ANAHEIM DUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 47-32-7 (23-13-6 at Xcel Energy Center, 24-19-1 at Anaheim)

2024-25: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 5-2, in Anaheim (11/8)... LW **Kirill Kaprizov** led Minnesota with three points (2-1=3)...D **Brock Faber** (0-2=2) and C **Marco Rossi** (1-1=2) each added two points...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 33-of-35 shots faced to earn the win for the Wild...C **Robby Fabbri** (1-0=1) and C **Mason McTavish** (1-0=1) each scored for Anaheim...G **Lukas Dostal** saved 26-of-31 shots faced for the Ducks.

WILD LEADERS: RW Mats Zuccarello leads Minnesota with 28 points (8-20=28) in 33 career games vs. Anaheim...Kaprizov owns 20 points (9-11=20) in 18 games...C Ryan Hartman (9-8=17 in 27 games) and D Jared Spurgeon (7-10=17 in 30 games) both have 17 points.

WILD GOALIES: G Marc-Andre Fleury is 23-5-0 with a 1.82 GAA, a .932 SV% and four shutouts in 28 career starts against Anaheim...Gustavsson is 4-1-0 with a 1.98 GAA and .934 SV% in five starts against the Ducks.

DUCKS LEADERS: D **Cam Fowler** (8-7=15) leads Anaheim with 15 points in 46 career games vs. Minnesota...C **Ryan Strome** has 11 points (2-9=11) in 25 games...RW **Frank Vatrano** has 10 points (3-7=10) in 14 games.

DUCKS GOALIES: Dostal is 1-3-0 in five appearances (four starts) with a 3.06 GAA and a .915 SV%...G **John Gibson** is 7-7-4 with a 2.59 GAA, a .922 SV% and three shutouts in 19 career starts against the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** skated in four games with Anaheim in 2007-08...Ducks Assistant Coach **Tim Army** spent five seasons (2018-23) as the Iowa Wild (AHL) Head Coach, with a record of 157-115-45 in 317 games...D **Jackson LaCombe** is from Eden Prairie and played four seasons (2019-23) at the University of Minnesota.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota won 13 consecutive games, the longest winning streak against an opponent in team history, from 1/20/21 to 12/21/22...The Wild is 15-2-0 in the last 17 games against Anaheim...The Wild is 11-2-0 in its last 13 games at Honda Center, outscoring Anaheim, 43-20...Minnesota was swept by Anaheim in the 2003 Western Conference Final and lost 4-1 in the 2007 First Round.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: With a 17-4-4 record (.760), leads the NHL in points (38), point percentage and is T-2nd in wins...38 points marks franchise's highest total through a season's first 25 games...Has scored 80 goals this season, T-2nd most in franchise history through the first 25 games of a season (93 goals, 2021-22 season; 80 goals, 2018-19)...Minnesota's plus-22 goal differential through 25 games tied for the franchise high (also 2021-22 season)...Leads the NHL with a 2.29 team GAA and a .920 team SV%, and fourth with a plus-22 goal differential...Also leads the NHL by allowing only 1.64 even-strength goals per game, and ranks eighth by scoring 2.64 evenstrength goals per game...Is the only NHL team without consecutive regulation losses this season...Owns an active eight-game point streak on the road (6-0-2), the longest active streak in the NHL and tied with Vancouver (8-0-0) for the league's longest this season...Minnesota now has five total road point streaks of eight-plus games in franchise history, last doing so in 2022-23 (8-0-3)...Leads the NHL with 23 road points (10-1-3) and a .821 road point percentage and is T-2nd in road wins... Matt Boldy: Owns 11 points (5-6=11) in his last 13 games...Tied for the NHL lead with five GWG...Ranks second on the Wild with 24 points (11-13=24).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Owns a 5-0-1 record for the season and is the only NHL goaltender with five-plus starts to not suffer a regulation loss...His season-opening six-start point streak marks the third longest of his career behind 2009-10 (8 GP: 8-0-0) and 2013-14 (7 GP: 7-0-0), both with Pittsburgh...The streak is also tied for the second-longest season-opening point streak in Wild history, trailing only Niklas Backstrom's seven-game run in 2008-09 (6-0-1)...With a win vs. CHI (11/29) a day after his 40th birthday on Nov. 28, became the second goaltender in NHL history to earn a win both as a teenager and a 40-year-old joining Martin Brodeur.

Brock Faber: Tied his career high with a plus-3 rating vs. VAN (12/3), finishing the game with an assist...Eighth in the NHL with 24:51 of TOI/G.

Marcus Foligno: Seventh in the NHL with 91 hits this season...Currently owns 1,429 hits in a Wild sweater, trailing only Cal Clutterbuck (1,457) for most in franchise history. Freddy Gaudreau: Owns 14 points (5-9=14) in last 17 games, beginning 10/29 at PIT. Filip Gustavsson: Is 12-4-3 and leads the NHL with a 2.04 GAA and .929 SV%, is T-2nd with two shutouts and T-3rd with 12 wins...Has allowed two or fewer goals in 14 starts this season, most in the NHL.

Ryan Hartman: Played in his 600th career NHL game vs. VAN (12/3).

Kirill Kaprizov: Scored his franchise-leading ninth career overtime goal vs. VAN (12/3)...Has now factored on 10 GWG in 2024-25 (4-6=10), most in the NHL...Leads the NHL with 39 points (16-23=39), 1.63 points per game, 30 even-strength points (13-17=30), 25 points on the road (9-16=25) and a plus-19 rating this season while ranking T-2nd with 13 multi-point games, T-3rd with 16 goals and T-7th with 23 assists...Third among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:25)...Owns an active four-game point streak (3-2=5)...Scored his 61st career PPG vs. Nashville (11/30) and moved past Mikko Koivu for second on the Wild's all-time PPG list (Parise, 69 PPG)...Has notched a point in each of his last 12 road games played (9-16=25), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

Jake Middleton: T-2nd in the NHL with a plus-18 rating and T-10th with 61 blocked shots. **Marco Rossi:** Has tallied a point in 17 of 25 games this season and ranks T-2nd on the Wild with 13 assists and third with 20 points (7-13=20).

Jared Spurgeon: Notched two points (1-1=2) vs. NSH (11/30), including the GWG in overtime, to reach 71 career multi-point games and tie Mats Zuccarello for sixth in franchise history...Now with five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history...Now owns 22 career GWG, tying Jason Zucker for sixth in Wild history...Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29 and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list...Currently with 19,658:47 career minutes skating, all with the Wild, needs 59:21 of ice time to move past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.

4 NATIONS FACE-OFF

The National Hockey League Players' Association (NHLPA) and National Hockey League (NHL) has announced the full rosters for the 4 Nations Face-Off, as selected by each National Association (Hockey Canada, Finnish Ice Hockey Association, Swedish Ice Hockey Association and USA Hockey). Minnesota Wild left wing **Matt Boldy** (United States), defenseman **Jonas Brodin** (Sweden), center **Joel Eriksson Ek** (Sweden), defenseman **Brock Faber** (United States) and goaltender **Filip Gustavsson** (Sweden) will each represent their respective country.

The Bell Centre in Montreal and TD Garden in Boston will serve as the host venues and cities for the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025, which will consist of a total of seven games played over a nine-day period from Feb. 12 to 20, along with two designated training/practice days (Feb. 10 and Feb. 11).

All 4 Nations Face-Off games will be played in accordance with NHL rules. Each team will play three tournament games in a traditional Round Robin format, under the following points system: three points for a win in regulation time; two points for a win in overtime/shootout; one point for a loss in overtime/shootout; and no points for a loss in regulation time. The two teams with the best tournament record will then advance to a one-game Final.

HOT START

• With 38 points (17-4-4) this season, the Wild has set a franchise record for most points through a season's first 25 games.

- Minnesota's plus-22 goal differential through 25 games tied for the franchise high (also 2021-22 season).
- Has scored 80 goals this season, T-2nd most in franchise history through the first 25 games of a season (93 goals, 2021-22 season; 80 goals, 2018-19).
- Is one of 89 teams in NHL history to record 30 points in a season's first 20 games, including the 2024-25 Winnipeg Jets. Of the 87 teams to reach the mark prior to this season, 64 made the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild has allowed 15 first-period goals this season, tied for fewest in the NHL. Minnesota owns a plus-6 goal differential (21 goals for, 15 goal against) in the first period this season. T-8th in the NHL.
- The Wild is 11-0-0 when leading through two periods and 9-0-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in a 16 games this season, T-1st in the NHL, and holds a 12-2-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

 The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

WILD UNDER HYNES

- The Wild has played 88 regular-season games under Head Coach John Hynes dating back to Nov. 28, 2023 vs. STL.
- Hynes owns a 51-28-9 record (.631) during that span. His .631 point percentage ranks second all-time among Wild head coaches.
- The Wild ranks seventh in the NHL in points (112) and eighth in wins (51) since Hynes took the bench on Nov. 28, 2023.

YOUNG GUNS.

- The Wild ranks T-8th in the NHL with 69 points (24-45=69) registered by players aged 24 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Chisholm, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi, Lauko).
- Matt Boldy is T-4th among NHL players who started the season age 24 or younger with 11 goals and 24 points (11-13=24). Marco Rossi ranks T-11th with 20 points (7-13=20).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).
- Minnesota finished second in the NHL last season with 104 points scored by rookies (34-70=104) and third with 245 games played by rookie skaters (248 including goalies).

STINGY PLAY

- Minnesota leads the NHL with a 2.29 team GAA and a .920 team SV%. Also leads the NHL by allowing only 1.64 even-strength goals per game.
- The Wild has recorded 16 games allowing two-or-fewer goals this season, most in the NHL.
- The Wild is allowing 2.40 opponent power-play opportunities per game, the fourth-best mark in the NHL this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Leads the NHL with 23 road points (10-1-3) and a .821 road point percentage and is T-2nd in road wins. Second in the NHL with a plus-20 goal differential on the road
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov scored his franchise-leading ninth career overtime goal vs. VAN (12/3). He has now factored on 10 GWG in 2024-25 (4-6=10), most in the NHL.
- Leads the NHL with 39 points (16-23=39), 1.63 points per game, 30 even-strength points (13-17=30), 25 points on the road (9-16=25) and a plus-19 rating this season while ranking T-2nd with 13 multi-point games, T-3rd with 16 goals and T-7th with 23 assists. Third among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:25).
- Kaprizov scored his 61st career PPG vs. Nashville (11/30), moving past Mikko Koivu for second on the Wild's all-time PPG list (Parise, 69 PPG).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) have more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).
- With two goals (2-0=2) at STL (11/19), became one of 19 players in NHL history (29 total occurrences) to record 12 multi-point outings in a team's first 18 games played. He is the first to achieve the feat since Peter Forsberg (2005-06)
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. MTL, became the fastest player in franchise history (16 GP) to reach 30 points in a season, shattering the mark he set in 2022-23 (22 GP). Also became the ninth NHL player born outside of North America to reach the 30-point mark in 16 or fewer games.
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby - 235 games; McDavid - 270 games; Ovechkin - 272 games; Kaprizov - 292 games; Malkin - 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in 455 contests.
- Ranks third in Wild history with 103 multi-point games (Koivu, 153; Gaborik, 114).
- With three assists (0-3=3) at SJS (11/7), recorded his eighth career three-assist game and tied Mats Zuccarello and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for the second most in franchise history (Mikko Koivu, 16 three-assist games).
- Currently with 37 career three-plus point games, notched his 35th game with three-plus points of his career with a three-point performance (2-1=3) vs. TBL (11/1) to move past Mikko Koivu (34 games) for most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 39 career multi-assist games, needs two more to tie • Jared Spurgeon (41) for third-most in franchise history.

Kaprizov notched the 24th GWG of his career at ANA (11/8), moving past Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fourth-most in franchise history.

CROWN JOEL

- Joel Eriksson Ek notched two assists (0-2=2) and won 15-of-19 face offs taken vs. CHI (11/29).
- Leads the Wild with 215 face off wins on the season.
- Won 18-of-24 face offs (75.0 pct.) taken at CGY (11/23). His 18 total face off wins marked a season high and the fourth-highest total of his NHL career (19 face offs won, three occurrences). He last won 18-plus face offs on 2/19/24 vs. PIT (19-for-33).
- The Swede recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5) from 10/22 10/26.

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi owns points in 17 of 25 games played this season and ranks T-2nd on the team with 13 assists and third with 20 points (7-13=20).
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 10/22, also a career-long mark.

- Stopped all 39 shots faced at BUF (11/27) to record his second shutout of the season and eighth of his career, moving past Darcy Kuemper for sixth all-time in franchise history. His 39 saves at BUF marked the sixth-highest total by a goaltender in a shutout victory in Wild history
- Made a season-high 38 saves vs. DAL (11/16).
- Is 52-31-7 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson's .917 save percentage ranks tied for the thirdhighest among all goaltenders through that span, behind Linus Ullmark (.923) and Connor Hellebuyck (.922).
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.

- His season-opening six-start point streak marks the third longest of his career behind 2009-10 (8 GP: 8-0-0) and 2013-14 (7 GP: 7-0-0), both with Pittsburgh. The streak is also tied for the second-longest seasonopening point streak in Wild history, trailing only Niklas Backstrom's seven-game run in 2008-09 (6-0-1).
- With a win vs. CHI (11/29) a day after his 40th birthday on Nov. 28, became the second goaltender in NHL history to earn a win both as a • teenager and a 40-year-old joining Martin Brodeur.
