| The Lightning moved to 1-1-0 this season as they lost in their first road game of 2023-24. |
| Tampa Bay was outshot 42-26 by Detroit, including 21-7 shot deficit in the second period. |
| Steven Stamkos led the Lightning with six shots on goal. |
| Luke Glendening dished out three hits to lead the Bolts in his return to his home state of Michigan. |
| Darren Raddysh blocked a game-high four shots. |
| Tampa Bay won 28/50 (56%) of faceoffs and were led at the dot by Nick Paul who won 11/15 (73%) |
| Steven Stamkos scored the 516th goal of his NHL career and passed Pierre Turgeon (515) for sole possession of 40th place on the League's all-time list. |
| Steven Stamkos scored the 90th career multi-goal game to pass Jean Beliveau (89) and tie Glenn Anderson for 34th place on the League's all-time list. Stamkos 90 multi-goal games are the most in franchise history. |
