

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****February 24, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] vs. EDMONTON OILERS [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames travelled north to Edmonton for round three of the Battle of Alberta on Saturday for Hockey Night in Canada. Calgary would draw first blood after Walker Duehr found a streaking Nazem Kadri who redirected home his 21<sup>st</sup> of the season to give the Flames an early lead. Martin Pospisil made it 2-0 Flames shortly after followed by Noah Hanifin scoring his 10<sup>th</sup> to put the visitors up 3-0. Edmonton would get on the board before the end of the first, but Calgary led 3-1 through 20. The Oilers would draw within one in the second, before a pair of goals from Dryden Hunt and Noah Hanifin gave the Flames a 5-2 lead through 40. In the third, both teams traded goals as the Flames knocked off Edmonton to take the third installment of the Battle of Alberta 6-3.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Kings. Calgary fell 5-3 in the clubs' first meeting back on December 23<sup>rd</sup>.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-6-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 17-14-2 against Western Conference opponents.

**FIRST MEETING:**

The Calgary Flames headed to Los Angeles for their final game before the Christmas Break on December 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Kings would open the scoring with Quinton Byfield netting the icebreaker 1:01 into the game. Rasmus Andersson would respond just under two minutes later, but Pierre-Luc Dubois gave the Kings the lead just before the break. Blake Coleman would draw the Flames level in the second, but the Kings would score twice in the latter stages of the middle stanza to give them a 4-2 lead through 40. Coleman would strike again in the third to bring the Flames within one, but an empty netter from the Kings gave them a 5-3 lead, and that is how meeting number one between these Pacific Division foes ended.

**WHOLE LOTTA BREAD:**

Flames forward Andrew Mangiapane is currently at 399 games played and is slated to skate in his 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game tonight against Los Angeles. Mangiapane's first NHL game came on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017 against the Chicago Blackhawks, with all 399 of his games coming in a Flames sweater. Mangiapane is slated to become the 13<sup>th</sup> active player selected in the sixth-round to skate in their 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game, and the only sixth-round selection from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat. In his 399 games, Mangiapane has 106 goals and 101 assists for 207 career points.

**ON THE HUNT:**

Dryden Hunt found the back of the net on Saturday night's Battle of Alberta to score his first goal as a member of the Calgary Flames. Hunt was acquired by the Flames on March 3, 2023 from the Toronto Maple Leafs in exchange for Radim Zohorna, and made his Flames debut on October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Hunt's goal held up as the game winner, the third GWG of his career and first since December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 as a member of the New York Rangers.

**NAZ-HIM KADRI:**

Nazem Kadri extended his goal-streak to three-straight games on Saturday with his game-opening goal against the Oilers in Edmonton. Over his last three games, Kadri has four goals and two assists for six points which is the most on the Flames over that span. Since the start of February, Kadri has a team-leading 12 points from five goals and seven assists and has found his way onto the scoresheet in four of his last five outings. The Brampton, ON native also recorded his 50<sup>th</sup> point of the campaign on Thursday to become the fourth Flames player since the 2000s to start their career with consecutive 50-point seasons; joining Daymond Langkow (3; 2005-06 to 2007-08), Elias Lindholm (2; 2018-19 to 2019-20) and Alex Tanguay (2; 2006-07 to 2007-08).

**THE KUZMENK-SHOW:**

With his assist on Oliver Kyllington's game-opening goal on Thursday against Boston, Andrei Kuzmenko has now recorded 99 points in his NHL career (50-49 – 99) and is one point shy of the 100-point plateau. Kuzmenko's 99 points currently lead all skaters in the NHL that have played 150 games or less in their careers, with Matias Maccelli (93pts in 144 GP) and Matty Beniers (90pts in 142 GP) currently ranking second and third respectively. Kuzmenko is looking to become the 35<sup>th</sup> active-undrafted skater in the NHL to reach 100 points in their career with his .750 points-per-game ranking fourth among all undrafted skaters in the NHL right now.

**MARTY PARTY:**

Martin Pospisil found his way onto the scoresheet on Saturday in Edmonton for the second-straight game and has registered goals in back-to-back games for the first time in his NHL career. Pospisil was tied for a game-high six hits on Saturday, and since February 1<sup>st</sup>, Pospisil's 46 hits rank third in the entire league.

**WE NOAH GUY:**

With two tallies on Saturday in Edmonton, Noah Hanifin set a new career-high in goals with 11 on the campaign thus far. Hanifin became just the seventh different Flames defenseman to score multiple goals in a Battle of Alberta and first since Mark Giordano who did so on December 27<sup>th</sup>, 2015. The Boston, MA native also recorded his seventh three-point game with Calgary and passed TJ Brodie for sole possession of eighth most by a Flames defenseman.



**HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

The Flames improved their record to 7-0-1 this season when Nazem Kadri and Blake Coleman both score in the same game after the pair both found the back of the net on Saturday in Edmonton.

Jonathan Huberdeau scored his 200<sup>th</sup> NHL goal against the LA Kings last season on November 14<sup>th</sup> 2022.

In these teams' first meeting, Blake Coleman became the first Flames player to score a shorthanded goal and power-play goal in the same game since Noah Hanifin on November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in Arizona.

**CALGARY WRANGLERS (AHL): 27-17-6**
