

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 9, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. WASHINGTON CAPITALS [7]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames erased a three-goal deficit with a strong second period push but ultimately fell 7–3 to the Washington Capitals on Monday night at Capital One Arena. Washington built a 3–0 lead in the opening period before Calgary responded late in the second with three quick goals from Matvei Gridin, Blake Coleman, and Yegor Sharangovich — the latter two coming shorthanded — to tie the game heading into the third. The Capitals regained the lead early in the final frame and quickly added another to pull away before sealing the game with two late tallies.

First, the Calgary Flames acquired forward Victor Olofsson, prospect centre Max Curran, a conditional 2028 first-round pick, and a conditional 2027 second-round pick from Colorado in exchange for centre Nazem Kadri and Calgary's 2027 fourth-round pick.

Olofsson, a native of Ornskoldsvik, SWE, has skated in 60 games for the Avalanche this season, netting 11 goals and adding 14 assists for 25 points. The 30-year-old winger is a veteran of 431 NHL games split between Buffalo, Vegas, Colorado, and Calgary amassing 236 points from 116 goals and 120 assists.

Prospect centre Max Curran is in his third WHL season, appearing in 31 games, scoring 14 goals and 27 assists for 41 points along with 23 penalty minutes for the Edmonton Oil Kings. He represented Czechia at the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship, helping his nation earn a silver medal while recording five points in seven tournament games.

Next, the Flames acquired centre Ryan Strome from Anaheim in exchange for a 2027 seventh-round pick. Strome, a native of Mississauga, ON, skated in 33 games for the Ducks this season prior to his acquisition, scoring three goals and six assists for nine points. The 32-year-old has 899 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 492 points from 170 goals and 322 assists, playing for the New York Islanders, Edmonton Oilers, New York Rangers, Anaheim Ducks and now the Calgary Flames.

Strome played four seasons of junior in the Ontario Hockey League, beginning in 2009-10 with the Barrie Colts before traded to the Niagara IceDogs where he would spend the remainder of his junior career. He captained Niagara in his final campaign with the club in 2012-13 while also representing Canada at the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship.

Finally, the Flames acquired forward Brennan Othmann from the New York Rangers in exchange for forward Jacob Battaglia. Othmann, a native of Scarborough, ON, has played in 17 games for the Rangers this season, scoring his first NHL goal. He has also played 26 games with their AHL affiliate Hartford Wolf Pack, netting eight goals and adding eight assists for 16 points and 49 penalty minutes. The 23-year-old winger and former first round pick has won two gold medals with Canada's World Junior Team in 2022 and 2023 and an OHL championship with Peterborough in 2023.

On Wednesday evening, the Calgary Flames acquired defenceman Olli Määttä, prospect centre Jonathan Castagna and three 2026 second-round picks from Utah in exchange for defenceman MacKenzie Weegar. Määttä, a native of Jyväskylä, FIN, played 22 games for the Mammoth this season. The 31-year-old rearguard is a veteran with 785 games of NHL experience, having played for Pittsburgh, Chicago, Los Angeles, Detroit, Utah, and now Calgary. He has amassed 198 points from 42 goals and 156 assists and is a two-time Stanley Cup champion with the Pittsburgh Penguins in 2016 and 2017. He has also represented Finland at three best-on-best international events, including the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and is a two-time Olympic bronze medalist in 2014 and 2026.

Prospect centre Jonathan Castagna is in his third season at Cornell University, appearing in 29 contests, leading his team in scoring with 14 goals and 18 assists for 32 points along with 27 penalty minutes. In 2023-24, Jonathan helped Cornell win the ECAC Championship, was named ECAC Tournament MVP, and earned a spot on both the ECAC All-Rookie Team and the All-Ivy League Second Team. Last season, he helped Cornell repeat as ECAC Champions while being named to the ECAC All-Tournament Team.

## TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

### **THE TEXAS TIGER:**

Blake Coleman scored his 12<sup>th</sup> shorthanded goal as a Calgary Flame last night in Washington to tie Paul Ranheim for the sixth most in franchise history. Since he made his NHL debut on January 12, 2017, Coleman has recorded 23 shorthanded goals, the most among all skaters over that span.

### **STROME 900:**

Ryan Strome is closing in on his 900<sup>th</sup> NHL game, sitting one contests away from becoming the ninth skater from the 2011 draft class to reach 900 games played, with one of the other players on that list being Jonathan Huberdeau who did so with Calgary last season on March 22, 2025 against the New York Islanders. Strome made his NHL debut on December 14, 2013 as a member of the New York Islanders, with his first NHL goal coming 11 games into his NHL career on January 6 against Dallas. Through 899 games, the Mississauga, ON native has recorded 492 points, and is eight away from becoming the 15<sup>th</sup> player drafted in 2011 to reach the 500-point milestone.

Ryan Strome arrived in Calgary and made his Flames debut on Saturday night against Carolina, recording a goal and an assist to register his second multi-point game of the season (also: Dec. 7 vs. CHI). Strome finished the night a point short of matching the franchise record for points in a Flames debut, a feat has been achieved by six players and last done by Kristian Huselius (0-3—3 on Dec. 3, 2005).

### **KLAPKA 100:**

Flames forward Adam Klapka skated in his 99<sup>th</sup> NHL contest last night in Washington and is one away from reaching the 100-games plateau. Klapka was signed as a free agent by Calgary on May 16, 2022 from Bílí Tygři Liberec in the Czechia first division (Tipsport Extraliga) and began his time in the Flames organization with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers in 2022-23. He would play 158 American Hockey League contests with the Wranglers between 2022-23 and 2024-25, posting 48 goals which rank as the second-most in Wranglers franchise history behind only Rory Kerins (67).

His NHL debut would come on January 20, 2024 against the Edmonton Oilers, and would go on to play six games for the Flames in 2023-24, scoring his first NHL goal on April 18, 2024 against San Jose. Over his NHL career, Klapka has 12 goals and 12 assists for 24 points through his first 99 games and is one appearance away from becoming the 14<sup>th</sup> undrafted skater from Czechia in league history to play 100 games.

### **MAGIC NUMBER:**

With their five-goal outburst against Carolina on Saturday night, the Calgary Flames have now won 51-straight games when scoring four or more goals in a contest, dating back to December 16, 2023. This season, Calgary is 14-0-0 when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game.



### **FUTURE WATCH:**

On Tuesday afternoon Flames 2025 first-round pick Cole Reschny was selected to the NCHC 2025-26 All-Rookie Team. In his first collegiate season with the University of North Dakota, Reschny leads all NCHC freshmen with 33 points from five goals and 28 assists, also NCHC freshmen high, in 32 games. The Macklin, SK native has excelled in the faceoff dot, ranking third among NCHC rookies with 265 faceoff wins, while his 54.3-win-percentage is second among freshman centers. He was twice named NCHC Forward of the Week and once Rookie of the Week in 2025-26 and tops all NCHC rookies with a +13 plus/minus on the year. Reschny was selected 18<sup>th</sup> overall by the Flames at the 2025 NHL Draft.

### **BACK-TO-BACKS:**

The Calgary Flames are prepared to wrap up their eighth back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season tonight in New York following last night's setback in Washington. Calgary's last back-to-back set saw them close out February at Crypto.com Arena against the Kings on February 28, before travelling to Anaheim to kick off their busy March schedule against the Ducks the following night. The Flames have one more back-to-back set remaining this season, with their final one coming on April 11 when they close out a six-game road trip against the Seattle Kraken at Climate Pledge Arena before coming flying home to host the Utah Mammoth on April 12. Calgary began their 2025-26 season with a back-to-back set and played four of their first five contests on the campaign in back-to-back scenarios.

### **LOOK BACKS AT IT:**

Mikael Backlund enters play tonight with 599-career points, sitting one shy of becoming the 26<sup>th</sup> skater of Swedish descent in NHL history to reach 600 points. He also can become the sixth player in Flames franchise history to record 600 points with the club:

Backlund's 228 career goals sit one shy of tying Kent Nilsson (229) for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history. With one more tally, he would also tie Nilsson for the most goals by a Swedish-born player in Flames history, with the pair ranking as the only two Swedes to eclipse 200 goals with the club.

### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Ryan Strome's goal, assisted by Olli Määttä, on Saturday against Carolina is the first scoring play featuring two Flames making their debuts since Oct. 3, 2013 when David Jones scored with Sean Monahan recording an assist, a game in which Sean Monahan was also making his NHL debut.

The Calgary Flames earned a decisive 5–1 win over the New York Rangers in their first meeting on October 26 at the Scotiabank Saddledome. Nazem Kadri opened the scoring just 1:42 into the game before Kevin Bahl made it 2–0 midway through the first, with New York’s Noah Laba responding seconds later. Yegor Sharangovich restored the Flames two-goal lead in the second period, and Blake Coleman sealed the victory in the third with a pair of goals — including a short-handed empty-netter — as Calgary pulled away. Dustin Wolf stood tall in between the pipes, stopping 30 of 31 shots he faced to post a .968 save percentage on the night, and Mikael Backlund (2A) registered multi-assist night, setting up both of Coleman’s third-period markers.
