

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 4, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. SEATTLE KRAKEN [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Seattle Kraken to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Monday night for a Pacific Division tilt. Seattle led 1-0 through 20 with Yanni Gourde netting the only marker of the frame. Andrei Kuzmenko would draw the Flames level in the second, but Seattle would retake the lead later in the middle stanza and lead 2-1 through 40. Seattle would restore their two-goal lead 21 seconds into the third, before Andrei Kuzmenko scored his second of the night to give the Flames life. Seattle would add one more and the Flames suffered a 4-2 setback.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Lightning. Calgary knocked off Tampa Bay 4-2 in these clubs' first meeting in Calgary on December 16th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-4-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 12-11-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Tampa Bay Lightning to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their first meeting back on December 16th. The first would see the clubs combine for 14 shots but both goalies were solid in the opening 20 to keep the game scoreless. In the second, Calgary's offense would explode with A.J. Greer scoring just 2:30 into the middle stanza, followed by MacKenzie Weegar giving the Flames a 2-0 lead, and shortly after Yegor Sharangovich extended his goal-streak at the time to five games to make it 3-0 Flames through 40. Tampa would push back with two goals early in the third to make it a one goal game, before Connor Zary scored a huge insurance marker for the home-side, and Calgary won 4-2.

THE KUZMENK-SHOW:

With his first of two goals on Monday against Seattle, Andrei Kuzmenko recorded his 100th NHL point in just his 134th NHL game. Kuzmenko has become the only active skater with fewer than 150 games played to reach the 100-point plateau after recording his first two-goal game as a member of the Flames. The 28-year-old also became the 35th active-undrafted skater in the NHL to reach 100 points in their career with his .754 points-per-game ranking fourth among all undrafted skaters in the NHL right now. Kuzmenko is also the only player to reach the 100-point mark among skaters who made their NHL debut last season.

NEW FACE:

The Calgary Flames announced Tuesday that they claimed defenceman Joel Hanley off waivers from the Dallas Stars. Hanley, a native of Keswick, Ontario, skated in 32 games for Dallas this season, registering three assists along with 23 penalty minutes. Since making his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016, the 32-year-old has played 183 NHL games with Montreal, Arizona and Dallas while also skating in 33 playoff games with the Stars. Hanley was an undrafted free agent signed by Montreal on July 1st, 2015.

THROWBACK THURSDAY:

The newest face on the Flames roster Joel Hanley scored his first NHL goal against the Calgary Flames on February 1st, 2022 as a member of the Dallas Stars. The Flames would go on to win that contest 4-3 after trailing 3-1 in the third period with Oliver Kylington scoring the game-winner with under two minutes remaining in regulation to complete the comeback.

WORKIN' ON A COLE MINE:

Flames forward Blake Coleman spent two years with the Tampa Bay Lightning from 2019-2021. Coleman skated in 64 regular season games for Tampa Bay scoring 14 goals and 18 assists for 32 points and was a plus-17 throughout his Lightning tenure. Coleman won back-to-back Stanley Cups with the Lightning and was a key contributor on both teams with five goals and eight assists for 13 points in 25 games during the NHL Bubble in the summer of 2020, and had 11 points (3G, 8A) the following playoffs in 2021. Coleman joined the Flames prior to the start of the 2021-22 season as a free agent and has skated in 224 games with Calgary, earning 118 points from 59 goals and 59 assists and is in the midst of a career-year with a team-leading 25 goals along with 22 helpers for 47 points.

TAMPA BAY TIES TO CALGARY:

Lightning forward Brayden Point was born in Calgary and is slated to skate in his 13th game against his hometown team as a member of Tampa Bay. Point played for the Calgary Bisons and Calgary Buffaloes before moving onto the Canmore Eagles of the AJHL, followed by the Moose Jaw Warriors, a team he would spend parts of five seasons with, captaining the club for his final two campaigns in the WHL.



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Today is Jakob Pelletier's 23rd Birthday. The Quebec City, Quebec native played his first NHL game against the Tampa Bay Lightning on January 21st, 2023 recording one shot through 14 shifts.

Flames newest addition Joel Hanley's first NHL game came against the Calgary Flames on March 20th, 2016 as a member of the Montreal Canadiens.

The Flames have a record of 8-0-1 this season when Nazem Kadri and Blake Coleman both score in the same game with the pair both finding the back of the net in the same game last Saturday against the Pittsburgh Penguins.
