

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****December 5, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. ST. LOUIS BLUES [4] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the St. Louis Blues to the Scotiabank Saddledome for the first and only time this season on Thursday night. The Blues would net a pair in the first to go up 2-0, before Jakob Pelletier scored his first of the season to draw the Flames within one heading into the break. In the second, Matt Coronato would strike on the power play to level things at two's heading into the third. St. Louis would reclaim their lead six minutes into the final frame, but the Flames once again battled back with MacKenzie Weegar drawing the Flames even and forcing overtime. Colton Parayko would score for the Blues in the extra frame to help St. Louis knock off Calgary 4-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Stars. Calgary won two of their three meetings against Dallas in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-2-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 6-5-2 against Western Conference opponents.

QUICK HITS:

The Flames are coming off a meeting against St. Louis where they erased 2-0 and 3-2 deficits to earn a point on Thursday night. Jako Pelletier got the Flames on the board to score his first goal of the season, and first NHL goal since March 7th, 2024 in Tampa Bay. Jonathan Huberdeau registered a helper on the Flames third goal to give him assists in three-straight contests dating back to November 30th. The Saint-Jerome, QC native also skated in a season-high 25:03 of ice-time through 28 shifts on Thursday. Matt Coronato helped the Flames stay hot on the man advantage with his first powerplay goal and fourth powerplay point of the campaign. Since November 15th, the Flames have struck 10 times on the man-advantage with a 32.3% powerplay efficiency.

HOW SWEDE IT IS:

On Wednesday afternoon, Rasmus Andersson was named to Team Sweden for the Four Nations Faceoff in February. Andersson last represented Sweden in a major tournament at the 2014 IIHF U18 World Junior Championships, where he scored two goals and one assist for three points in seven games. So far this season, the Malmö, SWE native is fourth in points on the Flames with 15, and only five defenceman have scored more goals than Andersson's six in 2024-25.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Flames forward Blake Coleman is one of five Texas-born skaters in the NHL this season, and he gets set to play in his 24th game against his childhood team tonight. Coleman was born in Plano, TX just a 30-minute drive from Dallas, with seven goals and six assists for 13 points against the Stars throughout his career thus far. Last season, Coleman became just the fourth Texas-born NHLer to eclipse 200 NHL points when he reached the plateau on October 24th 2023, joining Brian Leetch, Seth Jones, and Tyler Myers.

KAMLOOPS KONNECTION:

Flames forward Connor Zary and Stars Centre Logan Stankoven both played their junior hockey with the WHL's Kamloops Blazers and were teammates for three seasons from 2018-19 to 2020-21. Zary captained the club during the 2020-21 campaign, followed by Stankoven taking over captain duties in 2021-22 after Zary made the jump to the American Hockey League. Stankoven would spend the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons as Blazers captain before also beginning his pro-hockey career with the AHL's Texas Stars in 2023-24. Tonight is slated to be the pair's first NHL meeting and the first time the two have been on the same ice since April 11th, 2021 while they were still teammates in Kamloops. On that night, Stankoven scored and Zary recorded four assists in a 4-3 Blazers win over the Victoria Royals.

CAPTAIN TIES:

The two captains of tonight's opponents Mikael Backlund and Jamie Benn were teammates on the Kelowna Rockets during the 2008-09 season. The Rockets would go on to win the WHL Championship that year in six games over the Calgary Hitmen and advance to the 2009 Memorial Cup, where they would fall in the finals to the Windsor Spitfires. The Rockets Head Coach that season was Flames Head Coach Ryan Huska.

HANLEY MAN:



Flames blueliner Joel Hanley skated in his 199th NHL game in Columbus on Nov. 29 and is just one game away from 200 in his NHL career. Hanley can become the 17th-active undrafted defenceman to reach 200 games in their NHL career. The Keswick, ON native made his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016 against Calgary as a member of the Montreal Canadiens, and has spent time with Montreal, Arizona, Dallas, and Calgary through his 199-previous NHL games.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Connor Zary made his NHL debut and scored his first NHL goal against the Dallas Stars in the clubs first meeting of last season on November 1st, 2023.

The Flames have gone 6-0-0 in their last six regular-season trips to American Airlines Center dating back to the 2019-20 season, outscoring the Stars 30-19 through those contests.
