Out of the Gate

- The Capitals have a 3-1-0 record through four games this season.
- With a win on Friday, Washington would start a season with four wins in their first five games for the second straight season and the eighth time in franchise history.
- The Capitals have allowed just three even-strength goals against through four games, one of which was an empty-net goal against in their season opener on Oct. 8 vs. Boston (h/t Mike Vogel).
- It marks just the second time in franchise history that Washington has allowed three or fewer even-strength goals against through the first four games of a season (1995-96: 1 EV GA).
- The Capitals are the only team in the NHL that has given up two or fewer five-on-five goals against.

Home Sweet Home

- The Capitals continue their four-game homestand on Friday when they host Minnesota. Washington's current homestand is tied for its longest of the season (also Nov. 22-28 and March 14-22).
- Tuesday's 3-2 overtime win over the Tampa Bay Lightning marked the Capitals' 599th regular-season win at Capital One Arena.
- The Capitals, who played their first game at Capital One Arena (originally called MCI Center) on Dec. 5, 1997, have a record of 599-317-34-109 (1,341 points, .633 point percentage) in 1,059 regular-season games at their home rink.

- Washington has the fourth-most home wins and home points and the fourth-highest home point percentage (min. 500 GP) in the NHL since Dec. 5, 1997.

Whip It

- Tom Wilson (1g-2a-3p) factored on all three Washington goals and recorded his 400th career point with an assist on Jakob Chychrun's overtime winner on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay.

- Wilson, whose five points (2g, 3a) in four games are tied with Aliaksei Protas for the team lead, is the 19th player in franchise history to record 400 points in a Capitals uniform. In addition, the 6'4", 225-pound forward became the [sixth member of the 2012 NHL Draft class to reach the milestone](#).

- With his goal, Wilson tied Dale Hunter and Michal Pivonka (181) for the 12th-most goals in franchise history.

- Wilson registered his 300th career point on Oct. 29, 2023 and required 151 games to go from 300 to 400 career points (0.66 P/GP). It marks the fewest games Wilson has needed between milestone points in his career.

- Last season, Wilson set career highs in goals (33), assists (32) and points (65).

- Wilson's 33 goals ranked second on Washington, trailing only Ovechkin (44g), and were the most by a Capital other than Ovechkin since T.J. Oshie scored 33 goals in 2016-17.

Terrific Tandem

- Logan Thompson stopped 17 of 19 shots faced in Washington's 3-2 win overtime win over Tampa Bay on Tuesday. In three starts this season, Thompson has posted a record of 2-1-0 with a .921 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average.

- Thompson's 33 wins since the start of the 2024-25 season are tied for the fifth-most among NHL goaltenders.

- Charlie Lindgren stopped all 35 shots faced in his season debut on Oct. 12 against the Rangers to pick up his first win of 2025-26 and his 10th career shutout.

- Lindgren, who is in his fourth season with the Capitals, became just the seventh goaltender in franchise history to record a shutout in his season debut (per [NHL Stats](#)).

- With the shutout win, Lindgren also passed Pete Peeters and Michal Neuvirth (7 shutouts) on the franchise's all-time shutout list and tied Neuvirth (59 wins) for the ninth-most wins in team history.

- Per Sportlogiq, Lindgren saved 3.80 goals above expected on Oct. 12, the highest by any goaltender this season (h/t Ryan Billie).

- Per [Natural Stat Trick](#), the Capitals have the highest team save percentage at five-on-five (.976) in the NHL this season and the third-highest save percentage at all strengths (.938).
- Thompson (43 GP) and Charlie Lindgren (39 GP) combined for 51 wins last season, the third-most wins in the League.

HistOvi

- Alex Ovechkin recorded the primary assist on Anthony Beauvillier's game-winning goal on Oct. 12 against the Rangers, which marked his second assist of the season.
- With his assist on Oct. 11 against the Islanders, Ovechkin passed Mario Lemieux (315g-469a-784p) for the seventh-most road points in NHL history.
- Ovechkin also passed Luc Robitaille (726) for the second-most assists by a left wing in NHL history. Only Johnny Bucyk (813) has more assists among left wings.
- Ovechkin, who celebrated his 40th birthday on Sept. 17, scored 44 goals in 65 games last season to pass Wayne Gretzky as the NHL's all-time goals leader.
- Ovechkin (897g-728a-1,625p in 1,495 GP) is three goals shy of becoming the first player in NHL history to score 900 career goals and five games shy of becoming the eighth player to play 1,500 games with one franchise.
- In addition, Ovechkin (1,625 points) needs 17 points to pass Joe Sakic (1,641 points) for 10th place on the NHL's all-time points list.

Running Wild

- Alex Ovechkin has recorded 38 points (20g, 18a) in 25 career games against Minnesota (1.52 P/GP), including 13 points (5g, 8a) in 11 games played at Capital One Arena.
- Ovechkin's 0.80 goals-per-game and 1.52 points-per-game versus the Wild are the highest rates he has recorded against a single franchise in his career.
- Ovechkin has recorded at least one point in nine of the 10 games he has played at home versus Minnesota dating to March 25, 2012.

Get Chychy With It

- Jakob Chychrun scored his fourth career overtime goal on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay. Chychrun has registered at least one point in three of the Capitals' first four games (1g-3a-4p).
- Chychrun leads NHL defensemen in game-winning goals (7) since joining the Capitals ahead of the 2024-25 season.
- Through four games this season, Chychrun ranks tied for first on Washington in assists and plus-minus rating (+5) and ranks second in points and ice time per game (21:39).
- In his first season with the Capitals in 2024-25, Chychrun set career highs in goals (20) and points (47) and matched his career high in assists (27).
- Chychrun became the first Capitals defenseman to score 20 goals in a season since Mike Green in 2008-09 (31g) and the ninth blueliner to reach the 20-goal mark in franchise history.
- Among NHL defensemen, Chychrun ranked first in game-winning goals (6), tied for second in power-play goals (5) and third in goals.

The Pro Show

- Aliaksei Protas scored his team-leading third goal of the season on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay.
- Through four games this season, Protas leads the Capitals in goals and shots (13) and ranks tied for first on the team in points (5) and plus-minus rating (+5).

- With 27 even-strength goals and three shorthanded goals, Protas became the fourth player in NHL history to reach the 30-goal mark in a season without recording a power-play goal, joining Brandon Hagel (2024-25), Doug Smail (1984-85) and Rick Kehoe (1972-73). In addition, Protas ranked third in the NHL in plus-minus (+40).

StromerTime

- Dylan Strome tallied two assists on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay, marking his first multi-point performance of the season and the 90th of his career.
- Strome registered his second assist of the game on Jakob Chychrun's overtime goal. Strome has factored on nine (3g-6a-9p) of Washington's 11 overtime goals since the start of the 2023-24 season.
- Strome recorded the primary assist on Tom Wilson's power-play goal. Strome leads the Capitals in power-play points (78) and power-play assists (60) since joining Washington ahead of the 2022-23 season.

- Strome, Washington's points leader in each of the last two seasons, recorded 82 points (29g, 53a) in 82 games in 2024-25, establishing career highs in goals, assists and points. It marked the third consecutive season Strome set a new career high in points.
- Since joining Washington ahead of the 2022-23 season, Strome ranks first on the Capitals in games played (249), assists (137), and points (216), and second in goals (79).

Here's Johnny

- John Carlson recorded his second assist of the season on Tuesday vs. Tampa Bay. Dating back to last season, Carlson has registered six assists in his last eight regular-season games.
- Carlson is in his 17th season with the Capitals.
- Carlson, who is the franchise's all-time leader in games played (1,092), goals (156), assists (571) and points (727) among defensemen, led the Capitals in ice time per game (23:34) and ranked first among Washington blueliners in points (51) for the ninth straight season in 2024-25.
- Carlson is eight games shy of 1,100 career games and 14 games shy of passing Nicklas Backstrom (1,105) for the second-most games played in franchise history.

Leno Lights the Lamp

- Twenty-year-old forward Ryan Leonard scored his second career goal on Oct. 11 against the Islanders.
- Leonard's goal stood as the game winner, marking his first career game-winning goal.
- Leonard is in his first full NHL season after appearing in 17 total games with the Capitals at the end of 2024-25.
- Leonard made his NHL debut on April 1 at Boston and scored his first career goal on April 4 vs. Chicago.
- The 6'1", 205-pound forward appeared in Washington's final nine regular-season games last season and in eight playoff games, recording an assist in Game 2 of the First Round vs. Montreal.
- Before joining the Capitals, Leonard led the NCAA in goals (30) with Boston College and was one of three finalists for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given to the top NCAA men's ice hockey player in the nation.
- Leonard became the first NCAA player with back-to-back 30-goal seasons since Boston College's Cam Atkinson in 2009-10 and 2010-11.
- In January, Leonard led Team USA to its second straight gold medal at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, the United States' first back-to-back World Junior gold medals in the history of the tournament.
- Leonard, the U.S. captain, was named tournament MVP and Best Forward after recording 10 points (5g, 5a) in seven games.

Consistent Caps

- The Capitals are looking to make the playoffs for the 11th time in the last 12 seasons and the 35th time in franchise history. Since 2007-08, no team has made the playoffs more than Washington (16 playoff appearances in 18 seasons).
- The Capitals will also look to defend their Metropolitan Division title in 2025-26. Last season's first-place finish marked Washington's 14th division title in franchise history and 11th since 2007-08.

- The Capitals' 11 division titles since 2007-08 are the most in the NHL, with the next closest teams having six division titles in the 18-year span (Boston and Vancouver, six each).
- It also marked the Capitals' sixth Metropolitan Division title since the division was formed in 2013-14. No other Metro team has won more than two division titles in that time.

Band Back Together

- Twenty of the 23 players on Washington's opening night roster played for the Capitals last season.
- The only active roster players who did not play with Washington in 2024-25 are offseason acquisitions Justin Sourdif and Declan Chisholm, and defenseman Vincent Iorio, who has appeared in nine regular-season games with the Capitals since 2023.
- Last season, the Capitals posted a record of 51-22-9 (111 points) and won the Metropolitan Division, clinched the Eastern Conference's top seed, and finished with the second-best record in the NHL.
- Washington's top eight goal scorers and top nine-point producers from last season return for 2025-26. Six of the Capitals' top nine scorers from 2024-25 are 28 or younger.

Defense Contractors

- The Capitals, who ranked tied for eighth in the NHL in goals against (2.79 GA/GP) in 2024-25, bring back both of their goaltenders and their top six defensemen from last season.
- Last season, Capitals defensemen combined for 200 points (38g, 162a), which was the fourth-highest total in the NHL.
- Six Capitals defensemen reached the 20-point mark in 2024-25, marking the first time in franchise history the team had had six blueliners with 20 or more points in the same season (h/t Mike Vogel).
- The same six defensemen also appeared in 65 or more games. Only one other time in franchise history has Washington had six defensemen play 65-plus games during a regular season and have all six return the following season (1995-96 to 1996-97: Sylvain Cote, Calle Johansson, Joe Reekie, Sergei Gonchar, Mark Tinordi & Ken Klee).

Marty Party

- Martin Fehérváry scored his first goal of the season on Oct. 11 against the Islanders.

- Fehérváry ranks tied for first on Washington in blocked shots (11) and tied for second in shorthanded ice time per game (1:46).
- The Capitals re-signed Fehérváry to a seven-year contract extension on July 1, keeping the 25-year-old defenseman in Washington through the 2032-33 season.
- Fehérváry, who established career highs in assists (20), points (25) and games played (81) in 2024-25, is one of 10 Capitals signed for at least the next three seasons.
