

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 17, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. TORONTO MAPLE LEAFS [6]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a four-game road swing on Monday night in Toronto. In the first, Toronto would open the scoring 1:47 into the contest with Max Domi giving the home side a 1-0 advantage. Calgary would find an equalizer with under a minute left in the opening frame after Jonathan Huberdeau spotted a streaking Rasmus Andersson who ripped home his ninth of the season to even things through 20. In the second, Toronto would score four to lead 5-1 through 40. The Leafs again added to their lead in the third and ultimately knocked off the Flames 6-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Rangers. Calgary knocked off New York 3-2 in their first matchup on November 21st.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-4-1 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 12-11-6 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING WITH NEW YORK:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the New York Rangers to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their first meeting on November 21st. It would take just 7:26 for the game's opening-goal, and it would be Matt Coronato who ripped home his then sixth on the campaign to give the Flames an early lead, and they would keep that 1-0 advantage heading into the break. In the second, Yegor Sharangovich would double the home side's advantage with a one-timer he blasted over the shoulder of Igor Shesterkin. New York would score a pair before the end of the frame to leave this game knotted at twos through 40. In the final stanza, Connor Zary would help the Flames reclaim the lead while Dustin Wolf made 10 third period saves to help the Flames knock off the Rangers 3-2.

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Flames are set to finish off their ninth back-to-back set tonight in Toronto following last night's setback in Toronto. Calgary has a record of 5-4-0 in game one of back-to-back scenarios, and a record of 2-5-1 in game two of back-to-back scenarios. The Flames next back-to-back set will come on March 31st when they travel to Colorado before heading to Utah the following night on April 1st to face the Hockey Club.

WEEGSY BABY:

Mackenzie Weegar enters play tonight with seven points (1G, 6A) over his last seven games. Weegar has registered 91 assists in Flames threads since he joined the club to lead all Calgary blueliners since the 2022-23 season, with is 91 helpers ranking as the third-most among all Flames skaters over that span behind only Jonathan Huberdeau (105) and Nazem Kadri (103).

FARABEE 400:

Joel Farabee skated in his 400th NHL game last night against Toronto. The 24-year-old left winger was a first-round pick (14th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2018 NHL Draft. He would make his NHL debut during the 2019-20 season and has gone on to score 93 goals along with 112 assists for 205 points in his 400 NHL outings. In his career against the Rangers, Farabee has seven points (3G, 4A) in 22 meetings with New York.

SHARK ATTACK:

Flames forward Yegor Sharangovich appeared in his 300th NHL game in Calgary and New York's first matchup on November 21st. Sharangovich (1-1—2) would score a goal and register an assist to record his-then 36th multi-point effort of his career. The Minsk, BLR native also became just the sixth skater of Belarussian decent to play in 300 or more NHL games, along with; Ruslan Salei (917), Mikhail Grabovski (534), Andrei Kostitsyn (398), Sergei Kostitsyn (353), and Vladimir Tsyplakov (331).

HE'S NAZTY:



Entering play tonight, Nazem Kadri has 48 points from 23 goals and 25 assists. With two more points, Kadri can become the third Flames skater in the past 30 years to record 50 points in his first three seasons with the franchise, following Alex Tanguay (3 from 2006-07 – 2010-11) and Daymond Langkow (3 from 2005-06 – 2007-08).

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Flames blueliners Daniil Miromanov and Brayden Pachal along with Rangers netminder Jonathan Quick were all teammates on the 2022-23 Vegas Golden Knights.

When these clubs met last season, Blake Coleman recorded his 200th NHL point. The Plano, Texas native became the fourth Texas-born NHLer to eclipse 200 NHL points, joining Tyler Myers, Seth Jones, and longtime New York Ranger's blueliner Brian Leetch.
