COLUMBUS BLUE JACKETS

All-Time Wild Record: 34-22-11 (22-7-6 at Xcel Energy Center, 12-15-5 at Columbus)

2024-25: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 3-2, in St. Paul (10/10)...LW **Matt Boldy** led the Wild with three points (1-2=3)...LW **Marcus Johansson** tallied two points (0-2=2)...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 31-of-33 shots faced to earn the win...C **Kent Johnson** led the Blue Jackets with two points (1-1=2)...D **Zach Werenski** also scored for Columbus (1-0=1)...G **Elvis Merzlikins** saved 23-of-26 shots faced.

WILD LEADERS: Johansson leads Minnesota with 24 points (10-14=24) in 34 career games against the Blue Jackets...RW **Mats Zuccarello** has 19 points (9-10=19) in 32 games...D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 13 points (2-11=13) in 26 matches...C **Ryan Hartman** has 11 points (1-10=11) in 16 games..

WILD GOALIES: G **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 15-7-2 with a 2.32 GAA and a .921 SV% in 26 career games (24 starts) vs. the Blue Jackets...Gustavsson is 2-0-1 with a 2.55 GAA and a .934 SV% in three starts.

BLUE JACKETS LEADERS: D **Jack Johnson** leads Columbus with 18 points (4-14=18) in 46 career games against Minnesota...C **Sean Monahan** has 14 points (6-8=14) in 30 games...LW **James van Riemsdyk** owns 11 points (8-3=11) in 21 games...D **Damon Severson** owns eight assists (0-8=8) in 18 games.

BLUE JACKETS GOALIES: Merzlikins is 2-1-2 with a 2.89 GAA and a .914 SV% in five career starts vs. Minnesota...G **Danila Tarasov** is 0-0-1 with a 3.80 GAA and a .919 SV% in his lone start against The Wild (1/6/24)...G **Jet Greaves** has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Columbus Head Coach **Dean Evason** spent parts of five seasons as the Head Coach of Minnesota, posting a 147-77-27 record in 251 games (2020-23)...Evason led Minnesota to the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of his first four seasons...Columbus Goalie Coach **Niklas Backstrom** went 194-142-50 in 409 career games with Minnesota (2006-15)...He is the franchise leader in games played and wins.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is on a 10-game point streak (8-0-2) vs. Columbus, its longest-ever point streak against the Blue Jackets, and has earned points in 18 of its last 24 meetings (13-6-5)...The Wild is 8-5-2 in its last 15 games at Nationwide Arena and 12-4-5 in the last 21 games at Xcel Energy Center...The Wild (12-game win streak) vs. Blue Jackets (14-game win streak) game on Dec. 31, 2016, marked the first time two teams faced each other while holding win streaks of at least 12 games in the history of the NHL, NBA, MLB, NFL, MLS and WNBA.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has yet to trail in regulation at any point this season, a streak of 240 consecutive minutes, the longest run to open a season in franchise history and the 16th-longest season-opening streak in NHL history...Owns a .931 team SV%, fifth in the NHL, and a 2.20 team GAA, sixth in the NHL...Owns a 30.3 PP%, T-7th in the NHL.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Played in his 500th career game vs. SEA (10/12).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Has appeared in 98 career games for Minnesota, needs two game appearances to reach 100 in a Wild sweater...Currently at 1,026 career games played, needs three game appearances to tie Patrick Roy (1,029 career games) for third-most all time.

Brock Faber: Currently ranks fourth in the NHL with 26:02 of TOI/G... Currently at 49 career points (8-41=49) through 88 games played, could become the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).

Marcus Foligno: Played in his 800th career game vs. SEA (10/12).

Filip Gustavsson: Ranks T-4th in the NHL with a .948 SV% and sixth with a 1.66 GAA among goalies with two-plus starts this season...Scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net...Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times... The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.

Kirill Kaprizov: Leads the team with six points (1-5=6)...T-11th in the NHL with five assists...Currently with 58 career PPGs, needs one more to tie Marian Gaborik (59 PPGs with MIN) for third-most in franchise history.

Jake Middleton: T-1st in the NHL with 4.0 blocked shots per game...T-3rd in the NHL with 16 blocked shots.

Yakov Trenin: Skated in his 300th career game vs. CBJ (10/10).

Mats Zuccarello: Scored his 200th career goal vs. SEA (10/12), becoming the first Norwegian-born player to reach the mark.

- The Wild finished the 2023-24 campaign with a 22.7 power-play percentage (62/273), the highest single-season percentage in franchise history.
- Minnesota finished the season by scoring a power-play goal in eight consecutive games, the season-long streak and tied for the third-longest run in franchise history.

PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** leads the Wild with six points (1-5=6) this season.
- Currently ranks T-11th in the NHL with five assists.
- Currently with 58 career PPGs, needs one more to tie Marian Gaborik (59 PPGs with MIN) for third-most in franchise history.
- Posted his 32nd career game with three-plus points vs. SEA (1-2=3, 10/12). Currently trails only Mikko Koivu (34 games with three-plus points) for most in franchise history.
- Needs one game-winning goal to move past Jason Zucker (22 GWG) for sole possession of fifth-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov led Minnesota in points (46-50=96) and goals and was second in assists last season. Ranked T-3rd in the NHL with 19 PPG, fifth with 41 PPP (19-22=41), T-8th in goals, T-11th with eight GWG and 11th in points.
- Is the first player in franchise history to post three consecutive seasons with 40-plus goals.
- Is one of four NHL players (Matthews, Pastrnak, Draisaitl) with 40-plus goals in each of the last three seasons (2021-24).
- With a two-point game (0-2=2) vs. SJS (3/28/24), became the first player in franchise history with multiple 80-point seasons.
- Scored his 150th career goal in his 265th career NHL game at ANA (3/19/24) to become the fourth-fastest active NHL skater to reach the mark, trailing only Auston Matthews (223 GP), Alex Ovechkin (234 GP) and Steven Stamkos (245 GP).
- Kaprizov has been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.
- Became the first player in franchise history to reach 50 points in four consecutive seasons with an assist at ARI (2/14/24).

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd game-winning goal of his career at CHI (4/7/23), tying Jason Zucker for fifth on the all-time franchise list.

- Kaprizov posted season-long five-game goal streak (6-3=9) from 3/10/24 to 3/19/24, marking his fourth career goal streak of five-plus games. Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is one of three players in Wild history to record multiple five-game goal streaks (Gaborik, two times; Rolston, two times).

PLAYER NOTES

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9/24 to 2/24/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12/24 to 2/19/24.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunnette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Finished T-15th in the NHL with seven GWG in 2023-24.
- Finished 2023-24 second on the Wild with 69 points (29-40=69), reaching a new single-season career high with an assist at VGK (4/12).
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** ranks T-4th in the NHL with a .948 SV% and sixth with a 1.66 GAA among goalies with two-plus starts this season.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** currently ranks fourth in the NHL with 26:02 of TOI/G this season.
- Currently at 49 career points (8-41=49) through 88 games played, could become the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With a two-point game (1-1=2) vs. STL (3/23/24), moved past Matt Boldy (15-24=39 in 2021-22) for the second-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.
- With two blocks at COL (3/8/24), reached 126 for the season and moved past Nate Prosser (124 blocked shots in 2011-12) for the highest single-season blocked shot total by a rookie in franchise history.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4-25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29=33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.
- Recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI last season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14/23 to 12/21/23. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- **Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21/23), the highest single-game total in the NHL last season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.**
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30-plus-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14/23) and vs. VAN (12/16/23).

PLAYER NOTES

MARCO POLO

- Among NHL rookies, **Marco Rossi** finished second in goals (21), T-3rd in shots (167), T-4th in GWG (two) and fifth in points (21-19=40) last season.
- With two assists at LAK (4/15/24), became the third rookie in franchise history with 40 points in a single season.
- Recorded a career-high seven shots on goal vs. STL (3/23/24) and notched his third career multi-goal game (2-0=2), moving his season total to 20 goals and joining Kirill Kaprizov (27 goals, 2020-21) as the only Wild rookies with 20-goal seasons. Also moved past Marian Gaborik (18-18=36, 2000-01 season) for the fourth-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.
- Became the 12th rookie in franchise history to record a three-point game (1-2=3), doing so vs. MTL (12/21/23).
- Rossi became the third-fastest Wild rookie to record ten goals in a season by scoring vs. CGY (12/14/23), his 27th game played in 2023-24. The only others to require fewer than 30 games to reach the mark are Kirill Kaprizov (25 GP in 2020-21) and Matt Boldy (25 GP in 2021-22).
- Recorded a four-game point streak (1-3=4) from 11/12/23 - 12/24/23, a career long.

- He finished first on the Wild with 51 assists last season.
- With two assists at COL (4/9/24), reached the 50-assist mark for the second season in his career (also 2021-22, 55 assists).
- Needs three assists to tie Zach Parise (201 assists with MIN) for eighth-most in franchise history
- Posted three assists at ARI (3/7/24), his eighth game with three-plus assists with the Wild and 16th of his career. Tied Pierre-Marc Bouchard for second-most three-assist games in franchise history.
- Zuccarello tied his single-game career high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19/24) and four points (0-4=4) at SEA (2/24/24).
- His four-assist game at SEA (2/24/24) was tied for the second-highest single-game assist total in franchise history. Now has five four-point games with the Wild, second-most in franchise history (Gaborik, seven).
- Recorded a 10-game point streak (3-11=14) from 11/10/23 to 12/5/23, tied for the longest of his career (two other occurrences).
- Recorded an 11-game home point streak (6-10=16), the longest in Wild franchise history to start a season and the longest home point streak of Zuccarello's career.

IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** is playing in his 21st career NHL season, tied for second-most by a goaltender in NHL history and trailing only Martin Brodeur (22 seasons).
- Fleury recorded his 50th win in a Wild sweater vs. OTT (4/2/24), joining Frederik Anderson (CAR, TOR, ANA) as the only active goaltenders to reach the mark with three different franchises (also PIT, VGK for Fleury).
- Fleury was named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending March 17 after going 2-0-1 with a 0.97 GAA, .961 SV% and one shutout in three games.
- Posted the 75th shutout of his NHL career vs. ANA (3/14/24) and needs one more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.^a
- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31/23), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19/23), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
