

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****April 9, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. SAN JOSE SHARKS [2] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a three-game California road trip in San Jose on Tuesday night. The Sharks would score the only goal of the opening 20 with William Eklund giving the home side a 1-0 lead. San Jose would double their advantage 2:22 into the second, but a pair of goals from Rasmus Andersson and Nazem Kadri helped Calgary draw level through 40 minutes of play. In the third, the netminders stood tall, and this game required overtime. In the extra frame, San Jose's Mario Ferraro would be called for holding, and Calgary would capitalize on the man advantage with Andrei Kuzmenko netting the overtime winner and the Flames left the SAP Center with a 3-2 win.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Kings. Calgary has beaten LA in two of their three prior matchups, with the home team winning in all three outings.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 11-10-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 21-22-2 against Western Conference opponents.

### FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Los Angeles Kings to the Scotiabank Saddledome for the second time on March 30<sup>th</sup>. Nazem Kadri would open the scoring 4:45 into the game before LA tied things under a minute later. Martin Pospisil would score midway through the frame to give the Flames a 2-1 lead, and that is how this game looked through 20. Blake Coleman would net his 29<sup>th</sup> of the year in the second to give the Flames a two-goal cushion, but Anze Kopitar would get one back for the Kings to make it 3-2 through 40. MacKenzie Weegar would rifle home a powerplay marker midway through the third to help Calgary prevail 4-2.

### THE KUZMENK-SHOW:

Andrei Kuzmenko scored the overtime winner on Tuesday in San Jose to extend his point streak to six games, matching the longest in his career (also 6 GP in 2022-23). Over his six-game stretch that began on March 28<sup>th</sup>, Kuzmenko has recorded five goals and six assists for 11 points which is the fifth-most in the NHL over that span. The 28-year-old goal was his 10<sup>th</sup> since making his debut with the Flames on Feb. 6, which is tied with Yegor Sharangovich and Nazem Kadri for the most with the team in that span.

### COMEBACK KIDS:

After trailing 2-0 during Tuesday's contest in San Jose, the Flames rallied to complete their seventh multi-goal comeback win, which is tied for the second-most in the NHL. This season, the Flames have earned 17 comeback wins, with 10 third period come-from-behind efforts, only the New York Rangers (13), the Detroit Red Wings (12), and the Colorado Avalanche (11) have more third period rallies.

### WHOLE LOTTA BREAD:

Flames forward Andrew Mangiapane returned to the lineup in San Jose, skating in 15:26 of ice-time. In Calgary and Los Angeles' second meeting this season, Mangiapane skated in his 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game, celebrating with a goal. At the time, Mangiapane became the 13<sup>th</sup> active player selected in the sixth round to skate in their 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game, and the first sixth-round selection from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat.

### ON THE FARM:

On Wednesday morning, the Wranglers announced the re-assignment of defenceman Etienne Morin to the Calgary Wranglers following the conclusion of his season with the Moncton Wildcats with the Wranglers adding Morin to their roster on an ATO. The 2023 second-round pick recorded 12 goals and 37 assists for 49 points in 58 games in junior this season and added three helpers in four playoff outings. Morin will hope to make his pro-hockey debut in the Wranglers final four regular season games.



### HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Jonathan Huberdeau scored his 200<sup>th</sup> NHL goal against the LA Kings last season on November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

In these teams' first meeting, Blake Coleman became the first Flames player to score a shorthanded goal and power-play goal in the same game since Noah Hanifin on November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in Arizona.

Nazem Kadri is currently at 898 games played, just two away from reaching the 900-game mark.
