SAN JOSE SHARKS

All-Time Wild Record: 42-36-9 (22-15-5 at Xcel Energy Center. 20-21-4 at San Jose)

2024-25: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 5-2, in San Jose (11/7) and the second meeting, 3-1, at SAP Center at San Jose (1/11)...LW **Matt Boldy** (3-1=4) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (2-2=4) lead Minnesota with four points each...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** notched three points (0-3=3) in the first meeting...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 2-0-0 with a 1.50 GAA and a .952 SV% in starting both games...C **Macklin Celebrini** leads San Jose with three points (2-1=3)...D **Henry Thrun** owns two assists (0-2=2)...G Vitek Vanecek stopped 26-of-30 shots faced for San Jose in the first meeting...G Yaroslav Askarov saved 19 of 22 shots faced for the Sharks in the second game.

WILD LEADERS: Zuccarello leads the Wild with 30 points (11-19=30) in 31 career contests against the Sharks...Kaprizov owns 21 points (10-11=21) in 17 games)...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 18 points (8-10=18) in 42 games... Boldy (7-8=15 in nine games), C **Ryan Hartman** (2-13=15 in 27 games) and C **Gustav Nyquist** (7-8=15 in 22 games) each own 15 points against San Jose.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 20-5-4 with a 1.85 GAA, a .940 SV% and three shutouts in 29 career starts vs. San Jose...G **Filip Gustavsson** is 2-1-1 with a 2.47 GAA and .939 SV% in four starts against the Sharks.

SHARKS LEADERS: C **Logan Couture** leads San Jose with 30 points (14-16=30) in 45 career games against Minnesota...RW **Tyler Toffoli** has 20 points (10-10=20) in 32 games...D **Marc-Edouard Vlasic** has 14 points (1-13=14) in 60 games...C **Alex Wennberg** has 10 points (5-5=10) in 20 games.

SHARKS GOALIES: G **Alexandar Georgiev** owns a 6-3-0 record with a 2.75 GAA and a .909 SV% in nine career starts...G **Georgi Romanov** has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** skated in 16 games with San Jose during the 2006-07 season...Wild D **Jake Middleton** recorded 12 points (3-9=12) and 82 PIM in 59 games for San Jose in parts of four seasons (2018-22)...Sharks D **Jimmy Schuldt** is from Minnetonka and played three seasons at Minnetonka High School (2010-13) and four seasons at St. Cloud State (2015-19)...Sharks Amateur Scout **Thomas Vanek** recorded 93 points (39-54=93) in 154 games across two seasons (2014-16) with the Wild.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has won six consecutive games against San Jose since 3/11/23 and 11 of the last 14 meetings (11-2-1) since 4/16/21... Minnesota is 6-2-1 in its last nine contests against the Sharks at Xcel Energy Center since 1/22/21...The Wild has points in six of the last seven games played at SAP Center at San Jose (6-1-0).

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Second in the NHL with 49 road points (22-12-5) while ranking third with a .628 road point percentage and T-3rd with 22 road wins...Fourth in the NHL with a .905 team save percentage this season...Has scored first in 44 games this season, tied for second-most in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Finished with three points (1-2=3) vs. DAL (4/6), his sixth game of the season with three-plus points...Leads the Wild with 67 points (26-41=67), 26 goals and 41 assists and ranks second with six PPG...Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons at age 23 or younger...Is the fifth player in Wild history to record consecutive 40-assist seasons...T-3rd in the NHL with nine GWG this season...Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth...Ranks seventh in the NHL with 260 shots this season.

Justin Brazeau: Recorded a game- and career-high six hits vs. DAL (4/6). **Brock Faber:** Ranks fourth in the NHL at 25:22 TOI/G this season...Owns a 25:05 TOI/G average in 158 career games, tied for the second-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since 2000-01...Tied for first among Wild defensemen with eight goals this season, needing one more to establish a new single-season career high.

Marcus Foligno: Ninth in the NHL with 238 hits this season...Owns 26 points (13-13=26) this season, T-2nd highest single-season total of his NHL career.

Freddy Gaudreau: Ranks T-4th on the team with 18 goals this season, one shy of tying his single-season career high set in 2022-23...Leads the team with 501 face off wins and ranks third with five PPG.

Filip Gustavsson: Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season...For the season, is 30-18-6 and ranks T-3rd in the NHL in shutouts (five), fifth in SV% (.915) and T-6th in wins...Per NHL Stats, his five shutouts this season are tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).

Jake Middleton: T-1st among Wild defenseman in goals scored this season. **Marco Rossi:** Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6), his third GWG of the season...Leads the team in PPG (seven), ranks second in goals (24), assists (34) and points (24-34=58)...Has played in 163 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.

Devin Shore: Currently at 498 career NHL games played.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history...Leads Wild defensemen and ranks T-6th among Wild skaters with 31 points (7-24=31).

Yakov Trenin: Owns 228 hits this season, which ranks 13th in the NHL and establishes a new single-season career-high.

Mats Zuccarello: Played in the 900th game of his NHL career vs. DAL (4/6)... Ranks third on the team in assists (30) and fourth in points (18-30=48).

TEAM NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 28-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 20-4-2 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 44 games this season, tied for second-most in the NHL, and holds a 30-11-3 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

• The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Second in the NHL with 49 road points (22-12-5) while ranking third with a .628 road point percentage and T-3rd with 22 road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-4-2 this season (.773) when scoring first in a road game, the seventh-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the
 first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27
 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in
 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild is 38-8-5 (.794) when scoring two-plus goals in regulation this season, tied for the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild is 31-2-4 (.892) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation this season.
- The Wild is 24-16-0 (.600) when allowing fewer than 30 shots on goal this season, the fifth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.



BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** finished with three points (1-2=3) vs. DAL (4/6), his sixth game of the season with three-plus points.
- Leads the Wild with 67 points (26-41=67), 26 goals and 41 assists and ranks second with six PPG.
- Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons before turning 24. Is the fifth player in Wild history to record consecutive 40-assist seasons, joining Mats Zuccarello (three from 2021-22 to 2023-24), Ryan Suter (three from 2017-18 to 2019-20), Mikko Koivu (three from 2008-09 to 2010-11) and Mikael Granlund (two from 2016-17 to 2017-18).
- T-3rd in the NHL with nine GWG this season. Ranks seventh in the NHL with 260 shots.
- Scored the 100th goal of his NHL career at NJD (3/31), his 25th goal of the season.
- Notched his ninth GWG of the season vs. WSH (3/27), establishing a new single-season franchise record.
- Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth.
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. SEA (3/19), his 14th multi-goal game of his career, to tie Nino Niederreiter for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Is the fourth player in franchise history to record three consecutive 60-point seasons (also Kaprizov, Koivu, Zuccarello).
- Posted a game-high eight shots on goal vs. BOS (3/2), tied for the second-highest total of his career.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-4=7) from 2/8 2/27.
- Is the second player in franchise history with three 30-assist seasons before turning 24, joining Pierre-Marc Bouchard (3x) Owns five points (3-2=5) in his last two games.
- Boldy tied his single-game career high with three assists at CHI (1/26).
- Skated 26:35 of TOI at COL (1/20), the second-highest total of his season and NHL career.
- Skated a career-high 26:55 of TOI vs. EDM (1/15) and notched two
 points (1-1=2). He also registered seven shots on net, his secondhighest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career, while his
 15 shot attempts marked a season high and the second-highest total
 of his career.
- Tallied two points (1-1=2) and tied season-high plus-3 rating at SJS (1/11).
- Set a season-high with a plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3).
- Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his secondsuch goal of the season and sixth of his career, and passed Matt Cullen for most game-deciding shootout goals in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 11/23.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6), his third GWG
 of the season
- Leads the team in PPG (seven), ranks second in goals (24), assists (34) and points (24-34=58).
- Has played in 163 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.
- Won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the thirdhighest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken).
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime at DET (2/22).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24. Also finished with a plus-2 rating vs. CGY (1/25).
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12
 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 10/22, also establishing a career-long mark.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- Jared Spurgeon notched the 145th and 146th primary assists of his career vs. LAK (3/17) to overtake Mikael Granlund (145) for the secondmost in franchise history (Koivu, 269).
- Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history.
- Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 30 points (7-23=30).
- Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multipoint games by a Wild defensemen. Now with 74 career multi-point games, ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTA (1/23), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon scored the GWG in overtime vs. NSH (11/30) to reach five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29 and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-124), blocked shots (1,602) and minutes skated (20,569:06), second in games played (930), third in assists (299), third in scoring (117-298=415) and fourth in shots (1,539).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (160) by a defenseman playing in 750-plus games.

- Recorded a game-high six blocked shots at DAL (3/24), tying his singlegame career high, and logged a game-high 29:45 of time on ice, his fifth-highest total of season.
- Ranks fourth in the NHL at 25:22 TOI/G this season.
- Owns a 25:05 TOI/G average in 158 career games, tied for the secondhighest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since 2000-01.

- Tied for first among Wild defensemen with eight goals this season, needing one more to establish a new single-season career high.
- With an assist at COL (2/28), became the fastest defenseman in Wild history to reach 70 career points (14-56=70), doing so in his 140th game of his career.
- Logged a game-high 30:05 in ice time at DET (2/22), marking the fourth game this season and ninth game in his NHL career he has skated 30-plus minutes.
- Skated 30:33 at CAR (1/4), his second consecutive game with 30-plus minutes of TOI and fifth-highest total of his career.
- Skated 31:29 of TOI at WSH (1/2), his second-highest total of the season and fourth-highest total of his career.
- Notched his first career OT goal and second career GWG (last 10/12/23 vs. FLA) at DAL (12/27). Per NHL Stats, Faber (0:35) scored the third-fastest overtime goal by a Wild defenseman, following Jonas Brodin (0:18 on Jan. 31, 2021) and Mathew Dumba (0:22 on March 17, 2015).
- Faber recorded a season-high 31:49 time on ice (TOI) total vs. EDM (12/12), the second-highest TOI total of his NHL career and the seventh-highest TOI total in the NHL this season.

- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
