FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

October 15, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS [1]

Game Summary | Event Summary

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Chicago Blackhawks to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Tuesday night for the first of their three meetings. It would take until the 16:01 mark of the first for the game's opening goal, and it would be Matt Coronato who jammed home his own rebound to give the Flames a 1-0 lead. Just 10 seconds later, Chicago's captain Nick Foligno would deflect a point-shot home to tie things up, and that's the way it remained heading into the intermission. In the second, Calgary would strike on the power play with Andrei Kuzmenko redirecting a Jonathan Huberdeau shot to reclaim the Flames lead through 40. In the third, Dustin Wolf and the Flames would slam the door shut, Coronato added an empty netter for his second of the night, and Calgary improved to 4-0-0 on the campaign with a 3-1 win over the Blackhawks.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of four meetings this season between the Flames and Kraken. Calgary and Seattle split their four-game season-series in 2023-24 with the road team winning every game.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-0-0 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 3-0-0 against Western Conference opponents.

CHASING HISTORY:

With their win on Tuesday night, the Flames improved to 4-0-0, to tie their longest winning streak to start a campaign in franchise history. The only other times the Flames have started a season with four-straight wins were in 2009-10, and 1993-94.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

23-year-old Dustin Wolf improved to 2-0-0 in 2024-25 and 10-7-1 in his career with a 31-save effort on Tuesday night. He became the fifth goaltender in Flames franchise history to register a double-digit win total in his career before celebrating his 24th birthday. The others: Pat Riggin (51), Trevor Kidd (50), Dan Bouchard (34) and Mike Vernon (34).

SUCCESS AT CLIMATE PLEDGE:

In six trips to Climate Pledge Arena, the Calgary Flames have a record of 6-0-0. Three Flames have averaged at least a point-per-game at Climate Pledge Arena; Rasmus Andersson (2G, 5A in 6GP), Nazem Kadri (1G, 3A in 4GP), and Jonathan Huberdeau (2G, 2A in 4GP). The Flames headed to Climate Pledge Arena twice last season back on November 4th, 2023 and November 20th, 2023, outscoring the Kraken 10-6, winning both contests.

HUBY DOO:

With his assist on Calgary's game-winning goal against Chicago on Tuesday, Jonathan Huberdeau registered his 498th career helper. With two more assists, Huberdeau can join Nikita Kucherov and Johnny Gaudreau as one of just three players from the 2011 NHL draft to reach the 500-assist mark and become the 25th-active skater to achieve the feat.

BEAN 200:

Defencemen Jake Bean skated in his 200th NHL game on Tuesday against Chicago to become the 11th blueliner from the 2016 NHL draft class to reach the 200-game mark. The Calgary, AB native made his NHL debut on November 27th, 2018 in Montreal as a member of the Carolina Hurricanes. Bean has registered 13 goals and 45 assists for 58 points in 200 games, with two helpers in three contests so far this season.

KIRKLAND SIGNATURE:

After scoring his first NHL goal last Sunday in Edmonton, Justin Kirkland recorded a helper on Calgary's game-opening goal against Chicago on Tuesday to record his first NHL assist. Kirkland has now recorded points in back-to-back games for the first time since March 16-17, 2024 as a member of the AHL's Tucson Roadrunners. Kirkland also led all Flames forwards on Tuesday with three blocked shots, including two inside the final minute of play.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Martin Pospisil scored his first NHL goal at Climate Pledge Arena against the Seattle Kraken on November 4th, 2023.

Andrei Kuzmenko recorded his 100th NHL point last season against the Seattle Kraken with his first of two assists on March 4th, 2024. This will be Kuzmenko's first trip to Climate Pledge Arena as a member of the Calgary Flames but has recorded a goal and an assist for two points in his two-prior trips to Seattle in his career.

According to NHL Edge, the Martin Pospisil has recorded the fastest max speed in the NHL so far this season at 38.71kph, doing so during overtime of Calgary's season-opener in Vancouver on Oct. 9.
