DUCKS PROSPECTS TO PARTICIPATE IN 2024 NCAA HOCKEY TOURNAMENT

The Anaheim Ducks will have three prospects participate in the 2024 NCAA Hockey Tournament beginning today, Thursday, March 28. Forward **Cutter Gauthier** (Boston College, No. 1 overall seed), right wing **Sam Colangelo** (Western Michigan) and center **Kyle Kukkonen** (Michigan Tech) will represent their respective schools in the tournament.

Cutter Gauthier (acquired from Philadelphia Jan. 8; Philadelphia, fifth overall in 2022) leads the NCAA in goals (35) and is tied for second in points (35-24=59) in 37 games at Boston College (Hockey East). His 35 goals are tied for the most by an NCAA player in a single season since 2015-16 (Kyle Connor: 35). The 35 goals also tie for the most by a freshman or sophomore (with Connor) in 25 years (1999-2000). It is also the seventh most by any skater in an NCAA season in that same 25-year span. He also leads the NCAA in goals dating to the start of last season, scoring 51 goals in 69 career NCAA games (51-45=96 points).

Sam Colangelo (Anaheim second round, 36th overall in 2020) is tied for eighth among NCAA leaders in goals (23), setting new single-season career highs in goals, points (23-19=42), assists and plus/minus (+20) this season. He scored a hat trick March 16 to help the Broncos win Game 2 in the first round of NCHC Tournament. Among Broncos team leaders, Colangelo co-leads in goals, and ranks third in scoring and plus/minus. Colangelo has scored 44-52=96 points with a +21 rating in 109 career NCAA games in four seasons at Western Michigan (2023-24) and Northeastern (2020-23).

Kyle Kukkonen (Anaheim sixth round, 162nd overall in 2021) has posted 1-11=12 points in 26 games this season as a sophomore. In 2022-23 as a freshman, Kukkonen was named the CCHA Rookie of the Year after recording 18-9=27 points in 39 games. He scored the most goals by a Huskies freshman since 1988 while he led CCHA freshmen in goals and all conference skaters in game-winning goals (4).

EIGHT DUCKS PROSPECTS ADVANCE TO THE CANADIAN HOCKEY LEAGUE PLAYOFFS

The Ducks also have eight prospects that have advanced to the Canadian Hockey League (CHL) playoffs beginning today, Thursday March 28. Forward Yegor Sidorov (Saskatoon Blades), defenseman Rodwin Dionicio (Saginaw Spirit), forward Connor Hvidston (Swift Current Broncos), forward Coulson Pitre (Flint Firebirds), center Carey Terrance (Erie Otters), defenseman Konnor Smith (Owen Sound Attack), defenseman Vojtech Port (Moose Jaw Warriors) and defenseman Noah Warren (Victoriaville Tigres).

Yegor Sidorov (Anaheim third round, 85th overall in 2023) ranked fourth in goals (50) among all WHL skaters and became the first Blades skater to reach 50 goals in a season since 1995-96. He is also one of eight WHL players in the last five seasons to score 50 goals. He led Saskatoon in goals and ranked second in scoring (50-38=88) while averaging over a point-per-game (1.33).

Rodwin Dionicio (Anaheim fifth round, 129th overall in 2023) ranked second in goals (24) and third in points (25-48=73) among OHL defensemen this season. He became one of nine OHL defensemen in the last 10 years to reach 25 goals in a single season. He averaged over a point-per-game (1.22) split between Saginaw and Windsor this season while ranking fourth among Saginaw leaders in scoring and fifth in goals.

Connor Hvidston (Anaheim fifth round, 139th overall in 2022) recorded a new career-high in goals (27) and averaged over a point-per-game this season (1.11). He ranked tied for second among Swift Current leaders in goals and fifth in scoring (27-32=59).

Coulson Pitre (Anaheim third round, 65th overall in 2023) recorded a new career-high in goals (27) and averaged a point-per-game this season. He ranked second among Flint leaders in shorthanded goals (3), third in goals and scoring (27-28=55) and fifth in assists.

Carey Terrance (Anaheim second round, 59th overall in 2023) set a new career-high in points (29-23=52) and assists this season. He led the Erie Otters in goals and shorthanded goals while ranking fourth among team leaders in scoring.

Konnor Smith (Anaheim fourth round, 97th overall in 2023) set new career-highs in goals (9) and scoring (9-8=17) split between Owen Sound and the Petersborough Petes this season. He co-led Owen blueliners in goals and ranked fourth among team defensemen in scoring.

Vojtech Port (Anaheim sixth round, 161st overall in 2023) recorded 4-11=15 points through 42 games split between Moose Jaw and the Edmonton Oil Kings, despite missing 26 games due to an upper-body injury.

Noah Warren (Anaheim second round, 42nd overall in 2022) recorded 6-7=13 points in 50 games this season. He ranked second among team defensemen with a +13 rating, third in goals and fifth in assists and scoring.

GLEN GAWDIN recorded his third career hat trick (3-0=3) Mar. 24 vs. Calgary, the 12th hat trick in Gulls history. He reached the 20-goal mark for the first time in his career (21) and tallied his second shorthanded goal of the season. He has 9-16=25 points through his last 19 games. Gawdin continues to lead San Diego in goals while ranking second in scoring (21-28=49) and third in assists.

TOMAS SUCHANEK ranks fourth among AHL rookie goaltenders in SV% (.914) and eighth in GAA (2.73). He has helped San Diego earn points in 15 of his last 23 appearances overall.

CHASE DE LEO leads the Gulls in points-per-game (0.95) while ranking third among San Diego leaders in scoring (13-27=40), fourth in assists and fifth in goals. He eclipsed the 40-point plateau for the fourth time in his career and has 2-7=9 points through his last six games.

ANDREW AGOZZINO eclipsed the 50-point plateau (17-33=50) for the sixth time in his career and continues to lead San Diego in scoring and assists, while ranking second in goals and has 4-5=9 points through his last nine games.

TREVOR CARRICK leads San Diego blueliners in scoring (7-31=38), goals and assists while ranking second among team leaders in assists and fourth in points. He has three assists (0-3=3) through his last three games and 1-5=6 points through his last five games.

ROBERT HAGG recorded his third goal of the season, Mar. 27 vs. Bakersfield. He now has 2-6=8 points through his last 10 games.

SASHA PASTUJOV tallied his seventh goal of the season Mar. 27 vs. Bakersfield giving him points in back-to-back contests (1-1=2).

NIKITA NESTERENKO leads Gulls rookies in goals (15) while ranking tied fourth among team leaders and has two assists through his last two games (0-2=2).

He was second among Sweden's second division in wins (25-8-0) and GAA (2.23), posting four shutouts with a .913 SV%. Clara is the youngest-ever goaltender to win 25 games, posting the fourth-most wins ever by a goalie 21-and-under. Clara has won each of his first three postseason games (3-0), posting a 1.00 GAA and .955 SV%.
