NASHVILLE PREDATORS

All-Time Wild Record: 42-40-13 (26-16-6 at Grand Casino Arena, 16-24-7 at Nashville)

2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening contest, 3-2, in overtime at Grand Casino Arena (11/4) and the third game, 6-5, in overtime at Bridgestone Arena (2/4), while Nashville won the second game, 3-2, in overtime in St. Paul (12/23)... LW **Matt Boldy** (3-1=4), D **Brock Faber** (1-3=4), and LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-3=4) lead Minnesota with four points each in the series... G **Filip Gustavsson** is 2-0-1 with a 3.20 GAA and a .898 SV% in starting all three games... C **Steven Stamkos** leads the Predators with six points (3-3=6) in the series... C **Ryan O'Reilly** owns five points (1-4=5)... G **Justus Annunen** stopped 21-of-24 shots faced for the Predators in the first game... G **Juuse Saros** is 1-0-1 with a 3.85 GAA and a .893 SV% in starting the second two games.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Minnesota with 40 points (18-22=40) in 48 games against Nashville... D **Quinn Hughes** has 26 assists in 19 games... Kaprizov (7-12=19 in 13 games), D **Jared Spurgeon** (5-14=19 in 45 games) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (2-17=19 in 28 games) each have 19 points.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 6-2-2 with a 3.15 GAA and a .898 SV% in 10 starts vs. Nashville... G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced Nashville.

PREDATORS LEADERS: D **Roman Josi** leads Nashville with 46 points (18-28=46) in 49 career games against the Wild... O'Reilly has 45 points (21-24=45) in 64 games... LW **Filip Forsberg** owns 39 points (21-18=39) in 40 games... Stamkos has 24 points (10-14=24) in 29 games.

PREDATORS GOALIES: Saros is 10-3-3 with a 2.50 GAA, a .921 SV% and two shutouts in 16 career starts against the Wild... Annunen is 1-1-1 with a 3.39 GAA and a .917 SV% in three career starts against Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Wild Head Coach **John Hynes** went 134-96-18 in parts of four seasons (2020-23) as Nashville's Head Coach... C **Michael McCarron** tallied 66 points (31-35=66) in 292 games across parts of six seasons (2020-26) with the Predators... C **Ryan Hartman** recorded 26 points (13-13=26) in 85 games in parts of two seasons with the Predators (2017-19)... LW **Yakov Trenin** was selected by Nashville in the second round (55th overall) of the 2015 NHL Draft and recorded 79 points (46-33=79), 162 PIM and six GWG in 283 games with Nashville in five seasons (2019-24)... Predators Head Coach **Andrew Brunette** recorded 321 points (119-202=321) in 489 games with the Wild (2001-04, 2008-11)... He also spent five seasons in Minnesota's hockey operations department (2014-19) as an Assistant Coach, Hockey Operations Advisor, Assistant General Manager and Director of Player Personnel... Nashville Assistant Coach **Darby Hendrickson** collected 60 points (29-31=60) in 182 games with Minnesota (2000-04) and served as an Assistant Coach with Minnesota for 14 seasons (2010-24)... LW **Cole Smith** is a native of Brainerd... D **Brady Skjei** is from Lakeville and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota (2012-15)... C **Erik Haula** was selected by Minnesota in the seventh round (182nd overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft and recorded 89 points (42-47=89) in 266 games with the Wild (2013-17). Haula also played collegiately at the University of Minnesota for three seasons (2010-13) and for one season (2008-09) at Shattuck-St. Mary's in Northfield... RW **Matthew Wood** played one season (2024-25) at the University of Minnesota... C **Tyson Jost** tallied nine points (2-7=9) and 15 PIM in 33 games over a span of two seasons with Minnesota (2021-23)... D **Nick Perbix** is from Elk River and played four seasons at St. Cloud State (2018-22).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 10-4-1 in its last 15 games played against the Predators at Grand Casino Arena dating back to 2/18/17, and has won four consecutive games.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has clinched its 15th overall appearance in the Stanley Cup Playoffs and 12th in the last 14 seasons... At 45-22-12, ranks third in the Western Conference with 102 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 79 games in franchise history... Ranks second in the NHL with a .903 team SV% and eight shutouts (NYI, nine), tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences)... Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and with 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW)... Ranks third in the NHL with 64 PPG, T-3rd with a 25.5 PP% (64/251) and fifth with 15.6 blocked shots per game... Features multiple 40-goal and 80-point scorers in the same season for first time in franchise history (Boldy, 41-40=81; Kaprizov, 43-44=87).

Matt Boldy: Following two assists at DAL (4/9), owns a career-high 85 points on the season (42-43=85), tied with Kevin Fiala (2021-22) for the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history... Owns 42 goals on the season, tied with Eric Staal (2017-18) and Marian Gaborik (2007-08) for the fourth-highest single-season total in Wild history... For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG and T-7th with 42 goals... Ranks second on the Wild in goals, points and PPG (11), third assists and T-3rd in plus/minus (plus-18).

Bobby Brink: Owns 98 career points (38-60=98).

Joel Eriksson Ek: With a three-point performance (1-2=3) vs. SEA (4/7), reached 350 career points (155-195=350), and moved past Pierre-Marc Bouchard for eighth in franchise history.

Brock Faber: Owns a career-high 51 points (15-36=51), tied with Ryan Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) for the second-highest single-season total every by a Wild defenseman... For the season, ranks T-9th among NHL defensemen in goals and third among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:11) and 11th in TOI/G (24:39)... His 13 even-strength goals rank T-6th among NHL defensemen this season and mark a single-season franchise record among Wild defensemen.

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a point in 15 of his last 20 games overall (14-5-1) and 16 of his last 21 starts (14-5-2)... In 35 games (34 starts) since Nov. 16, is 24-7-4 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with three shutouts, sixth in wins, T-7th with a 2.48 GAA, and T-9th with a .910 SV% (min. 20 GP)... For the season, holds a 28-13-6 record and ranks T-3rd in shutouts (four).

Ryan Hartman: Owns a career-long eight game point streak (7-5=12) and 15 points (8-7=15) in his last 12 games... Scored a goal at DAL (4/9) to reach 120 with the Wild, passing Andrew Brunette (119) for ninth-most in franchise history... Ranks T-3rd on the Wild in goals (23) this season.

Quinn Hughes: Owns 53 points (5-48=53) in 47 games with the Wild this season, the single-season franchise record among defensemen... His 48 assists with the Wild this season mark a single-season record among defensemen... Reached 50 points (4-46=50) in his 43rd game with Minnesota (vs. VAN, 4/2), becoming the fastest player to the 50-point mark in franchise history... Since Jan. 17, ranks T-4th in the NHL (second among defensemen) with 33 assists and T-15th (third among defensemen) in points (4-33=37)... Leads NHL defensemen this season with 34 PPP (2-32=34, T-7th among skaters) and ranks second with 69 assists (seventh among all skaters) and third with 76 points (7-69=76)... Leads all NHL skaters in TOI/G (27:42) and even strength TOI/G (23:25) and ranks fourth in power-play TOI/G (4:11) this season... Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (third among all skaters) with 48 assists and ranks second (T-14th among skaters) with 53 points (5-48=53).

Marcus Johansson: Scored the 200th goal of his NHL career vs. SEA (4/7), becoming the 33rd Swedish-born player to reach the 200-goal milestone.

Kirill Kaprizov: Scored two PPG at DAL (4/9) to reach 42 career multi-goal games, passing Marian Gaborik (41 MGP) for the all-time franchise record... Owns 19 PGG this season, T-2nd in the NHL this season and tied with his own single-season franchise record (2023-24)... Needs two goals to tie his single-season franchise record set in 2021-22 (47 goals)... Ranks fourth in the NHL this season with 45 goals and seventh with 269 shots... Ranks first on Wild in goals, points, PPG, GWG (7) and shots, and second in assists.

Jared Spurgeon: With an assist at DAL (4/9), reached 438 career points (123-315=438), passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history, and 315 assists, passing Ryan Suter for the franchise record among defensemen (second among all skaters).

Vladimir Tarasenko: Ranks T-3rd on the Wild in goals (23).

Yakov Trenin: Recorded five hits at DAL (4/9) and now owns an NHL-leading 400 hits on the season, a Wild single-season record and the second-highest single-season total since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06 (Kieffer Sherwood, 462 hits, 2024-25).

Jesper Wallstedt: Owns a 8-3-4 record against teams currently in a playoff position through games played April 9 and leads the NHL with a .930 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP)... Is 9-3-4 with a 2.46 GAA, .920 SV% and two shutouts in 16 road starts this season... Is 17-8-6 on the season, the highest single-season win total ever by a Wild rookie goaltender... Ranks second in the NHL with a .915 SV% and T-3rd with four shutouts this season.

Mats Zuccarello: Recorded three assists at DAL (4/9), marking his fifth multi-point effort in his last six games (1-10=11).

STANLEY CUP PLAYOFF NOTES

- The Minnesota Wild and Dallas Stars will meet in the First Round of the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs. Home ice for the series is yet to be determined.
- In its 25th anniversary season, the Wild is making its 15th postseason appearance. Among franchises to debut in the 1990s or later, Minnesota is the fourth with 15-plus Stanley Cup Playoffs appearances through its first 25 seasons (also SJS: 19, OTT: 16 & NSH: 16).
- The Wild is making its 12th playoff appearance since 2013, the most among all teams.
- Minnesota is one of four franchises in NHL history that has claimed all of its series wins as the lower-seeded team (4 of 4). The others: Columbus (2 of 2), New York Americans (1 of 1) and Seattle (1 of 1).
- Kirill Kaprizov (15-6=21 in 25 GP) needs two goals to overtake Zach Parise (16) for the most in Wild playoff history. After claiming the club's regular-season goals record March 3, Kaprizov can become the 16th player to hold an active franchise's all-time outright regular-season and playoff goals records – Filip Forsberg (NSH), Alex Ovechkin (WSH) and Mark Scheifele (WPG/ATL) are the only active players to do so.

TEAM NOTES



LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks second in the NHL with eight shutouts this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks second in the NHL with 2.66 goals against/game since November 1.

- Is 42-2-10 (.870) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, tied for the best point percentage in the NHL.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks seventh in the NHL with a plus-9 first-period goal differential this season and ninth by allowing 0.80 first-period goals per game.
- Ranks third in the NHL by allowing 0.86 second-period goals per game this season and fifth with a plus-20 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks seventh in the NHL by allowing 0.96 third-period goals per game and T-8th plus-14 third-period goal differential.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW).

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 45 games this season, T-6th in the NHL.
- Owns a 33-6-6 record (.800) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 689-182-112 all-time record (.758) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

STEERING THE SHIP

- The Wild owns 272 points (124-76-24) since John Hynes debuted as Head Coach on 11/28/23, the seventh-best mark in the NHL.

- Minnesota ranks fifth in the NHL and first in the Western Conference with 3.64 goals scored per game since Dec. 14.

- Since Dec. 14, ranks third in the NHL in PPG/G (0.85) and PPG (40), fourth in PP% (28.4, 40/141) and T-4th in shots per game (30.3).
- The Wild scored a power-play goal in a season-long eight consecutive games from 1/29 - 3/3, tied for the second-longest streak in the NHL this season and tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- The Wild ranks second the NHL with 109 assists and third with 132 points (24-108=132) recorded by defensemen since Dec. 14.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 45-22-12, ranks third in the Western Conference with 102 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 79 games in franchise history.
- Required the second-fewest games (77) to hit the 100-point mark in franchise history, trailing only 2021-22 (75).
- Is 42-16-9 (.694) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in point percentage, fourth in points (93) and fifth in wins.
- Features multiple 40-goal and 80-point scorers in the same season for first time in franchise history (Bolyd, 41-40=81; Kaprizov, 43-44=87).
- Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.910), second in team GAA (2.61) and third in goal differential (plus-52).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, 22).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).



PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** scored two PPG at DAL (4/9) to reach 42 career multi-goal games, passing Marian Gaborik (41 MGP) for the all-time franchise record.
- Owns 19 PGG this season, T-2nd in the NHL this season and tied with his own single-season franchise record (2023-24).
- Needs two goals to tie his single-season franchise record set in 2021-22 (47 goals).
- Ranks fourth in the NHL this season with 45 goals and seventh with 269 shots.
- Ranks first on Wild in goals, points, PPG, GWG (7) and shots, and second in assists.
- Recorded his sixth career regular-season hat trick at DET (4/5).
- Reached the 40-goal mark for the fourth season in his career with a goal vs. VAN (4/2). Per NHL Stats, he tied Nikita Kucherov for the third most 40-goal seasons by an active player born outside North America (Ovechkin, 14x; Draisaitl, 6x).
- Tied his season high with a plus-3 rating vs. VAN (4/2).
- Scored a goal in six consecutive home games from 1/29 - 3/12, tied for longest home goal streak in Wild history.
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. UTA (3/10), reached 242 career assists and moved past Pierre-Marc Bouchard (241) for fifth in franchise history.
- Scored the 220th goal of his NHL career vs. TBL (3/3), moving past Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record.

- With an overtime assist at NSH (2/4), recorded his ninth overtime point (4-5=9) of 2025-26 and tied Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl (both w/ 9 in 2024-25) for the most overtime points in a single season in NHL history.
- Scored his fourth OTG of the season vs. MTL (2/2), T-1st in the NHL, and now ranks T-1st in the NHL since debuting in 2020-21 with a franchise-record 14 career OTG.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 153).
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded an eight-game point streak (7-4=11) from 1/29 - 3/3, his longest of the season.
- Kaprizov posted multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12) from 1/17 - 1/24, marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.

A QUINN-TESSENTIAL ADDITION

- **Quinn Hughes** owns 53 points (5-48=53) in 47 games with the Wild this season, the single-season franchise record among defensemen.
- His 48 assists with the Wild this season mark a single-season record among defensemen.
- Reached 50 points (4-46=50) in his 43rd game with Minnesota (vs. VAN, 4/2), becoming the fastest player to the 50-point mark in franchise history.
- Since Jan. 17, ranks T-4th in the NHL (second among defensemen) with 33 assists and T-15th (third among defensemen) in points (4-33=37).
- Leads NHL defensemen this season with 34 PPP (2-32=34, T-7th among skaters) and ranks second with 69 assists (seventh among all skaters) and third with 76 points (7-69=76).
- Leads all NHL skaters in TOI/G (27:42) and even strength TOI/G (23:25) and ranks fourth in power-play TOI/G (4:11) this season.
- Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (third among all skaters) with 48 assists and ranks second (T-14th among skaters) with 53 points (5-48=53).
- Posted his 68th assist of the season at OTT (4/3), tying Phil Housley (68 in 1992-93) and Brian Leetch (68 in 1991-92) for the most assists through 70 games in a season by an American defenseman.

- Owns 42 goals on the season, tied with Eric Staal (2017-18) and Marian Gaborik (2007-08) for the fourth-highest single-season total in Wild history.
- For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG and T-7th with 42 goals.
- Ranks second on the Wild in goals, points and PPG (11), third assists and T-3rd in plus/minus (plus-18).
- Notched three points (2-1=3) vs. VAN (4/2) to move his career total to 323 (142-181=323) and pass Andrew Brunette (321) for 10th in franchise history.
- Recorded a career-best, seven-game assist streak (11 assists) from 1/31 - 3/3. Also had a 10-game point streak (8-13=21) from 1/24 - 3/3, tied for the longest of his career (10 games, 4/10 - 4/26/22).

- His 13 even-strength goals rank T-6th among NHL defensemen this season and mark a single-season franchise record among Wild defensemen.
- Posted a plus-3 rating vs. VAN (4/2), his eighth game this season with a plus-3 rating or higher. Only Nathan MacKinnon (14) and Nikita Kucherov (11) have more.
- Scored his 15th goal of the season with a PPG at TBL (3/24), tying Brent Burns (2007-08) for the second-highest single-season goal total by a Wild defenseman (17 goals, Burns, 2010-11 season).
- Recorded three assists at CHI (3/17), tying his single-game career high point total.
- Currently owns 33 career goals, tied with Filip Kuba for sixth all-time among Wild defensemen.

- **Marcus** and **Nick Foligno** became the first set of brothers to skate for the Wild in the same game on 3/26 at FLA. Per NHL Stats, they also became the 130th pair of brothers to skate together in an NHL game for the same team.
- Among active NHL players, Nick ranks sixth with 2,880 career hits, while Marcus ranks seventh with 2,789 career hits.
- Among active NHL players, Nick ranks 10th with 1,024 career PIMs, while Marcus ranks 13th with 946 career PIMs.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** notched an assist at DAL (4/9) to reach 438 career points (123-315=438), passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history, and 315 assists, passing Ryan Suter for the franchise record among defensemen (second among all skaters).
- Played in his 1,000th career game vs. NYR (3/14), joining Mikko Koivu as the only players to wear a Wild sweater for the first 1,000 games of their career.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** owns a 8-3-4 record against teams currently in a playoff position through games played April 9 and leads the NHL with a .930 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP).
- Is 9-3-4 with a 2.46 GAA, .920 SV% and two shutouts in 16 road starts this season.
- Is 17-8-6 on the season, the highest single-season win total ever by a Wild rookie goaltender.
- Ranks second in the NHL with a .915 SV% and T-3rd with four shutouts this season.
- Posted 39 saves at EDM (1/31), tied for the second-highest single-game total of his career and season, while tallying his first career assist, the 13th goalie in team history to do so.
- Made 29 saves vs. CHI (1/27) while also stopping all three Blackhawks shootout attempts to surpass Darcy Kuemper (2013-14) and Kaapo Kahkonen (2021-22) for the second-most wins by a rookie goaltender in a season in Wild history.
- Posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21). He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender.
- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Went 7-0-0 from in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.
- Became the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21).
- Set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2) from 10/13 - 12/2, besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09).
- Wallstedt's 10-game point streak from 10/13 - 12/2 is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history.
- Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old).
- Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.
- Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie.
- Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.
- Posted his second consecutive shutout with a 28-save performance vs. ANA (11/15), becoming the first rookie and youngest goaltender in team history to record consecutive shutouts.
- Now with five career shutouts, is the only Wild goaltender to earn four or more shutouts as a rookie.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** became the fourth goaltender in franchise history to reach 100 wins with a 30-save victory vs. VAN (4/2).
- Owns a point in 15 of his last 20 games overall (14-5-1) and 16 of his last 21 starts (14-5-2).
- In 35 games (34 starts) since Nov. 16, is 24-7-4 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with three shutouts, sixth in wins, T-7th with a 2.48 GAA, and T-9th with a .910 SV% (min. 20 GP).
- For the season, holds a 28-13-6 record and ranks T-3rd in shutouts (four).
- Saved all 25 shots faced vs. Utah (3/10) to earn his 15th career shutout, tying Dwayne Roloson for third in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, Gustavsson (210 GP) became the second-fastest Swedish goaltender in NHL history to 15 career shutouts behind only Henrik Lundqvist (178 GP).
- Made a season-high 44 saves at COL (2/27), the fourth-highest save total of his NHL career.
- Appeared in 16 consecutive home games (15 starts) without a regulation loss (10-0-5) from Nov. 1 - Feb. 2, tied for the longest streak in franchise history (Dubnyk, 12-0-3, 2017-18 season).
- With a 30-save victory vs. DET (1/22), earned the 100th win of his NHL career.
- Recorded an assist at BUF (1/17) to push his career point total to five (1-4=5).
- Tied the franchise record for longest home point streak when recording a point in 11 straight starts earlier this season (7-0-4, 11/1/25 - 1/10/26). Appeared in the home game on Jan. 15 but did not register a decision, ending his streak at 11 (also N. Backstrom, 11-game home point streak in 2006-07, 8-0-3).
- Recorded an eight-game point streak (7-0-1) from Dec. 8 - Jan 2.
- Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history.
- Is 47-31-10 with a 2.65 GAA, .911 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks second in the NHL in road shutouts, T-3rd in road SV% and fifth in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 101-60-23 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-4th in the NHL during that span with a .912 SV%, fourth with 15 shutouts and T9th- with a 2.60 GAA (min. 75 games).
