

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 28, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. FLORIDA PANTHERS [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames bounced back in Sunrise on Friday afternoon with a 5–3 victory over the Florida Panthers behind a three-point night from Nazem Kadri and a steady 37-save performance from Devin Cooley. The teams traded punches early with Evan Rodrigues and Sam Bennett putting Florida up 2–0 within three minutes, but the Flames responded quickly as Yan Kuznetsov buried his first NHL goal at the 5:35 mark before MacKenzie Weegar tied it at 10:41. Calgary took control in the second when Morgan Frost scored on the power play just 55 seconds into the frame and Kadri added marker late in the middle stanza to make it 4–2. Brad Marchand brought Florida within one midway through the third, but Joel Farabee sealed the win with an empty-netter in the final minute—his 100th-career goal—to cap a two-point outing. Rasmus Andersson continued his outstanding November with a pair of assists, while Mikael Backlund, Blake Coleman, Connor Zary, and Joel Farabee each added helpers. As a team, Calgary blocked 28 shots to protect the lead, with Yan Kuznetsov and MacKenzie Weegar leading the charge with four a piece.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Hurricanes. Calgary and fell to Carolina in both of their meetings in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-0-0 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 5-2-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

LIL KUZY VERT:

Yan Kuznetsov scored his first NHL goal on Friday afternoon in Florida to become the 19th defenceman drafted in 2020 (CGY: 2nd round – 50th overall) to score in the National Hockey League. He is the second player selected by the Flames in the 2020 NHL Draft to find the back of the net in the NHL, joining Connor Zary (CGY: 1st round – 24th overall) who has 29 goals through his 141-game career thus far.

A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE:

Flames forward Jonathan Huberdeau made his NHL debut against the Carolina Hurricanes on January 19, 2013, as a member of the Florida Panthers. Huberdeau scored his first NHL goal just 3:37 into his debut, beating Hurricanes goaltender Cam Ward with his first shot on goal in the NHL, coming on only his second big-league shift. At the time, the tally was the quickest goal in a Panthers debut in franchise history. He went on to add two assists for a three-point night and earned First Star honours. In his rookie season, Huberdeau posted six points (3G, 3A) in four games against the Hurricanes to lead the Panthers in scoring during Florida and Carolina's 2012-13 season-series.

Huberdeau has accumulated 794 points in his NHL career and is six shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (TBL: 2nd round – 58th overall) and Mark Scheifele (WPG: 1st round – 7th overall). There are 25 active skaters who have surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

100 JOAL'S:

Joel Farabee scored in the third period on Friday in Florida to record his 100th NHL goal. He has become the fourth member of the 2018 NHL Draft class to hit the 100-goal milestone, joining:

Brady Tkachuk (OTT: 1st round – 4th overall)
Andrei Svechnikov (CAR: 1st round – 2nd overall)
Yegor Sharangovich (NJD: 5th round – 141st overall)

The most recent player from the class to reach the century mark was teammate Yegor Sharangovich, who scored his 100th on Oct. 30 in Ottawa — a goal Farabee set up, recording the primary assist on the tally.

THE BEAN COUNTER:

Flames blueliner Jake Bean was drafted by the Carolina Hurricanes in the first round (13th overall) of the 2013 NHL Draft following four years in the WHL, where he split time between the Calgary Hitmen and Tri-City Americans. Bean skated in 44 contests with his draft club, scoring one goal and 11 assists for 12 points, and also helped Carolina's AHL affiliate at the time in Charlotte capture the 2019 Calder Cup, earning AHL All-Rookie Team honours. During his time in the Hurricanes organization, he earned an AHL All-Star Game nod in 2020 and that same season would capture the Eddie Shore Award as the league's top defenceman. Bean signed with the Flames in the summer of 2024 and scored his first goal as a member of the Calgary Flames against his draft club on October 24, 2024.

WEEGSY BABY:

Mackenzie Weegar enters today's game with 196 assists in his NHL career and is four away from reaching the 200-assist mark. With four more helpers, Weegar would become just the sixth defenceman in NHL history drafted in the seventh round (FLA – 206th overall in 2013) to register 200 NHL assists, and the only active seventh-round-selected rearguard to achieve the milestone. Only one other active seventh-round selection has more career helpers than Weegar — Devils winger Ondrej Palat (TBL – 208th overall in 2011), who has recorded 331 through his 849-game career.



METRO-BOOMIN':

The Calgary Flames enter tonight's contest with a 3-0-0 record against Metropolitan Division clubs so far in 2025-26, outscoring the division 12-3 this season.

Calgary's first matchup against a team from the Metro' came on October 26th when they welcomed the New York Rangers to the Scotiabank Saddledome. The Flames would get multi-point efforts from Mikael Backlund (0-2 – 2), Blake Coleman (2-0 – 2) and Nazem Kadri (1-1 – 2) while Dustin Wolf stood tall in between the pipes, stopping 30 of 31 shots he faced. In total, 10-different Flames skaters recorded at least as point as Calgary triumphed 5-1.

The next time Calgary would see a Metropolitan Division team would come at the end of a four-game road swing on November 2 in Philadelphia. Jonathan Huberdeau led the way with both Calgary goals, scoring early in the second period from Yegor Sharangovich and Brayden Pachal, then adding his second midway through the third after deflecting a MacKenzie Weegar point-shot. Dustin Wolf finished with 17 saves on 18 shots for a .944 save-percentage while Huberdeau's two-goal effort earned him first star honors, and Dustin Wolf was the game's second star in a 2-1 win.

Their most recent clash with a Metro' club came on November 5 when Columbus came to town while Nazem Kadri skated in his 1,000th NHL game. Morgan Frost would open the scoring just 56 seconds in after deflecting a Jonathan Huberdeau shot, before Blake Coleman buried his sixth of the season only 36 seconds later. In the second, Nazem Kadri made his milestone game extra special by firing the back of the net to become the 62nd player in NHL history to score a goal in his 1,000th career game and just the second to do so in a Flames uniform along with Martin Gelin (1-0—1 on Dec. 9, 2003)). Just 37 seconds later, Adam Klapka extended the lead to 4–1 with a quick strike assisted by Yan Kuznetsov, who picked up his first NHL point. Dustin Wolf made a career-high 42 saves to backstop the Flames to a 5-1 victory.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund is closing in on 1,100 NHL games, needing just eight more to reach the milestone. Backlund was the Flames' first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2007 NHL draft and made his NHL debut on January 8, 2009, against the New York Islanders.

As Backlund developed in Calgary, he became known for his hockey IQ, defensive reliability, penalty-killing strength and ability to drive play at both ends of the ice. He represented Sweden at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, following that tournament with a breakout season in 2016-17 in which he posted a then-career-high 53 points and earned Selke Trophy consideration. In 2022-23, he set a new career high with 56 points (19G, 37A) and a team-best plus-minus rating of +24, while appearing in all 82 games for the Flames. That summer, the Vasteras, SWE, product won the King Clancy Memorial Trophy for his leadership and humanitarian contributions, and on September 21, 2023, was named the 21st captain in franchise history.

Backlund became the 19th player of Swedish descent — and the 397th skater in NHL history — to reach 1,000 NHL games, hitting the mark Oct. 30 in Utah. He was also just the second player to skate his first 1,000 games with the Flames, joining Jarome Iginla. He now looks to join Iginla once again as the second skater in franchise history to reach 1,100 games played with Calgary.

PEN TO PAPER:

On Friday morning, the Calgary Flames announced that General Manager Craig Conroy, along with the senior hockey management staff—President Don Maloney, Senior Vice-President of Hockey Operations/Assistant General Manager Dave Nonis, and Vice-President of Hockey Operations/Assistant General Manager Brad Pascall—have all signed two-year contract extensions. The extensions were finalized prior to the start of the 2025–26 season.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

With his first career goal on Friday in Florida, Yan Kuznetsov became the sixth member of the Flames active roster to score their first NHL goal at Amerant Bank Arena. The others:

Flames rearguard Rasmus Andersson was named the NHL’s First Star of the Week for the week ending November 23. Andersson led the league with nine points (2G, 7A) in four games, helping the Flames go 3-1-0 from Nov. 18–23.

He opened the week with a goal and an assist in a 5–2 setback in Chicago on Nov. 18. The following night in Buffalo, he recorded three points — including the game’s opening goal — becoming just the third Flames defenseman in the past 15 years to score on consecutive days, joining Noah Hanifin (Mar. 6–7, 2021) and Mark Giordano (3x; last: Jan. 18–19, 2018). Andersson then added two third period assists for his first three-point night of the week to close out a 6–2 win over the Sabres.

Back on home ice on Nov. 22, he registered an assist in a 3–2 shootout victory against the Dallas Stars. He capped the week with a three-assist outing — his ninth career three-point game and third career three-assist effort — in Calgary’s 5–2 win over the Vancouver Canucks on Nov. 23. With that performance, Andersson moved past Dion Phaneuf and Dougie Hamilton and into a tie with Phil Housley for the fifth-most three-point games by a Flames defenceman and reached 247 career points, surpassing Jamie Macoun for sixth-most by a blueliner in franchise history.

Andersson registered a pair of assists in Florida on Friday night to record his 13th and 14th points of November, which is the most by a Flames defenseman in a single month since Noah Hanifin had 16 in April 2022.
