

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****April 3, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. ANAHEIM DUCKS [1]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames returned home on Thursday to welcome the Anaheim Ducks to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Just 16 seconds into this contest, Nazem Kadri found himself on a two-on-one, and he ripped home his team-leading 31st of the season to give the Flames an early 1-0 lead. The Ducks would respond later in the frame with Calgary native Olen Zellweger tapping in a backdoor pass to knot things at one, and that is where this game stood through 20 minutes of play. Midway through the second, Blake Coleman was sprung on a shorthanded breakaway and the Texas Tiger converted to reclaim the Flames lead. Less than five minutes later, Kevin Rooney would find a puck in the slot and made no mistake to extend Calgary's advantage, and the home side led 3-1 through 40. In the third, Blake Coleman netted his second of the night to help the Flames knock off the Ducks 4-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third of four meetings this season between the Flames and Golden Knights. Calgary has fallen to Vegas in both prior matchups in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 12-4-4 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 21-16-6 against Western Conference opponents.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman scored his 18th career shorthanded goal on Thursday against Anaheim. The only active players with as many tallies are Brad Marchand (36), Jordan Staal (21), J-G Pageau (21), Sebastian Aho (20), Cam Atkinson (19) and Mikael Backlund (18) and Evander Kane (18). Coleman would also add a powerplay marker later in the game and became the seventh player in franchise history to record a shorthanded and power-play goal in the same game multiple times (also Dec. 23, 2023). The others are Theo Fleury (4x), Joel Otto (3x), Joe Nieuwendyk (3x), Kent Nilsson (3x), Jarome Iginla (2x) and Rene Bourque (2x).

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

With his 26-save effort on Thursday against the Ducks, Dustin Wolf has become the fifth U.S.-born rookie goaltender with 25 wins in a single season. The others: Jimmy Howard (37 in 2009-10), Frank Brimsek (33 in 1938-39), Ryan Miller (30 in 2005-06) and Tom Barrasso (26 in 1983-84). Wolf, who was born and learned to play hockey in California, now owns an all-time record of 11-1-0 against California-based teams in his career.

SUN(IEV) SHINE:

On Wednesday afternoon, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Aydar Suniev to a three-year entry-level contract. Suniev, a native of Kazan, RUS played 35 games for the University of Massachusetts Amherst in 2024-25, posting career-bests in goals (20), assists (18) and points (38), finishing second on the team in scoring. Suniev helped his club upset the number three ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers in the Fargo Regional Semifinals, scoring a pair of goals including the overtime winner in a 5-4 UMASS victory.

Prior to embarking on his collegiate career, Suniev was a member of the BCHL's Penticton Vees winning back-to-back BCHL Championships in 2021-22 and 2022-23, totaling 110 points in 67 regular season contests over his two campaigns in Penticton. He was the joint top goal scorer in the league during his final BCHL campaign with 45 goals in 50 games.

Suniev was the Flames third-round pick (80th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft.

CALGARY VEGAS TIES:

On March 6th, 2024 the Calgary Flames acquired a first-round pick in the 2026 NHL Draft, a conditional third-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft (Kirill Zarubin) and defenseman Daniil Miromanov from Vegas in exchange for Noah Hanifin in a three-way deal involving Philadelphia. Hanifin spent six years with Calgary, skating in 420 games with 42 goals and 149 assists for 191 points. Miromanov has skated in 63 games so far through his Calgary Flames tenure, scoring five goals and 11 assists for 16 points.



Flames defenceman Brayden Pachal was claimed off waivers by Calgary from Vegas on February 4th, 2024 and has skated in 69 games for the Flames so far this season. Golden Knights centre Cole Schwindt was claimed off waivers by Vegas from Calgary earlier this year. Schwindt skated in four games with the Flames during the 2023-24 season. Fellow Golden Knights forward Brett Howden was born in Calgary and has skated in 14 prior games against his hometown team.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Nazem Kadri became the 13th player in Flames franchise history to score within the opening 16 seconds of a game and first since Tyler Toffoli (0:15 on Dec. 20, 2022).

Nazem Kadri leads the NHL with 11 game-tying goals so far in 2024-25.
