FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP February 4, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. TORONTO MAPLE LEAFS [6]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames began a mini three-game homestand by welcoming the Toronto Maple Leafs to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Tuesday night. A busy opening 20 would see a goal called back on both teams after video review, but eventually Matt Coronato scored one that did count, and it held up as the only tally of the first. In the second, Yegor Sharangovich registered a powerplay marker, but the Flames found themselves down 4-2 through 40. Joel Farabee would score his first as a Flame in the third, but Calgary ultimately fell 6-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Avalanche. Calgary fell in all three of their matchups with Colorado in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-8-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 17-12-2 against Western Conference opponents.

RED SOLO CUP:

On Wednesday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of defenceman Ilya Solovyov from the Calgary Wranglers of the American Hockey League. Solovyov, a native of Minsk, BLR has skated in 41 games for the Wranglers this season and has already registered a career-best 21 points from six goals and 15 helpers along with a +18 rating, the second highest on the club. Solovyov's six tallies lead all Wranglers blueliners and are tied for the 14th-most among all AHL defencemen. Last season, Solovyov made his NHL debut with the Flames, and would skate in 10 NHL contests, registering three assists. This past summer, he signed a two-year contract extension with Calgary. The 24-year-old was the Flames seventh-round pick (205th overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft and is looking to join Connor Zary and Rory Kerins as the third 2020 Flames draft pick to skate in NHL games for the club this season.

MAN OF THE MONTH:

Flames netminder Dustin Wolf was named the NHL Rookie of the Month for his play in January. Wolf topped rookie netminders in games played (10), saves (270) and shots against (293), and became the second rookie goaltender in Flames history to win at least seven contests in a single calendar month. The other: Mike Vernon, in both November 1986 (9-3-0, 3.09 GAA, .897 SV%, 1 SO in 12 GP) and December 1986 (7-3-1, 3.16 GAA, .900 SV% in 11 GP). He is just one victory shy of passing current Flames netminder Dan Vladar (27) for the second-most wins by a Flames rookie goaltender.

FARABEE'S FIRST:

Newly acquired Flames forward Joel Farabee scored his first goal with his new club on Tuesday against Toronto. Farabee has become the 404th skater to score a goal for the Flames in franchise history. The former 14th overall pick in 2018 has now skated in three games with Calgary since his acquisition, averaging just under 17 minutes of ice-time per game with the Flames.

SHARKNADO:

With Yegor Sharangovich's marker on Tuesday against Toronto, he recorded his 95th career goal. With five more tallies, Sharangovich can become just the third skater of Belarussian descent in NHL history to reach the 100-goal plateau and join: Mikhail Grabovski (125) and Andrei Kostitsyn (103).

ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIES:

Nazem Kadri spent time in Colorado, skating in 178 games over three seasons with the Avs scoring 155 points (58G, 97A) over that span. Kadri was also a key contributor in the 2022 playoffs for the Avalanche, scoring seven goals and eight assists for 15 points en route to winning the Stanley Cup. Tyson Barrie was drafted by the Colorado Avalanche in the third round (64th overall) in the 2009 NHL Draft. He would spend 484 games in Avalanche colours from 2011-12 through 2018-19, scoring 75 goals and 232 assists for 307 points to rank as the highest scoring Avalanche defenceman during his time in Colorado, and the third highest scoring player for the Avalanche over that span.

Avalanche defenseman Cale Makar was born in Calgary and played his junior hockey just two hours east of his hometown with the Brooks Bandits of the AJHL.

4 NATIONS PREVIEW:

With the NHL's 4 Nations Face-Off beginning in less than a week, the tournament's opening game between Canada and Sweden will feature four skaters from tonight's contest as Flames defenceman Rasmus Andersson will represent Sweden against Avalanche defenceman Cale Makar and Devon Toews along with centre Nathan MacKinnon who are all slated to represent Canada.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Jonathan Huberdeau (47-99—145 in 212 GP) and Nazem Kadri (71-98—168 in 217 GP) both recorded two-assist nights on Tuesday against Toronto to move within one and two assists respectively to registering the 100th helper of their Calgary Flames tenure.
