CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS

All-Time Wild Record: 58-29-6 (31-12-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 27-17-3 at Chicago)

2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 4-3, in overtime at United Center (11/26)...LW **Matt Boldy** led the Wild with three points (1-2=3)...D **Jonas Brodin** (0-2=2) and D **Brock Faber** (1-1=2) each posted multi-point outings...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 34-of-37 shots faced to earn the win for Minnesota...C **Connor Bedard** led the Blackhawks with two points (1-1=2)...C **Jason Dickinson** (1-0=1) and D **Artyom Levshunov** (1-0=1) also scored...G **Spencer Knight** stopped 20-of-24 shots faced for Chicago.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads the Wild with 33 points (20-13=33) in 36 career games against Chicago...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 25 points (8-17=25) in 28 career matches...D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 21 points (7-14=21) in 46 games...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** owns 17 points (7-10=17) in 14 games.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 6-0-1 with a 1.99 GAA and a .929 SV% in seven career starts against the Blackhawks...G **Jesper Wallstedt** earned his first career win and shutout by saving all 24 shots faced at CHI (4/7/24) in the second start of his career (and only against the Blackhawks).

BLACKHAWKS LEADERS: LW **Andre Burakovsky** leads Chicago with 18 career points (4-14=18) in 30 games against the Wild...LW **Teuvo Teravainen** (4-10=14 in 26 games) and LW **Nick Foligno** (8-6=14 in 30 games) each own 14 points...C **Ryan Donato** has 11 points (4-7=11) in 23 games.

BLACKHAWKS GOALIES: G **Spencer Knight** is 0-0-1 with a 2.94 GAA and .867 SV% in two career games (one start) vs. the Wild...G **Arvid Soderblom** is 0-2-0 with a 3.55 GAA and a .889 SV%.

CONNECTIONS: C **Ryan Hartman** was selected by Chicago in the first round (30th overall) of the 2013 NHL Draft and collected 57 points (27-30=57) in 141 games during four seasons (2014-18) with the Blackhawks...C **Vinnie Hinostroza** is a Chicago native and was selected by Chicago in the sixth round (No. 169 overall) in the 2012 NHL Draft and collected 51 points (17-34=51) in 123 games...Donato tallied 39 points (18-21=39) in 84 games in parts of two seasons with Minnesota (2018-20)...D **Wyatt Kaiser** is from Andover and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota-Duluth (2020-23)...C **Oliver Moore** is from Mounds View and played collegiately at the University of Minnesota...Nick Foligno is the older brother of Wild LW **Marcus Foligno**.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota's 58 all-time wins against Chicago are its third-most against an opponent...The Wild has earned points in 16 consecutive meetings (16-0-1) against the Blackhawks dating back to 2/4/20...Minnesota has earned a point in 11 consecutive games played at Grand Casino Arena (10-0-1) dating back to 2/10/18...The Wild has earned points in nine consecutive games played at United Center (7-0-1) since 1/21/22...In 2015-16, the Wild became the first team to win every game in a season series of at least five contests against Chicago since the Boston Bruins went 8-0-0 in 1938-39.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: At 29-14-10, ranks T-4th in the NHL with 68 points, the third-highest point total through a season's first 53 games in franchise history...Is 26-8-7 (.720) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in points (59) and third in wins...Since Nov. 1, ranks second in the NHL in team SV% (.914), and third in goal differential (plus-33) and team GAA (2.49)...Since Dec. 14, ranks T-3rd in the NHL in PPG/game (0.90), fourth in shots on goal/game (30.3), and fifth in goals/game (3.71)...Has scored first in 32 games this season, second most in the NHL (Washington, 33)...Ranks T-1st in the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the franchise's single-season record...Ranks fourth in the NHL with 831 blocked shots.

John Hynes: Coached his 800th NHL game vs. FLA (1/22), fourth-most in NHL history among American-born coaches.

Matt Boldy: Currently owns 297 career points (130-167=297)...Scored his third SHG of the season vs. FLA (1/24), T-3rd most in the NHL...For the season, ranks T-4th in the NHL in goals (28)...Ranks first on Wild in goals, second in points (28-25=53) and assists, and T-2nd in GWG (three).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns 17 points (8-9=17) in his last 18 games played...Ranks fifth in the NHL in total faceoffs taken (969).

Brock Faber: Owns 11 points (3-8=11) in 11 games played since Jan. 3...In 21 games since Dec. 14, ranks T-6th among NHL defensemen with five goals and T-10th with 17 points (5-12=17)...Since Nov. 7, ranks fifth among NHL defensemen with a plus-24 rating...For the season, ranks T-7th among NHL defensemen in goals (11) and fourth among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:06), ninth in TOI/G (24:48) and 11th in blocked shots (111).

Filip Gustavsson: In 20 games (19 starts) since Nov. 16, is 13-2-4 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with two shutouts, sixth in wins, T-8th with a .918 SV% and ninth with a 2.30 GAA (min. 11 GP)...Ranks T-4th in the NHL with three shutouts this season.

Ryan Hartman: Currently at 698 career games played...Posted an assist and season-high plus-3 rating vs. DET (1/22)...Owns points in seven out of his last 10 games (5-3=8)...Ranks T-2nd on the Wild with three GWG and third with 14 goals this season.

Quinn Hughes: Currently has 394 career assists...Owns an active five-game point streak (1-8=9)...Ranks first among NHL defenseman with 21 PPP (2-19=21), T-1st with 44 assists (T-6th among all skaters) and fifth in scoring (4-44=48) this season...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:46 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (23:04) and power-play TOI/G (4:35) this season...Tallied three assists vs. DET (1/22) to mark his fourth game with three-plus helpers with the Wild, tied with Kirill Kaprizov (4x in 2021-22) for the single-season franchise record...Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 23 assists and third among NHL defensemen (T-13th among all skaters) with 25 points (2-23=25).

Kirill Kaprizov: Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games...Has multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12), marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history...Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22)...Extended his franchise record with his 13th career OTG vs. DET (1/22), tied for most in the NHL since he debuted in 2020-21...Since Dec. 14, ranks fourth in the NHL with 30 points (10-20=30) and T-6th with 20 assists...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 11 PPG, fourth with 190 shots, T-4th with 28 goals and T-6th with 64 points (28-36=64)...Ranks first on Wild in assists, points, PPG and shots and T-1st in goals.

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 261 hits, the fifth-highest single-season total in franchise history and the third-highest total in the NHL through 53 games since the 2005-06 season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and T-5th with a .914 SV%...Is 6-2-3 with a 2.34 GAA, .921 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.

Mats Zuccarello: Currently at 495 career assists...Owns an active five-game point streak (3-6=9)...Posted three points (2-1=3) vs. DET (1/22), reaching 111 goals in a Wild sweater and tying Ryan Hartman and Eric Staal for 10th in franchise history.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster in June.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks T-1st in the NHL with seven shutouts this season, one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (eight SO, five occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks third in the NHL with 2.54 goals against/game since November 1.

- Ranks T-4th in the NHL with a 84.6 penalty-kill percentage on the road this season (52-for-62).
- Did not allowed a PPG in nine consecutive games (23-for-23) from 11/19 - 12/6, tied for the longest overall streak in the NHL this season (also UTA, 10/28 - 11/17). The nine-game streak without allowing a PPG was tied for the fourth-longest run in franchise history. The full streak ended after 24 consecutive kills (11/19 - 12/8) when Seattle scored a second-period PPG.
- Is allowing 2.55 opponent power-play opportunities per game this season, the second-best mark in the NHL.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks T-6th in the NHL by allowing 0.75 first-period goals per game and seventh with a plus-10 goal differential in the opening frame this season.
- Ranks fifth the NHL by allowing 0.87 second-period goals per game this season and T-7th with a plus-7 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks T-3rd in the NHL by allowing 0.85 goals per game in the third period and sixth with a plus-11 goal differential in the final frame.
- Ranks second in NHL with 20 extra-time games played and T-3rd with 10 extra-time victories (seven OTW, three SOW) this season.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 32 games this season, second most in the NHL.
- Owns a 22-4-6 record (.781) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 678-180-112 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

- Minnesota ranks fifth in the NHL with 3.71 goals scored per game since Dec. 14.

- Since Dec. 14, the Wild ranks fourth in the NHL with 30.3 shots on goal per game and seventh with 62.1 shot attempts per game.
- Since Dec. 14, Minnesota ranks seventh in the NHL with a 27.9 PP% (19/68).

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 29-14-10, ranks T-4th in the NHL with 68 points, the third-highest point total through a season's first 53 games in franchise history.
- Is 26-8-7 (.720) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in points (59) and third in wins.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks second in the NHL in team SV% (.914), and third in goal differential (plus-33) and team GAA (2.49).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 16 game streak).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 10-3-2 (.733) in December, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in points (22) and T-4th in wins.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Extended his franchise record with his 13th career OTG vs. DET (1/22), tied for most in the NHL since he debuted in 2020-21.
- Since Dec. 14, ranks fourth in the NHL with 30 points (10-20=30) and T-6th with 20 assists.
- For the season, rank T-3rd in the NHL with 11 PPG, fourth with 190 shots, T-4th with 28 goals and T-6th with 64 points (28-36=64). Ranks first on Wild in assists, points, PPG and shots and T-1st in goals.
- Has surpassed the 60-point plateau for the fourth season in his career, tying Marian Gaborik for most in franchise history.
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Tallied an assist at VGK (12/29), reaching 225 career assists and passing Mikael Granlund (224) for sixth in franchise history
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28) to reach 201 career goals and move past Zach Parise (199 goals) for third in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 153).
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov has multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12), marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.
- Recorded a seven-game point streak (7-2=9) from 11/16 - 11/29.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

A QUINN-TESSANTIAL ADDITION

- **Quinn Hughes** currently has 394 career assists.
- Owns an active five-game point streak (1-8=9).
- Ranks first among NHL defenseman with 21 PPP (2-19=21), T-1st with 44 assists (T-6th among all skaters) and fifth in scoring (4-44=48) this season.
- Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:46 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (23:04) and power-play TOI/G (4:35) this season.
- Tallied three assists vs. DET (1/22) to mark his fourth game with three-plus helpers with the Wild, tied with Kirill Kaprizov (4x in 2021-22) for the single-season franchise record.
- Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 23 assists and third among NHL defensemen (T-13th among all skaters) with 25 points (2-23=25).
- Tallied 22 assists in his first 20 games with Minnesota, the second most by a defenseman through first 20 games with a franchise in NHL history, (Paul Coffey, 24 w/ PIT).
- Became the second player in NHL history with four three-assist games through his first 20 games with a franchise. (Dan Daoust, 4 GP w/ TOR).
- With two assists at TOR (1/19), became the fastest player in Wild history to reach 20 points with the club, doing so in his 18th game.
- Overall, owns seven three-assist outings this season, doing so for the second time in his career (also 9 in 2023-24). Is one of four defensemen in NHL history to reach the mark in multiple campaigns, alongside Paul Coffey (6x), Bobby Orr (5x) and Ray Bourque (3x).
- Is one of two defensemen since 1995-96 to record seven three-assist outings in a single season (also 9 in 2023-24). The others: Roman Josi (8 in 2021-22).
- Finished with four assists (0-4=4) at ANA (1/2) to set the Wild's single-game franchise record for assists by a defenseman and tie Matt Dumba (1-3=4, 3/29/18 vs. DAL) for single-game franchise point record among defensemen.
- Notched fourth career four-assist game at ANA (1/2), one point shy of his single-game career point record (1-4=5, 11/2/23 at SJS).
- Per NHL Stats, tied Phil Housley for the fourth-most four-assist games by an American defenseman in NHL history. Gary Suter (8), Chris Chelios (6) and Brian Leetch (6) are the only ones with more.
- Owns 30 career games with three-plus assists, ninth-most all-time among NHL defensemen.
- Skated a career-high 32:02 of TOI at CBJ (12/18), the second highest TOI total in an NHL game this season.
- Posted an assist vs. WSH (12/16) to become the second defenseman in Wild history to register a point in each of his first two games with the franchise (also C. Barker in 09-10).
- Made his Wild debut vs. BOS (12/14), becoming the 32nd player and sixth defenseman to score a goal (1-0=1) in their first game with the franchise.
- Since making his NHL debut on March 28, 2019 vs. Los Angeles, leads all NHL defensemen in assists and second in points and power-play points.
- Represented Vancouver at two NHL All-Star Games (2020, 2024).
- Awarded the James Norris Memorial Trophy following the 2023-24 season after leading NHL defensemen with 75 assists and 92 points (17-75=92) in 82 games.
- In 2023-24, set Vancouver single-season franchise records in both points and assists by a defenseman, ahead of marks he set during the 2022-23 season (7-69=76 in 78 GP).

- **Matt Boldy** scored his third SHG of the season vs. FLA (1/24), T-3rd most in the NHL.
- For the season, ranks T-4th in the NHL in goals (28). Ranks first on Wild in goals, second in points (28-25=53) and assists, and T-2nd in GWG (three).
- Currently at 297 career points (129-166=295) in 334 games, the second-highest total in franchise history by a player 24 years or younger. Marian Gaborik leads the list with 299 points (150-149=299).
- Had played in 203 consecutive regular-season games dating back to 11/2/23, the 20th-longest active streak in the NHL and sixth-longest run in franchise history, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve on Jan. 16.
- Reached 50 points (27-23=50) for the season with a PPG vs. NYI (1/10), becoming the third player in Wild history with at least four consecutive 50-point seasons (Kaprizov, 6x from 20-21 - 25-26; Zuccarello, 4x from 21-22 to 24-25).

- Scored the GWG in overtime at BUF (1/17), his second OTG in his last six games (also at SEA, 1/8).

- Since Nov. 7, ranks fifth among NHL defensemen with a plus-24 rating.
- For the season, ranks T-7th among NHL defensemen in goals (11) and fourth among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:06), ninth in TOI/G (24:48) and 11th in blocked shots (111).

FEELING THE MOJO

- **Marcus Johansson** scored a goal vs. WPG (1/16) to push his career total to 198 goals.
- Leads the team with a plus-17 rating and ranks third in points (13-21=34).
- Tied his single-game career high with four points (1-3=4) at VGK (12/29) while posting a career-high plus-4 rating.
- Recorded a career-long, nine-game point streak (5-6=11) from 10/25 - 11/9, tied for the fifth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Played in his 1,000th NHL game vs. CGY (11/9), becoming the 20th Swedish-born player to reach the milestone and 412th player overall.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** owns 309 career assists, five shy of tying Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.
- Notched two points (1-1=2) at LAK (1/5) to record his 77th career multi-point game, more than any other defenseman in franchise history and two shy of tying Matt Boldy and Zach Parise (79 MPG) for fifth among all skaters.
- Posted two points (1-1=2) and blocked a season-high six shots at VGK (12/29). He reached 120 career goals, passing Andrew Brunnette (119) for eighth in franchise history.
- With a PPG vs. BOS (12/14), reached 136 career PPP (36-100=136) and tied Brunnette (55-81=136) for fifth in franchise history.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** stopped 26-of-28 shots faced at SEA (1/8) to improve to 12-2-4 on the season and tie Darcy Kuemper (2013-14) and Kaapo Kahkonen (2021-22) for the second most wins in a season by a Wild rookie goaltender. Kahkonen also tops the list with 16 in 2020-21.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and T-5th with a .914 SV%.
- Is 6-2-3 with a 2.34 GAA, .921 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.
- Posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21).
- He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender.
- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Went 7-0-0 from in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.
- Became the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21).
- Set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2) from 10/13 - 12/2, besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09).
- Wallstedt's 10-game point streak from 10/13 - 12/2 is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history.
- Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old).
- Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.
- Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie.
- Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.
- Posted his second consecutive shutout with a 28-save performance vs. ANA (11/15), becoming the first rookie and youngest goaltender in team history to record consecutive shutouts.
- Notched his first shutout of the season vs. CGY (11/9) with 36 saves.
- Now with five career shutouts, is the only Wild goaltender to earn four or more shutouts as a rookie.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** with a 30-save victory vs. DET (1/22), earned the 100th win of his NHL career.
- In 20 games (19 starts) since Nov. 16, is 13-2-4 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with two shutouts, sixth in wins, T-8th with a .918 SV% and ninth with a 2.30 GAA (min. 11 GP).
- Ranks T-4th in the NHL with three shutouts this season.
- Played in his 200th career NHL game at TOR (1/19).
- Recorded an assist at BUF (1/17) to push his career point total to five (1-4=5).
- Is 7-2-0 with a 2.34 GAA, a .913 SV% and one shutout in his last nine road games.
- Recorded an eight-game point streak (7-0-1) from Dec. 8 - Jan 2.
- Posted his third shutout of the season vs. WSH (12/16) and 14th of his career, one shy of tying Dwayne Roloson (15 SO) for third in franchise history.

- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 90-55-23 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-4th in the NHL during that span with 14 shutouts and a .913 SV% (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** owns 17 points (8-9=17) in his last 18 games played.
- Finished with two assists (0-2=2) at ANA (1/2/26) for his ninth multi-point game this season.
- Posted two points (1-1=2) and a career-high plus-4 rating at VGK (12/29).
- Tallied a six-game point streak (4-6=10) from 12/8 - 12/18, T-3rd longest of his career.
