OTTAWA SENATORS

All-Time Wild Record: 16-12-5 (9-6-2 at Grand Casino Arena, 7-6-3 at Ottawa)

2024-25: Minnesota went 0-2-0 against the Senators...Ottawa won the series-opening game, 3-1, in Saint Paul (11/29) and won the second game 6-0 in Ottawa (2/1)...C Freddy Gaudreau (0-1=1) scored the Wild's lone goal, assisted by D Declan Chisholm (0-1=1) and LW **Marcus Foligno** (0-1=1)...G **Filip Gustavsson** went 0-2-0 with a 4.05 GAA and a .909 SV%...D **Jake Sanderson** led Ottawa with five points (1-4=5)...RW **Drake Batherson** had four points (1-3=4)...C **Tim Stuetzle** (1-2=3) and LW **Brady Tkachuk** (1-2=3) had three points each...G **Leevi Merilainen** went 2-0-0 with a 0.50 GAA, a .979 SV% and one shutout.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Mats Zuccarello** leads Minnesota with 18 points (7-11=18) in 22 career matches vs. Ottawa...RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** has 16 points (11-5=16) in 21 games...LW **Marcus Johansson** (5-6=11 in 34 games) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (5-6=11 in 20 games) have 11 points each.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 1-2-1 with a 2.71 GAA and a .925 SV% in four career starts vs. the Senators...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced Ottawa.

SENATORS LEADERS: LW **David Perron** leads Ottawa with 40 points (17-23=40) in 50 career games against Minnesota...RW **Claude Giroux** has 15 points (6-9=15) in 23 games...C **Nick Cousins** (3-7=10 in 18 games) and Batherson (3-7=10 in 18 games) have 10 points each.

SENATORS GOALIES: G **Linus Ullmark** is 5-2-1 with a 2.83 GAA and a .912 SV% in eight starts against Minnesota...Merilainen is 2-0-0 with a 0.50 GAA, a .979 SV% and one shutout in two starts against the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Gustavsson went 10-13-3 with a 3.12 GAA and a .905 SV% in 27 games across two seasons with Ottawa (2020-22)...Tarasenko collected 41 points (17-24=41) and four GWG in 57 games with Ottawa in 2023-24...Wild Associate Coach **Jack Capuano** spent five seasons as Associate Coach for Ottawa (2019-24)...Wild Player Development Coach **Derek Stepan** recorded six points (1-5=6) in 20 games with Ottawa in 2020-21...D **Nick Jensen** is from Rogers and played three seasons at St. Cloud State University (2010-13)...Ottawa assistant coach **Mike Yeo** spent five seasons (2011-16) as Head Coach for Minnesota, with a record of 173-132-44, and led Minnesota to three Stanley Cup Playoff appearances (2013, 2014, 2015).

FAST FACTS: The Wild has won eight of its last 10 meetings at Grand Casino Arena (8-2-0) and five of its last eight games in Ottawa (5-2-1)...Minnesota has earned points in 13 of its last 16 contests against Ottawa (12-3-1) dating back to Nov. 13, 2016.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Owns an active 10-game home point streak (8-0-2) since Nov. 1, tied for the second-longest streak in the NHL this season and tied for the fifth-longest run in franchise history...Is 14-3-2 (.789) since Nov. 1, ranking third in the NHL in points (30) and wins...Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team GAA (1.80) and team SV% (.937) and ranks fifth with a plus-21 goal differential...Has killed 43-of-48 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks T-2nd the NHL with a 89.6 PK% in that span...Has scored first in 19 games this season, T-4th in the NHL...Leads the NHL with six shutouts.

Matt Boldy: Posted three points (1-2=3) vs. DAL (12/11) and reached 119 career goals, tying Andrew Brunette for seventh on the Wild's all-time goal list...Owns an active three-game point streak (2-4=6)...Since Nov. 6, owns 12 goals (T-5th in the NHL) and 22 points (12-10=22, T-14th in NHL) in 17 games...For the season, leads Wild in points (17-18=35) and assists and ranks second in goals...Ranks T-9th in the NHL in goals and PPP (5-8=13) and T-11th in shots (103).

Zeev Buium: Owns eight power-play points (2-6=8) this season, T-2nd among NHL rookies and T-11th among NHL defensemen...Ranks fifth among NHL rookies with an 18:27 TOI/G average, T-5th with 11 assists and T-7th with 14 points (3-11=14).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns five points (2-3=5) in his last two games...Notched season highs with three points (1-2=3) and a plus-3 rating at SEA (12/8)...Currently at 320 career points (142-178=320), one shy of tying Andrew Brunette (321) for ninth in franchise history...Ranks second in the NHL in total faceoffs taken (660) and third in faceoffs won (337).

Filip Gustavsson: Is 5-1-1 in his last seven starts since 11/16, posting a 1.82 GAA, .930 SV% and one shutout...Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history...T-3rd in the NHL with two shutouts this season.

Brock Faber: Since 10/26, ranks T-5th among NHL defensemen in goals.

Marcus Johansson: Has three goals (3-0=3) in his last two games...Ranks T-4th in the NHL with four GWG this season...Leads the team with a plus-14 rating and ranks third in points (11-12=23) and goals.

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranks T-5th in the NHL with seven PPG, T-6th with 18 goals and T-11th in shots (103)...Leads the Wild in goals and ranks second in points (18-16=34)...Owns 69 career PPG, tied with Zach Parise for the franchise record...Currently at 420 career points (203-217=420), two shy of tying Jared Spurgeon (118-304=422) for third in franchise history...Currently at 203 career goals, two shy of tying Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history...Ranks third in franchise history with 143 power-play points (69-74=143), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).

Yakov Trenin: Posted a season-high nine hits at SEA (12/8), the second-highest total of his career and T-7th highest total in the NHL this season...Leads the NHL with 148 hits.

Jesper Wallstedt: Leads the NHL with a 1.95 GAA, .936 SV% and four shutouts this season...Owns shutouts in four out of his last seven games...Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38)...Went 7-0-0 in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games...Became the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21)...Set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2) from 10/13 - 12/2, besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09)...Wallstedt's 10-game point streak from 10/13 - 12/2 is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history...Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old)...Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK

- The Wild is 3-3-0 this season when playing in the first game of a back-to-back, and 2-1-3 when playing in the second game of a back-to-back.
- Minnesota played back-to-back home games for the 27th time in franchise history when it hosted Colorado (11/28) and Buffalo (11/29). When playing back-to-back home games, the Wild holds a 18-7-2 all-time record in the first contest and a 16-4-7 all-time record in the second contest.
- The Wild holds an 134-146-54 all-time record (.482) all-time when playing the second game of a back-to-back set. Since the 2006-07 season, Minnesota is 120-100-41 (.538) in the second game of back-to-backs.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- Leads NHL with six shutouts this season.
- Leads the NHL with 1.84 goals against/game and 35 goals allowed since November 1.

- Has killed 43-of-48 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with a 89.6 PK% in that span.
- Did not allowed a PPG in nine consecutive games (23-for-23) since 11/19, tied for the longest overall streak in the NHL this season (also UTA, 10/28 - 11/17). The nine-game streak without allowing a PPG was tied for the fourth-longest run in franchise history.
- The full streak ended after 24 consecutive kills (11/19 - 12/8) when Seattle scored a second-period PPG.
- Minnesota hasn't allowed a PPG in 15 out of 19 games played since Nov. 1.
- Is allowing 2.35 opponent power-play opportunities per game this season, first in the NHL.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 19 games this season, T-4th in the NHL.
- Owns a 13-3-3 record (.763) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 669-179-109 all-time record (.756) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

HEATING UP

- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Is 14-3-2 (.789) since Nov. 1, ranking third in the NHL in points (30) and wins.
- Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team GAA (1.80) and team SV% (.937) and ranks fifth with a plus-21 goal differential.
- Posted a seven-game win streak from 11/15 - 11/28/25, tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history and the team's longest since an eight-game run from 11/24 - 12/9/21.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

SETTLING IN FOR THE SECOND

- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 22 second-period goals allowed this season and is T-7th with a plus-six goal differential in the middle frame.
- Minnesota's .931 team save percentage in the second period ranks second in the NHL this season.
- The Wild has held opponents scoreless in 16 of 31 second periods this season.

IN EXTRA TIME

- Ranks T-5th in NHL with six extra-time victories (three OTW, three SOW).
- Since losing three out of four extra-time games to start the season, has won five out of seven extra-time games.
- T-3rd in NHL with three SOW this season.

- Leads the Wild in goals and ranks second in points (18-16=34).

- Currently at 420 career points (203-217=420), two shy of tying Jared Spurgeon (118-304=422) for third in franchise history.

- Ranks third in franchise history with 143 power-play points (69-74=143), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28) to reach 201 career goals and move past Zach Parise (199 goals) for third in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).

- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Currently at 217 career assists, needs one assist to tie Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history.
- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).

- Kaprizov recorded a seven-game point streak (7-2=9) from 11/16 - 11/29.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history.
- Is 5-1-1 in his last seven starts since 11/16, posting a 1.82 GAA, .930 SV% and one shutout.
- T-3rd in the NHL with two shutouts this season.
- Stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Went 5-1-2 with a 2.06 GAA and .923 SV% in November.
