FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 21, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] vs. CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS [4]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames finished off a five-game homestand on Saturday afternoon by welcoming the Chicago Blackhawks to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Calgary would open the scoring just past the midway point of the first with Jonathan Huberdeau being sprung on a shorthanded breakaway and sliding home his 13th to give the Flames the lead. Nazem Kadri would double the home side's advantage just over a minute later and Calgary headed into the first intermission up 2-0. The Flames offence would erupt in the second, with Connor Zary, Matt Coronato, and Blake Coleman all finding the back of the net to counter a Connor Bedard goal to give Calgary a 5-1 lead through 40. Chicago would push in the third, but the Flames would hang on and head into the Christmas break with a 6-4 win.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of four meetings this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary went 2-1-0 in their three meeting with San Jose in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-3-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 8-6-2 against Western Conference opponents.

HUNGRY LIKE THE WOLF:

On December 21st against Chicago, Dustin Wolf recorded his 10th win of the season in just his 17th appearance. The only other Flames rookies to reach 10 wins in 17 games or fewer are Mike Vernon (15 GP in 1986-87) and Dan Vladar (17 GP in 2021-22). Wolf also extended his home point streak to seven games (6-0-1) and established the second-longest run by a Flames rookie goaltender behind only Rejean Lemelin (11-0-5 in 1980-81).

WEEGSY BABY:

With two assists in his last outing against Chicago, MacKenzie Weegar recorded his 100th point since joining the Flames in 2022-23. With 100 points in 197 games in a Flames sweater, Weegar has become the fourth defensement to reach the milestone with the franchise in under 200 games over the past 25 years, and joins Dion Phaneuf (162 GP), Dennis Wideman (174 GP) and Dougie Hamilton (178 GP).

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman recorded his 24th shorthanded point on December 21st against Chicago since making his NHL debut in 2016-17. Only five other players have recorded as many shorthanded points over that span: Brad Marchand, Jean-Gabriel Pageau, William Karlsson and Mika Zibanejad. Coleman has recorded 17 shorthanded goals since 2016-17, which is tied for the second-most among all skaters.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his goal on Dec. 21 against Chicago, Mikael Backlund tied Eric Vail for the 10th-most in Flames franchise history (206). With one more goal, Backlund can move into sole-possession of the 10th-most goals in Flames history and join Kent Nilsson as the second Swedish-born skater in the top 10.

FLAMES FIRSTS VERSUS SAN JOSE:

Several Flames skaters recorded NHL firsts against the San Jose Sharks.

Matt Coronato and Dustin Wolf both played in their first NHL game against the Sharks on April 12th, 2023 with Wolf turning aside 23 of the 24 shots he faced to record his first NHL win. Rasmus Andersson and Nazem Kadri also both played their first NHL games against the Sharks (Andersson: April 8, 2017 at SJS) (Kadri: February 8, 2010 vs. SJS). Brayden Pachal scored his first NHL goal against the San Jose Sharks on October 12, 2023.

INTERIM COACH:

Due to family reasons, on December 8th, Brad Larsen was granted an indefinite leave of absence from his duties as assistant coach with the Flames. Wranglers Head Coach Trent Cull will join the Flames as an assistant coach for the unforeseeable future. Cull is in his second season as bench boss with the Wranglers. Having coached in the AHL for 15 years, Cull was also an assistant coach with the Vancouver Canucks during the 2022-23 campaign.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary and San Jose's first meeting of 2023-24, Jonathan Huberdeau recorded his 700th NHL point with an assist. At the time, Huberdeau became the third skater to reach the 700-point plateau from the 2011 draft class, joining Nikita Kucherov and the late Johnny Gaudreau.

Rasmus Andersson recorded his 200th NHL point against the Sharks on April 18, 2024 and at the time, became the 11th active Swedish-born defenceman to reach the 200-point plateau, and sixth rearguard from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat.
