All-Time Wild Record: 7-3-1 (2-2-1 at Xcel Energy Center, 5-1-0 at Seattle)

2024-25: Seattle won the series-opening contest, 5-4, in shootout at Xcel Energy Center (10/12) before Minnesota won the second meeting, 4-3, at Climate Pledge Arena (3/4)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** leads the Wild with four points (2-2=4), including the game-winning goal in the second meeting...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-2=3), LW **Matt Boldy** (1-2=3) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (1-2=3) each own three points in the series...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** stopped 30-of-34 shots faced for the Wild in the first game...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 33-of-36 shots faced to earn the win in the second meeting...RW **Jordan Eberle** leads Seattle with three points (2-1=3) in the season series...LW **Andre Burakovsky** (0-2=2), RW **Kaapo Kakko** (0-2=2), LW **Jared McCann** (1-1=2) and D **Brandon Montour** (1-1=2) each own two points...G **Joey Daccord** owns a 1-1-0 record with a 3.92 GAA and a 862 SV% in starting both games for the Kraken.

WILD LEADERS: Kaprizov leads Minnesota with 14 points (5-9=14) in nine career games against Seattle...Zuccarello has 13 points (5-8=13) in 10 games...C **Ryan Hartman** (4-7=11 in nine games) and Boldy (6-5=11 in nine games) own 11 points each.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 5-2-2 with a 2.30 GAA, a .924 SV% and one shutout in nine career starts vs. the Kraken...Gustavsson is 2-0-0 with a 1.50 GAA, .950 SV% and one shutout in two career starts.

KRAKEN LEADERS: C **Jaden Schwartz** leads the Kraken with 29 points (14-15=29) in 45 career contests vs. Minnesota...Eberle has 27 points (10-17=27) in 42 games...LW **Chandler Stephenson** owns 19 points (4-15=19) in 22 games...Burakovsky owns 18 points (4-14=18) in 29 contests.

KRAKEN GOALIES: Daccord is 2-3-0 with a 3.89 GAA and a .858 SV% in five career starts against the Wild...G **Philipp Grubauer** is 9-7-0 with a 2.95 GAA, a .894 SV% and one shutout in 17 career games (16 starts) against the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: LW **Marcus Johansson** recorded 23 points (6-17=23) in 51 games with Seattle in 2021-22...C **Devin Shore** notched four points (1-2=3) in 21 games with Seattle in 2023-24...Seattle Assistant Coach **Bob Woods** served as an Assistant Coach for the Wild for parts of seven seasons (2017-24)...Kraken television analyst **J.T. Brown** recorded eight points (3-5=8) in 56 games with Minnesota in 2018-19.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Second in the NHL with 47 road points (22-10-3), 22 road wins and a .671 road point percentage...Fifth in the NHL with a .904 team save percentage this season...Sixth in the NHL with 34 goals scored by defensemen this season...Has scored first in 39 games this season, tied for in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Currently T-3rd in the NHL with eight GWG this season, tied for the most GWG in a single season in franchise history...Currently tied for seventh in franchise history with 22 career GWG, needs one to tie Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fifth in franchise history...Ranks sixth in the NHL with 231 shots this season...Leads the Wild with 56 points (21-35=56) and 35 assists and is T-2nd with 21 goals.

Brock Faber: Fourth in the NHL with 25:18 of TOI/G this season...Owns a 25:03 TOI/G average in 148 career games, the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since the league started tracking TOI in 2000-01...Second among Wild defensemen and T-7th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made the 1,015th start of his career vs. PIT (3/9), moving past Roberto Luongo (1,014 GS) for second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Made the 1,045th game appearance of his career at DET (2/22) to move past Roberto Luongo for sole possession of second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Recorded the 69th overtime victory of his NHL career at DET (2/22) to tie Martin Brodeur for most in league history.

Marcus Foligno: Eighth in the NHL with 219 hits this season.

Filip Gustavsson: Is 3-1-1 in his last five home games with a 1.76 GAA, a .937 SV% and one shutout...Owns a 26-16-4 record for the season and ranks T-4th in the NHL with four shutouts, sixth in wins and T-6th in save percentage (.915).

Ryan Hartman: Notched two points (1-1=2) vs. LAK (3/17) to reach 300 career points (137-163=300)...Also recorded 13 faceoff wins vs. LAK (3/17), his second-highest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career.

Vinnie Hinostroza: Played the 400th game of his NHL career vs. STL (3/15)...Currently at 99 career NHL assists.

Jake Middleton: Scored his eighth goal of the season vs. STL (3/15) to establish a new single-season career high...Leads Wild defenseman in goals scored this season.

Marco Rossi: Ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (32) and points (21-32=53), and T-2nd in goals (21).

Jared Spurgeon: Recorded the 145th and 146th primary assists of his career vs. LAK (3/17) to overtake Mikael Granlund (145) for the second-most in franchise history (Koivu, 269)...Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history...Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 28 points (7-21=28).

Mats Zuccarello: Scored his 100th goal in a Wild sweater vs. LAK (3/17), becoming the 12th player in franchise history to reach the century mark...Ranks second on the team with five GWG...Scored a second-period goal vs. COL (3/11) to reach 322 points with the Wild (99-223=322), passing Andrew Brunette (119-202=321) for eighth in franchise history...Also recorded his 14th shootout goal with Minnesota vs. COL (3/11), one shy of tying Zach Parise for second-most in team history...He owns 39 career shootout goals, fourth among active NHL skaters...Has 14 career game-deciding shootout goals, including four with the Wild...Currently at 223 assists with the Wild, one short of tying Mikael Granlund (224) for fifth in franchise history.

TEAM NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 25-0-0 when leading through two periods, one of two NHL teams (Seattle, 15-0-0) with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 19-4-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 39 games this season, tied for most in the NHL, and holds a 27-10-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Ranks second in the NHL with 47 road points (22-10-3), 22 road wins and a .671 road point percentage.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-3-1 this season (.825) when scoring first in a road game, the fourth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 - 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks T-9th in the NHL with 53 goals and 10th with 146 points (53-93=146) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Jiricek, Khusnutdinov, Ohgren, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy ranks fifth among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 56 points (21-35=56), T-7th with 35 assists and T-8th with 21 goals. Marco Rossi is sixth with 53 points (21-32=53), T-8th with 21 goals and T-10th with 32 assists.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild is 30-3-2 (.886) when scoring three-plus goals in regulation this season, the fifth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild is 27-2-3 (.891) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation this season.
- The Wild is 22-13-0 (.629) when allowing fewer than 30 shots on goal this season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

IN EXTRA TIME

- The Wild holds an 8-5 record (.808) in extra-time games this season, the eighth-best point percentage in the NHL in such games, and sixth-best point percentage among teams with 10-plus extra-time games.
- The Wild is 7-1 (.938) in extra-time games since Nov. 24, 2024, the best point percentage in the NHL in that span.
- The Wild won seven consecutive extra-time games dating from 11/30/24 - 3/11/25 (four overtime wins, three shootout wins).

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Wild ranks fourth in the NHL with a 34.4 power-play percentage (11-32) since February 8. Minnesota's 11 total power-play goals rank fifth in the NHL during that time frame.
- The Wild has allowed one PPG in 11 shorthanded situations in the team's last four games. Since March 11, ranks T-3rd in the NHL with a 90.9 penalty-kill percentage (10-11).



PLAYER NOTES

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** ranks sixth in the NHL with 231 shots this season. Leads the Wild with 56 points (21-35=56) and 35 assists, is T-1st with six PPG and is T-2nd with 21 goals.
- Posted a game-high eight shots on goal vs. BOS (3/2), tied for the second-highest total of his career.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-4=7) from 2/8 - 2/27.
- Currently T-3rd in the NHL with eight GWG this season, tied for the most GWG in a single season in franchise history.
- Currently tied for seventh in franchise history with 22 career GWG, needs one to tie Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fifth in franchise history.
- Is the second player in franchise history with three 30-assist seasons before turning 24, joining Pierre-Marc Bouchard (3x) Owns five points (3-2=5) in his last two games.
- Notched a game-high three points (2-1=3) vs. NYI (2/8), tying his season high.
- Boldy tied his single-game career high with three assists at CHI (1/26).
- Skated 26:35 of TOI at COL (1/20), the second-highest total of his season and NHL career.
- Skated a career-high 26:55 of TOI vs. EDM (1/15) and notched two points (1-1=2). He also registered seven shots on net, his second-highest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career, while his 15 shot attempts marked a season high and the second-highest total of his career.
- Tallied two points (1-1=2) and tied season-high plus-3 rating at SJS (1/11).
- Set a season-high with a plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3).
- Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his second-such goal of the season and sixth of his career, and passed Matt Cullen for most game-deciding shootout goals in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 - 11/23.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (32) and points (21-32=53), and T-2nd in goals (21).
- Won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the third-highest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken).
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 - 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime at DET (2/22).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24. Also finished with a plus-2 rating vs. CGY (1/25).
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also establishing a career-long mark.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** notched the 145th and 146th primary assists of his career vs. LAK (3/17) to overtake Mikael Granlund (145) for the second-most in franchise history (Koivu, 269).
- Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history.
- Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 28 points (7-21=28)
- Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 26 points (7-19=26).
- Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mppg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defenseman. Now with 74 career multi-point games, ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTA (1/23), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon scored the GWG in overtime vs. NSH (11/30) to reach five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29) and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-125), blocked shots (1,583) and minutes skated (20,354:59), second in games played (920), third in assists (295), third in scoring (117-295=412) and fourth in shots (1,520).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (158) by a defenseman playing in 750-plus games.

- Second among Wild defensemen and T-7th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24).
- With an assist at COL (2/28), became the fastest defenseman in Wild history to reach 70 career points (14-56=70), doing so in his 140th game of his career.
- Logged a game-high 30:05 in ice time at DET (2/22), marking the fourth game this season and ninth game in his NHL career he has skated 30-plus minutes.
- Skated 30:33 at CAR (1/4), his second consecutive game with 30-plus minutes of TOI and fifth-highest total of his career.
- Skated 31:29 of TOI at WSH (1/2), his second-highest total of the season and fourth-highest total of his career.
- Notched his first career OT goal and second career GWG (last 10/12/23 vs. FLA) at DAL (12/27). Per NHL Stats, Faber (0:35) scored the third-fastest overtime goal by a Wild defenseman, following Jonas Brodin (0:18 on Jan. 31, 2021) and Mathew Dumba (0:22 on March 17, 2015).
- Faber recorded a season-high 31:49 time on ice (TOI) total vs. EDM (12/12), the second-highest TOI total of his NHL career and the seventh-highest TOI total in the NHL this season.
- Tied his career high with plus-3 ratings vs. VAN (12/3) and at ANA (12/6), becoming the seventh player in franchise history to notch a plus-three rating in consecutive games.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).

- **Filip Gustavsson** is 3-1-1 in his last five home games with a 1.76 GAA, a .937 SV% and one shutout.
- Owns a 26-16-4 record for the season and ranks T-4th in the NHL with four shutouts, sixth in wins and T-6th in save percentage (.915).
- Is 68-41-15 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-3rd in the NHL during that span with a .915 save percentage (min. 50 games) and T-7th with 10 shutouts.
- Stopped a penalty stop at SEA (3/4) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.
- Made 28 saves to record his fourth shutout of the season vs. BOS (3/2), reaching 10 career shutouts with Minnesota and tying Josh Harding for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.
- Stopped 37-of-38 shots faced to earn a win vs. CAR (2/6), his 63rd in his Wild career, to move past Dwayne Roloson for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Notched his third shutout of the season with 21 saves at CAR (1/4).

- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 17 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 20 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He one of 11 goalies to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).
