

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 22, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. DALLAS STARS [2] (SO)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames edged the Dallas Stars 3–2 in a shootout last night at the Scotiabank Saddledome thanks to strong special-teams play, a multi-point night from Nazem Kadri, and a stellar performance in between the pipes from Devin Cooley. Calgary built a 2–0 lead with powerplay goals from Matt Coronato in the first period and Joel Farabee early in the third, but Dallas would storm back. First, Jason Robertson cut the deficit to one at the 6:44 of the third, followed by Roope Hintz evening things with 3:07 remaining in regulation. Overtime solved nothing, and in the shootout, Morgan Frost and Nazem Kadri converted for Calgary, while Devin Cooley denied the Stars final two attempts to help the Flames claim the extra point and give Calgary back-to-back victories.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Canucks. Calgary fell in these clubs' first meeting in Vancouver on October 9.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-3-0 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 3-12-1 against Western Conference opponents.

NAZ-HIM:

Nazem Kadri registered a pair of helpers last night against Dallas to record his 20th career multi-assist game with the Flames. Since joining Calgary in 2022-23, Kadri is one of just two Flames skaters to post 20-or-more multi-assist outings, joining Jonathan Huberdeau (25).

MAN ADVANTAGE:

Calgary recorded a pair of powerplay goals last night against Dallas courtesy of Matt Coronato and Joel Farabee. Since November 15, the Flames have scored four times on the man advantage and boast a 28.6% powerplay efficiency over that span — the seventh-best rate in the NHL over their last four outings.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

With his game-opening goal on Wednesday night in Buffalo, Rasmus Andersson became just the third Flames defenseman in the past 15 years to score on consecutive days, joining Noah Hanifin (Mar. 6–7, 2021) and Mark Giordano (3x; most recently Jan. 18–19, 2018). Andersson added a pair of assists against the Sabres to record his eighth career three-point game, tying Dion Phaneuf and Dougie Hamilton for the sixth-most such performances by a Flames blueliner.

Across Calgary's back-to-back set in Chicago and Buffalo on Tuesday and Wednesday, Andersson posted a team-leading five points (2G, 3A) and has now recorded points in four straight games and in five of his last six. The Malmö, SWE native is just two points shy of Jamie Macoun (246) for the sixth-most points by a defenseman in Flames franchise history.

RING OF FIRE:

With their six-goal outburst in Buffalo on Wednesday night, the Calgary Flames have now won 40 straight games when scoring four or more goals. Last season, the Flames went a perfect 18-0-0 in such contests and closed the 2024–25 campaign with four consecutive four-plus goal performances: Apr. 11 vs. MIN (4–2 W), Apr. 13 vs. SJS (5–2 W), Apr. 15 vs. VGK (5–4 SOW), and Apr. 17 at LAK (5–1 W).

SHARKNADO:

Yegor Sharangovich recorded a pair of assists in Buffalo on Wednesday, marking his 99th and 100th helpers in the NHL. With the milestone, he becomes just the sixth skater of Belarusian descent in league history to reach the 100-assist mark. Sharangovich currently the highest-scoring active Belarusian in the NHL.

KEEP HIS COOL:

Devin Cooley turned aside 28 of the 30 shots he faced last night against Dallas to earn his second-consecutive win, and first at the Scotiabank Saddledome. Cooley has appeared in seven games for the Flames this season ranks second in the NHL in both goals-against average (1.80) and save-percentage (.935) among goaltenders who have played at least six games.



JOEL-SCORER:

Joel Farabee tallied his fifth goal of the season last night against Dallas to give him goals in back-to-back games. On Wednesday in Buffalo, Joel Farabee found the back of the net twice to record his seventh-career multi-goal game, and first as a member of the Calgary Flames. Farabee now has 98-career goals and is looking to become the fourth member of the 2018 NHL draft class to reach 100-career goals with the most recent player to do so being teammate Yegor Sharangovich.

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Calgary Flames are prepared finish their fifth back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season following last nights 3-2 shootout victory over Dallas. Calgary’s last back-to-back set came earlier this week contests when they faced Chicago at the United Center on Tuesday before heading to the KeyBank Center in Buffalo on Wednesday. The Flames have four more back-to-back sets remaining this season after tonight, with their next coming on January 7th when they face the Montreal Canadiens at the Bell Centre before heading to TD Garden to face the Boston Bruins the following night.


HUBY DOO:

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 794 points in his NHL career and is just six-shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,016) and Mark Scheifele (832) There are 25-active skaters who has surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Calgary Flames have played more games against the Vancouver Canucks (308) than they have against any other NHL franchise.

Nazem Kadri drew two penalties last night against the Stars, bringing his season total to 10. Kadri finished tied for the league lead in that category during the 2024-25 season with 38, with only Ottawa’s Tim Stutzle drawing as many penalties.
