

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 27, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. DALLAS STARS [5]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

Calgary welcomed Dallas to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Thursday for their third and final meeting with the Stars. The opening period would see the clubs combine for 24 shots, but Dallas would record the only marker of the first to give the visitors a 1-0 lead through 20. Nazem Kadri would stay hot and roof his 29th of the campaign eight minutes into the second to level things at one's. However, Dallas would score a pair in the back half of the middle frame and take a 3-1 lead into the second intermission. Kadri would strike again just 16 seconds into the third to give the Flames life, but that is as close as the Flames would come and ultimately fell 5-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final installment of the Battle of Alberta this season. Calgary and Edmonton have split their two previous meetings, with the road team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 11-4-3 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 19-15-5 against Western Conference opponents.

2024-25 BATTLE OF ALBERTA:

This will be the final edition of the Battle of Alberta in 2024-25, with the clubs splitting both previous meetings.

Game One (October 13th):

The Calgary Flames headed north to Edmonton for round one of the Battle of Alberta back on October 13th. Edmonton would score the only goal of the first with Jeff Skinner giving the Oilers a 1-0 lead through 20. In the second, Rasmus Andersson would draw the Flames level with a slick individual effort, and nothing could separate these clubs through 40. In the third, Anthony Mantha would elevate a backhand over the shoulder of Stuart Skinner and in to give the Flames their first lead of the night, before Justin Kirkland doubled the Flames advantage with his first NHL goal. Calgary would shut the door from there, Connor Zary added an empty netter, and the Flames took round one 4-1.

Game Two (November 3rd):

Matchup number two came at the Scotiabank Saddledome back on November 3rd. The visitors would open the scoring 20 seconds into the contest, before doubling their advantage midway through the opening frame to lead 2-0 through 20. Calgary would get one back in the middle stanza and trailed 2-1 through 40. Yegor Sharangovich brought the Flames back to level terms 4:28 into the third with his first of the season. Edmonton would reclaim the lead midway through the third and add an empty netter to knock off Calgary 4-2.

NAZ-HIM KADRI:

With a pair of goals on Thursday, Nazem Kadri recorded his second-consecutive multi-goal game and extended his goal streak to five games. He has become the 28th different player in Flames franchise history to register a five-game goal streak. Kadri has also now scored a team-leading 30 goals this season and reached the 30-goal plateau for the third time in his career and first since 2017-18. He scored 32 with Toronto in both 2017-18 and 2016-17. Since March 1st, Kadri has lit the lamp 10 times which is tied for second among all skaters in the league throughout the month, with only John Tavares (11) scoring more goals.

FROST 300:

Morgan Frost enters play with 299 career games played and is looking to skate in his 300th NHL game tonight in Edmonton. Frost was drafted in the first round (27th overall) by the Philadelphia Flyers following a four-year junior career with the OHL's Soo Greyhounds where he eclipsed the 100-point plateau twice and was named to the OHL's First All-Star Team twice. He would make his NHL debut on November 19th, 2019 and score in his first game against the Florida Panthers. He has recorded 52 goals and 91 assists in his 299 NHL games and is looking to become the 22nd skater from the 2017 NHL Draft to reach 300 NHL games.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

With his third period marker on Tuesday against the Kraken, Rasmus Andersson recorded his 10th goal of the season and now sits just one tally away from tying his career-high of 11 which he set during the 2022-23 campaign. Andersson's goal was also his 53rd in the regular season and playoffs combined for the Flames, which moves him past T.J. Brodie (52) and gives him the seventh-most by a blueliner in Flames franchise history (in the regular season + playoffs).



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

This will be the 266th installment of the Battle of Alberta, with the Flames holding a 131-110-25 record over their provincial rival. 100 of those games have been one-goal games or ties (82 wins, 18 ties) with Calgary owning 45 of the 82 wins. Jarome Iginla is the Flames all-time goals leader against the Oilers with 34 tallies, while Al MacInnis sets the mark for points with 89 in 75 games against Edmonton during his time in Calgary.

On Thursday against Dallas, the Flames set a franchise record for shot attempts in a game with 102. Calgary registered 87 of their shot attempts at 5-on-5, which is also a single-game franchise record.

Martin Pospisil was credited with six hits on Thursday against Dallas. Since March 1st, Pospisil has thrown a team-leading 55 hits, and has thrown five or more hits in eight games this month.
