# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP February 2, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. SEATTLE KRAKEN [2]

**Game Summary I Event Summary** 

The Calgary Flames finished off a back-to-back set on Sunday night in Seattle for their second meeting with the Kraken. In the first, Morgan Frost would make a slick inside out move and rifle home his first as a Flame to give the visitors the lead. Calgary continued to pour it on in the opening frame, with Yegor Sharangovich scoring his 10<sup>th</sup> of the season shortly after. Then just over a minute later, a Jonathan Huberdeau powerplay strike would make it 3-0 Flames, and that is the way the opening 20 ended. In the middle stanza, Seattle would get on the board with Kaapo Kakko making it 3-1. The third period would see the Kraken push and draw within one, but Dan Vladar made 10 final frame saves, and Calgary would knock off the Kraken 3-2.

# **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Maple Leafs. Calgary fell in both of their matchups with Toronto in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-3-5 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 9-7-5 against Eastern Conference opponents.

#### FROSTY THE SNOWMAN:

Newly acquired Flames forward Morgan Frost scored his first goal with his new club in Sunday's 3-2 win over Seattle. In his two games in Flames threads, Frost has gone 56% in the face off dot, while averaging 17:49 of ice-time per game and is tied for the second-most shots on the club with eight. The Aurora, ON native has recorded 12 goals and 14 helpers for 26 points on the campaign, and with four more points can reach the 30-point plateau for the third-consecutive season dating back to 2022-23.

Frost became the 403<sup>rd</sup> skater to score a goal for the Flames in franchise history and first to score their first for the club since Clark Bishop did so on January 25<sup>th</sup> in Minnesota.

## MAN OF THE MONTH:

Flames netminder Dustin Wolf was named the NHL Rookie of the Month for his play in January. Wolf topped rookie netminders in games played (10), saves (270) and shots against (293), and became the second rookie goaltender in Flames history to win at least seven contests in a single calendar month. The other: Mike Vernon, in both November 1986 (9-3-0, 3.09 GAA, .897 SV%, 1 SO in 12 GP) and December 1986 (7-3-1, 3.16 GAA, .900 SV% in 11 GP). This season, Wolf ranks seventh in the NHL in save percentage (.917) and has helped his team earn a point in 69% of the games he has played in.

## **HUBY DOO:**

With his goal on Sunday night in Seattle, Jonathan Huberdeau reached the 20-goal mark for the seventh time in his career. With 20 goals in 52 games played, this is now the fewest games Huberdeau has required to reach 20 goals in a season, beating his previous fastest benchmark to 20 goals of 55 contests in 2020-21. Huberdeau's goal also held up as the game-winner to give him a team-leading five GWG's on the campaign and tie him for the second-most he has had in a single campaign (also 5 in 2018-19). His career-high is seven game-winning goals which he registered during the 2021-22 campaign.

#### **QUICK STRIKES:**

Morgan Frost, Yegor Sharangovich, and Jonathan Huberdeau gave the Flames three goals in the span of just 3:53 on Sunday in Seattle, marking their fastest three goals on the road since March 7, 2024 (3:14 at TBL). On that occasion, Sharangovich scored two of the three goals in a 6-3 Flames win in Tampa Bay.

## **CALAGRY/TORONTO TIES:**

Flames forward Nazem Kadri was drafted by the Leafs seventh overall in the 2009 NHL Draft. Kadri would spend the first 10 seasons with Toronto, skating in 561 games with 161 goals along with 196 assists for 357 points and 387 penalty minutes before being traded to Colorado. One of the pieces Toronto received in return was defenceman Tyson Barrie who would spend the 2019-20 campaign in Toronto, playing in 70 games, scoring 39 points from five goals and 34 assists. Barrie joined the Flames as a free agent in October of 2024.

Maple Leafs blueliner Chris Tanev spent four years in Calgary from 2020-21 through 2023-24, wearing the Flaming 'C' for 259 games. During his four seasons with the Flames, Tanev blocked a team-leading 566 shots and had a team-high +73 plus-minus rating while averaging over 20 minutes of ice time a game. Maple Leafs Assistant Coach Marc Savard spent the 2023-24 campaign as an Assistant Coach with the Flames. Savard also played four seasons with Calgary from 1999 to 2003, scoring 60 goals and registering 94 assists for 154 points.

# **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Flames forward Morgan Frost and Maple Leafs defenceman Conor Timmins were teammates on the Soo Greyhounds of the OHL for two seasons in 2016-17 and 2017-18.

MacKenzie Weegar skated in his 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game in Toronto during the teams' first meeting of last season on November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

William Nylander was born in Calgary and his father Michael played 168 games for the Flames over the span of five years, totaling 108 points from 34 goals and 74 assists.

The Flames have won seven-straight games when scoring multiple first period goals.
