTES



HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 290-257-63 (.527) in 610 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, most recently served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.

ON A ROLL AGAIN

- Minnesota is 5-2-0 since Nov. 28 and ranks T-4th in the NHL in wins and T-6th in points (10) during that span.
- Since Nov. 28, the Wild leads the NHL with a 1.57 GAA and a .942 team save percentage.
- Minnesota is T-1st the NHL with a plus-7 first-period goal differential since Nov. 28.
- Since Nov. 28, Minnesota ranks T-9th in the NHL with 17.0 blocked shots per game.

STARTING HOT

- Since Nov. 28, Minnesota is 6-0-0 when scoring a game's first goal
- Since Nov. 28 the Wild has a plus-8 first period goal differential, the best mark in the NHL, and is scoring 1.38 first-period goals per game, T-2nd in the NHL.
- Since Nov. 28 the Wild has allowed 0.38 first-period goals per game, the second-best mark in the NHL.





PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks second on the team with 24 points (8-16=24), 16 assists and five PPGs this season while ranking third with eight goals.
- With a goal and assist at CGY (12/5), recorded his 69th career multi-point game, tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov scored the 120th goal of his career vs. COL (11/25) to move past Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 44 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd three-point game of his career vs. EDM (10/24, 0-3=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Kaprizov recorded his 100th career goal at CAR (1/19/23), becoming the third-fastest active player to reach that mark (180 games), trailing Patrik Laine (179 games) and Alexander Ovechkin (167 games).
- Kaprizov was the first player in Wild history to record his first 200 career points with the franchise in fewer than 200 games.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. CBJ (2/26/23) marked his sixth overtime goal since entering the NHL in 2020-21. The total is tied for seventh-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Kaprizov currently stands at 10 career overtime points in a Wild sweater, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.

- Kaprizov is tied for first in franchise history with six OT goals, matching teammate Matt Dumba. Six of his 13 career game-winning goals have come in overtime.



MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** leads the Wild with 28 points (6-22=28) and 22 assists this season. He ranks T-5th in the NHL with 12 power-play assists.
- Recorded a 10-game point streak (3-11=14) from 11/10 to 12/5, tied for the longest of his career (two other occurrences).
- He is the first player in Wild history to record three separate double-digit point streaks with the franchise.
- Notched an eight-game assist streak from 11/18 to 12/5, the longest of his career and one shy of the franchise record (Kaprizov, nine games in 2022-23).
- Recorded an 11-game home point streak (6-10=16), the longest in Wild franchise history to start a season and the longest home point streak of Zuccarello's career.
- Reached 600 career points (192-408=600) with an assist at CGY (12/5), the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Recorded the 400th assist of his NHL career against OTT in Sweden (11/18), becoming the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest season-opening point streak in franchise history.
- The 36-year old Norwegian's 28 points ranks T-3rd this season among NHL players age 33 or older, while his 22 assists lead the same group.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (601) and third in career goals (192), career assists (409) and career games played (792).

SPURGEON GENERAL'S WARNING

- **Jared Spurgeon** holds a plus-9 rating since Nov. 28 (seven games played), T-3rd in the NHL during that span.
- Spurgeon recorded a four-game assist streak (0-4=4) from 11/28 to 12/5.
- Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon led the Wild with 179 blocked shots, 25.6 shifts per game and a plus-32 rating last season.
- His single-season blocked shot total ranked third in franchise history behind Greg Zanon (212, 2010-11 season; 196, 2009-10 season).
- He finished sixth in the NHL in blocked shots during the 2022-23 season.
- His plus-32 rating ranked 12th in the NHL and fourth in the Western Conference. Among defenseman, Spurgeon was sixth in the NHL and second in the Western Conference.
- His plus-118 career rating is first in Wild history.
- Spurgeon has played the second most games in franchise history sits third on the team's all-time assist list.

- The Edmonton native was named the second full-time captain in team history on Jan. 3, 2021.
- He is the franchise leader in goals, points, shots on goal, PPG, GWG and blocked shots by a defenseman and ranks second in assists, PPA, PPP, and hits among defensemen.



MARCO POLO

- Among NHL rookies, **Marco Rossi** ranks second in goals (10) and points (10-7=17), is T-4th with a plus-6 rating and ranks fifth in shots on goal (54).
- Rossi became the third-fastest Wild rookie to record ten goals in a season by scoring vs. CGY (12/14), his 27th game played in 2023-24. The only others to require fewer than 30 games to reach the mark are Kirill Kaprizov (25 GP in 2020-21) and Matt Boldy (25 GP in 2021-22).
- Recorded the first multi-goal game of his career vs. CHI (12/3), scoring two.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (1-3=4) from 11/12 - 12/24/23, a career long.

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** leads the Wild with 14 goals and six power-play goals this season and ranks T-9th in the NHL in PPGs.
- Currently with 106 career goals, needs one goal to move past Pierre-Marc Bouchard into sole possession of 10th on the all-time franchise list.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-1=4) from 11/19 to 11/28 and a three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurrence), from 11/24 to 11/28.
- Set a new career high with 23:53 of TOI at OTT (11/18) in Stockholm, Sweden.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded five multi-point games this season, third on the team.
- Currently at 31 career PPGs, two behind Jared Spurgeon (33 career PPGs) for seventh in franchise history.

ALL ABOARD THE GUS BUS

- **Filip Gustavsson** is 5-1-0 with one shutout, a 1.33 GAA (1st in NHL, min. five GP) and a .950 SV% (1st in NHL, min. five GP) since November 28 (six starts).
- Gustavsson owns five shutouts since the start of the 2022-23 season. Per NHL Stats, only four goaltenders have more over that span: Ilya Sorokin (8), Alexandar Georgiev (6), Jeremy Swayman (6) and Jake Oettinger (6).
- Gustavsson ranks third in the NHL in SV% (.923) and fourth in GAA (2.36) since the start of the 2022-23 season (min. 30 GP).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** leads all NHL rookies with 23:42 TOI per game and 47 blocked shots, is T-2nd with a plus-7 rating and is fifth with 11 assists.
- Logged a career-high 30:08 of TOI against CGY (12/14), the fifth-highest total by a rookie in franchise history.
- Faber scored his first NHL goal and recorded his first NHL point with a first-period goal vs. FLA (10/12).
- Faber made his NHL debut with the Wild at CHI (4/10), leading the team in time on ice (21:49) and blocked shots (six) while recording a plus-one rating and one shot on goal.
- Faber's six blocked shots were tied for most among players making their NHL debut since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06.
- He is one of 33 Minnesota-born players (31 skaters) to wear the Wild sweater in a regular-season game.

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- **Marcus Foligno** is T-8th in the NHL with 77 hits this season. He led Minnesota with 237 hits last season.
- Foligno has recorded five 200-hit seasons in his career, including three with the Wild.
- His 3.6 hits per game played were tied for seventh-most in the NHL last season (min. 50 games played).
- Since entering the league in 2011-12, Foligno ranks eighth among NHL players with 2,259 hits.



IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Currently at 248 career wins, needs three wins to tie (four to surpass) Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Currently at 996 career games played, Fleury played in his 972nd career game vs. VGK (2/9) to move past Terry Sawchuk for fourth place in NHL history among goalies. Roy currently ranks third with 1,029 career game appearances.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
