# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP November 23, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. VANCOUVER CANUCKS [2] Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames began a five-game road swing by knocking off the Vancouver Canucks 5–2 on Sunday night at Rogers Arena with a dominant, multi-line effort led by Rasmus Andersson's three-assist, +4 performance and strong goaltending from Dustin Wolf. After Filip Hronek opened the scoring for Vancouver just 65 seconds in, the Flames responded quickly with goals from Morgan Frost and Connor Zary just 35 seconds apart to take a 2–1 lead into the break. The visitors pulled away in the second, starting with Kevin Bahl hammering home his third of the season midway through the middle frame before Yegor Sharangovich made it 4–1, with both tallies set up by Rasmus Andersson and Nazem Kadri. Blake Coleman extended the lead to 5–1 with a shorthanded marker early in the third, registering his 300th NHL point. Canucks captain Quinn Hughes cut into the deficit, but Vancouver never threatened further as Calgary clamped down from there. Coleman finished with a goal and an assist, Mikael Backlund added two helpers, and nine different Flames registered at least a point to give Calgary three straight victories.

#### **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Lightning. Calgary fell in these clubs' matchups in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-1-2 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 4-1-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

#### ANDY, YOU'RE A STAR:



Flames rearguard Rasmus Andersson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending November 23. Andersson led the league with nine points (2G, 7A) in four games, helping the Flames post a 3-1-0 record from Nov. 18–23.

He opened the week with a goal and an assist in a 5–2 setback in Chicago on Nov. 18. The following night in Buffalo, he recorded three points — including the game's opening goal — becoming just the third Flames defenseman in the past 15 years to score on consecutive days, joining Noah Hanifin (Mar. 6–7, 2021) and Mark Giordano (3x; last: Jan. 18–19, 2018). Andersson then added two third period assists to help secure a 6–2 win over the Sabres.

Back on home ice on Nov. 22, he registered an assist in a 3–2 shootout victory against the Dallas Stars. He capped the week with a three-assist outing — his ninth career three-point game and third career three-assist effort — in Calgary's 5–2 win over the Vancouver Canucks on Nov. 23. With that performance, Andersson moved past Dion Phaneuf and Dougie Hamilton and into a tie with Phil Housley for the fifth-most three-point games by a Flames defenceman and reached 247 career points, surpassing Jamie Macoun for sixth-most by a blueliner in franchise history.

The 29-year-old is currently riding a five-game point streak, posting 10 points (2G, 8A) since Nov. 15, and is tied 12th among NHL defensemen in scoring this season with 16 points (5G, 11A) while appearing in all 24 Flames games. His 16 points rank second on the team, behind only Nazem Kadri (4-14—18).

#### **HOWLIN FOR YOU:**

Dustin Wolf earned his 43<sup>rd</sup>-career victory with his 29-save effort in Vancouver on Sunday to tie Rick Wamsley for the sixth-most wins by a Flames goaltender through their first 90 games with the franchise. The only goaltenders with more wins at the time of their 90<sup>th</sup> game in a Flames sweater are Miikka Kiprusoff (53), Jacob Markstrom (51), David Rittich (47), Mike Vernon (46) and Mike Smith (44). Wolf has helped the Flames earn points in three of his last four starts, posting a 2.23 goals-against average and one shutout dating back to November 13.

# NAZ-HIM:

With his two-assist effort on Sunday night in Vancouver, Nazem Kadri has become just the second different Flames player in the past 10 years to post three straight multi-assist games. He joins Johnny Gaudreau who did so four times with Calgary, with his longest run of consecutive multi-assist games coming with a four-game run from Dec. 2-8, 2018 (8A). Since arriving in Calgary for the 2022–23 season, Kadri (21) is one of only two Flames skaters to register 20-or-more multi-assist games, alongside Jonathan Huberdeau (25).

#### THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman scored a goal and an assist on Sunday in Vancouver to record his 300<sup>th</sup> NHL point. Coelman has now become just the fourth Texas-native to reach the 400-point mark.

Coleman's goal would come shorthanded, giving him 20-career shorthanded goals. He is tied with Joel Armia and Sebastian Aho for the fourth most among active skaters, behind only Brad Marchand (36), Jean-Gabriel Pageau (23) and Jordan Staal (21).

Coleman skated in his 600<sup>th</sup> NHL game in Tampa Bay last season, a club he spent two years with, from 2019 to 2021. During his tenure, he appeared in 64 regular-season contests, recording 14 goals and 18 assists for 32 points while posting a +17 rating. Coleman played a pivotal role in Tampa Bay's back-to-back Stanley Cup championships, contributing 13 points (5G, 8A) in 25 games during the 2020 NHL Bubble, followed by 11 points (3G, 8A) in the 2021 postseason, including two goals and two assists for four points in the 2021 Stanley Cup Finals, the second-most on the Lighting.

#### RING OF FIRE:

Morgan Frost and Connor Zary scored goals 35 seconds apart on Sunday in Vancouver, marking Calgary's second-fastest pair of goals this season. The Flames' quickest two-goal burst of 2025–26 came on November 11, when Matt Coronato and Rasmus Andersson found the back of the net just 25 seconds apart in St. Louis.

#### **LOOK BACKS AT IT:**

With his assist on Blake Coleman's third-period marker in Vancouver on Sunday night, Mikael Backlund recorded the 33rd shorthanded point of his NHL career. The helper moved Backlund past Peter Forsberg (32) for the fifth-most shorthanded points by a Swedish-born player in NHL history.

#### **MATT SCORE-ONATO:**

Matt Coronato enters tonight riding a five-game point streak, totaling four goals and three assists for seven points over that span. The forward scored in four straight games from Nov. 15–22, establishing a new personal-best goal streak. He is now just two games away from matching his career-long point streak of seven games which he set late last season from Apr. 5–17, 2025, when he recorded four goals and four assists for eight points in the Flames final seven games of 2024-25.

#### **SHARKNADO:**

Yegor Sharangovich recorded a pair of assists on November 19 in Buffalo, marking his 99<sup>th</sup> and 100<sup>th</sup> helpers in the NHL. With the milestone, he becomes just the sixth skater of Belarusian descent in league history to reach the 100-assist mark. Sharangovich currently the highest-scoring active Belarusian in the NHL.

#### **HUBY DOO:**

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 794 points in his NHL career and is just six-shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,019) and Mark Scheifele (832) There are 25-active skaters who has surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

Since he entered the league in 2012-13, Johnathan Huberdeau has recorded more points against the Lightning than any other skater in the NHL, posting 51 from 17 goals and 34 assists in 48 matchups with Tampa Bay.

#### JOEL-SCORER:

Joel Farabee enters play tonight sitting at 98 career goals and is aiming to become the fourth member of the 2018 NHL Draft class to hit the 100-goal milestone. The most recent player from the class to reach the century mark was teammate Yegor Sharangovich, who scored his 100<sup>th</sup> on Oct. 30 in Ottawa — a goal Farabee set up, recording the primary assist on the tally.

# **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Rasmus Andersson's three-assist outing in Vancouver on Sunday tied the franchise mark for the most assists by a Flames defenceman in a road game against the Canucks. He joins Al MacInnis (Oct. 14, 1984), Gary Suter (2x: Jan. 15, 1988, and Nov. 19, 1990), and Zarley Zalapski (Apr. 30, 1995) as the only Calgary blueliners to accomplish the feat.

Lightning forward Brayden Point was born in Calgary and spent his early hockey years with the Calgary Bisons and Calgary Buffaloes before moving on to the AJHL's Canmore Eagles. He later starred with the Moose Jaw Warriors in the WHL, where he served as captain for two seasons.
