Arizona would get one back in the second, but in the third, Yegor Sharangovich would score a pair to record his second-career hat trick as the Flames left Mullett Arena with a 6-2 victory.

# **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the third of four meetings this season between the Flames and Golden Knights. The two clubs have split the first two meetings, with the home team prevailing in overtime on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 5-4-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 12-11-2 against Western Conference opponents.

### **HISTORY FOR BACKLUND:**

Mikael Backlund skated in his 950<sup>th</sup> NHL game on Thursday night in Arizona which passed Mark Giordano for solepossession of the second-most games played in Flames franchise history, celebrating with a goal. Backlund's tally came just 20 seconds into the contest to give him four career opening minute goals. The Vasteras, SWE natives four opening minute goals are the seventh-most in franchise history, the only players with more are Eric Vail (7), Theo Fleury (7), Jarome Iginla (6), Colin Patterson (6), Joe Mullen (5) and Kent Nilsson (5). Backlund was the Flames first round pick in 2007 (24<sup>th</sup> overall) and skated in his first NHL game at the Scotiabank Saddledome on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2009 and has gone on to score 194 goals and 320 assists for 514 points over his time in Calgary.

### VERSUS VEGAS THIS SEASON:

The Calgary Flames opened a six-game homestand back on November 27<sup>th</sup> by welcoming the Vegas Golden Knights to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their first meeting. Calgary would find themselves trailing for the majority of the contest until A.J. Greer finally solved Adin Hill by finding a loose puck in the slot and depositing his then fourth on the season into the net to tie the game at ones. This contest would require overtime and in the dying embers of the extra frame, MacKenzie Weegar took a puck end-to-end a ripped home the game-winner as Calgary prevailed 2-1. In their second meeting, the Flames again found themselves trailing in the third, until Yegor Sharangovich tied the game with the Flames net empty and a minute left in regulation. Calgary would eventually fall in overtime, and the season-series is currently even with both teams sharing a 1-0-1 record.

### THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman scored and registered two helpers in Thursday's 6-2 drubbing of the Arizona Coyotes. With the goal, Coleman has 18 on the campaign, matching his total from last season in 82 games, and putting him just four goals short of matching his single season high of 24 goals which he set in 2018-19. Coleman also has 17 assists for 35 points, which is just three points away from matching his single season high of 38 which he set last year. The Plano, TX native has five points (3G, 2A) over his last two games.

### **BREAD MAN:**

With his goal on Sunday afternoon in Chicago, Andrew Mangiapane now has 199 career-points and is just one away from 200. Mangiapane is looking to become the 11<sup>th</sup> active skater drafted in the sixth-round to reach the 200-point plateau and has 103 goals along with 96 assists so far in his NHL career.

#### WEEGAR'S MAGIC:

In their first meeting, MacKenzie Weegar netted the overtime winner with just five seconds remaining in the frame. He joined TJ Brodie (4:58 on Feb. 16, 2015), Tommy Albelin (4:56 on Nov. 3, 1999) and Chris Butler (4:56 on Dec. 12, 2013) as the only defensemen in Flames franchise history to score with five seconds or less remaining in an overtime period. The goal was also the first overtime winner of his career, and Weegar has scored in both matchups against Vegas so far this season, and in his last three meetings against the Golden Knights.

#### ON THE FARM:

The American Hockey League announced on Wednesday afternoon that Flames prospects Matt Coronato and Dustin Wolf have been selected to represent the Pacific Division at the 2024 AHL All-Star Classic. Coronato is currently the fourth-highest scoring rookie in the AHL this season with 12 goals and 16 assists for 28 points and is second among rookies in points-per game at 1.08. Wolf is the reigning AHL MVP and will represent the Wranglers at the AHL All-Star Classic for the second-straight season. Wolf's .930 Sv% are second in the American Hockey League through his 22 games.

## RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson's first period marker on Thursday in Arizona held up as the game-winning goal, his third GWG of the season. Andersson's game-winner tied him with Josh Morrissey (7) and Dougie Hamilton (7) for the most among all defensemen since the beginning of 2022-23.

#### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

In their last meeting, Nazem Kadri scored his ninth career goal against the Vegas Golden Knights. Only seven players have more against the franchise.

Yegor Sharangovich's hat trick was the second of his career, and the first hat trick by a Flames skater since April 12, 2023 (Nikita Zadorov, 3G vs. SJS). Sharangovich also became the 67<sup>th</sup> Flames skater to record a hat trick.
