

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 2, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. PHILADELPHIA FLYERS [1]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames wrapped up a four-game road swing with a 2–1 win over the Philadelphia Flyers on Sunday night at Xfinity Mobile Arena. Jonathan Huberdeau led the way with both Calgary goals, scoring early in the second period from Yegor Sharangovich and Brayden Pachal, then adding his second midway through the third after deflecting a MacKenzie Weegar point shot to put the Flames in front 2–0. Philadelphia cut the deficit late when Travis Konecny scored at the 14:20 mark in the third, but Dustin Wolf shut the door the rest of the way, finishing with 17 saves on 18 shots for a .944 save percentage. Huberdeau's two-goal effort earned him first star honors while Dustin Wolf was the game's second star.

Now in his 17th NHL season, Nazem Kadri is upon his 1000th NHL game, looking to skate in game number 1000 tonight. Drafted 7th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs in 2009, Kadri made his NHL debut later that season and became a full-time member of the Leafs roster by 2012–13. During his tenure in Toronto, he developed into a consistent scoring threat, posting back-to-back 32-goal seasons in 2016–17 and 2017–18.

In July 2019, Kadri was traded to the Colorado Avalanche, where he elevated his game to another level. His physical edge and clutch scoring became key elements of Colorado's identity, particularly during their 2022 Stanley Cup run. That year, Kadri recorded a career-best 87 points (28G, 59A) in 71 games and added 15 points in 16 playoff contests, including the overtime winner in Game 4 of the Stanley Cup Final. His determination and timely heroics helped the Avalanche capture their first championship in over two decades.

Kadri joined the Calgary Flames as a free agent, signing in August 2022, immediately taking on a leadership role both on and off the ice. He became an alternate captain and a central figure in the team's offensive core. In 2024–25, Kadri delivered one of the finest seasons of his career, posting a career-high 35 goals along with 32 assists for 67 points while appearing in all 82 games. His production and compete level earned him the Harley H. Hotchkiss Award as the Flames' Most Valuable Player.

Through his 999 NHL games, Kadri has amassed 310 goals and 410 assists for 720 points. Kadri is in line to become the 41st – active skater in the league to reach the 1000-game marker and the 407th in NHL history. He is also looking to become the 13th player to appear in his 1,000th career regular-season game in a Flames uniform:

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Blue Jackets. Calgary and Columbus split the season series in 2024-25, with the home team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-0-0 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 2-1-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

LAST TIME AT THE 'DOME AGAINST COLUMBUS:

The Calgary Flames last welcomed the Columbus Blue Jackets to the Scotiabank Saddledome on December 3rd, 2024. Both teams played out a scoreless first period before Mikael Backlund set up Rasmus Andersson, who blasted a one-timer past the Columbus netminder to give Calgary a 1-0 lead — a score that held through 40 minutes. In the third, Kevin Bahl added a late insurance marker, his first as a Flame, before Yegor Sharangovich sealed the 3-0 victory with an empty-net goal.

CALGARY/COLUMBUS TIES:

Flames defenceman Jake Bean spent three seasons with the Columbus Blue Jackets, appearing in 153 games and recording 12 goals and 32 assists for 44 points.

Blue Jackets centre Sean Monahan was drafted sixth overall by the Calgary Flames in the 2013 NHL Draft and spent the first nine seasons of his career with the club. Monahan's 656 games in a Flames sweater rank ninth in franchise history, and the Brampton, ON native tallied 212 goals and 250 assists for 462 points during his tenure in Calgary.

Blue Jackets defenceman Erik Gudbranson appeared in 78 games for the Flames during the 2021–22 season, posting then-career highs in goals (6) and points (17).

HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau opened the scoring on Sunday in Philadelphia, extending his point streak to five games. Since joining the Flames in 2022–23, Huberdeau has only recorded two longer point streaks — both six game runs during the 2024–25 season. Over that span, he has registered 176 points (59G, 117A), the second-most on the team since 2022–23, trailing only Nazem Kadri (208).

LIL KUZY VERT:

On Tuesday morning, the Flames announced the recall of defenceman Yan Kuznetsov from their American Hockey League affiliate, the Calgary Wranglers. Through 10 AHL contests so far this season, Kuznetsov has recorded two goals — including one game-winner — helping the Wranglers to a 6-2-2 start in 2025–26. A Memorial Cup Champion with the Saint John Sea Dogs in 2022, Kuznetsov was also named to the Memorial Cup All-Star Team that year. He has appeared in one NHL game, registering two shots while logging 11:58 of ice time on January 9, 2024, against the Ottawa Senators.

SHARK ATTACK:

Yegor Sharangovich opened the scoring on Thursday in Ottawa, registering his 200th career NHL point. He became just the fourth player of Belarusian descent to reach the 200-point milestone, joining Mikhail Grabovski (296), Andrei Kostitsyn (222), and Ruslan Salei (204). Sharangovich is currently the highest-scoring active Belarusian-born player in the NHL.



RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson assisted on Matt Coronato's marker on October 30th in Ottawa to boost his career totals to 49-186—235. His 235 points ranks eighth among defenceman in the club's history. With one more goal, he became the eighth defenceman in Flames franchise history with 50 or more goals, and tie Phil Housley (50) for the seventh-most goals by a defenceman in Flames franchise history.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Calgary's Matt Coronato and Columbus's Adam Fantilli were USHL Champions with the Chicago Steel in 2020-21. Coronato was named the USHL's Forward of the Year after leading the league with 48 goals in 51 games.
