PITTSBURGH PENGUINS

All-Time Wild Record: 16-16-2 (7-7-2 at Xcel Energy Center, 9-9-0 at Pittsburgh)

2024-25: The Wild won the series-opening game, 5-3, in Pittsburgh (10/29)...C Freddy Gaudreau (2-1=3) and LW Kirill Kaprizov (1-2=3) led Minnesota with three points each...G Marc-Andre Fleury saved 26-of-29 shots faced to earn the victory for the Wild...C Sidney Crosby led the Penguins with three points (0-3=3)...RW **Rickard Rakell** scored two goals (2-0=2)...G Joel Blomqvist stopped 35-of-39 shots faced for Pittsburgh.

WILD LEADERS: LW Marcus Johansson leads Minnesota with 24 points (10-14=24) in 43 career games against Pittsburgh...C Gustav Nyquist (12-11=23 in 28 games) and RW Mats Zuccarello (7-16=23 in 36 games) each have 23 career points against the Penguins...D **Zach Bogosian** has 13 points (4-9=13) in 32 games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 6-4-0 with a 3.04 GAA, a .905 SV% and one shutout in 10 starts vs. Pittsburgh...G Filip Gustavsson is 1-3-0 with a 4.04 GAA and a .873 SV% in four games (three starts).

PENGUINS LEADERS: Crosby leads Pittsburgh with 38 points (12-26=38) in 25 career games against Minnesota...D Erik Karlsson owns 35 points (9-26=35) in 30 games...C Evgeni Malkin owns 26 points (11-15=26) in 21 matches...D Kris Letang (4-15=19 in 23 contests) and Rakell (13-6=19 in 33 games) own 19 points

PENGUINS GOALIES: G Tristan Jarry is 3-0-1 with a 2.95 GAA and a .900 SV% in four career starts vs. the Wild...G Alex Nedeljkovic is 1-2-1 with a 4.29 GAA and a .860 SV% in four starts.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager Bill **Guerin** totaled 57 points (26-31=57) in 95 games with Pittsburgh in two seasons (2008-10), winning the Stanley Cup in 2009...Guerin spent eight seasons in the Penguins' front office (2011-19), including five seasons (2014-19) as Assistant General Manager where he won two more Stanley Cups (2016, 2017)...Minnesota Head Coach John Hynes served as Head Coach of Wilkes-Barre Scranton for five seasons (2010-15) and one season as an Assistant Coach (2009-10)...Hynes led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs as Head Coach...Fleury was selected by the Penguins first overall in the 2003 NHL Draft and went 375-216-68 with a 2.58 GAA, a .912 SV% and 44 shutouts in 691 career games (667 starts) in 13 seasons (2003-17)...He posted a 62-51 record with a 2.65 GAA, a .908 SV% and 10 shutouts in 115 career playoff contests (113 starts) with Pittsburgh and win the Stanley Cup in 2009, 2016 and 2017...Gaudreau collected 10 points (2-8=10) in 19 games with the Penguins in 2020-21...Gustavsson was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (55th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft...Crosby played at Shattuck St. Mary's (2002-03)...F Vinnie Hinostroza played in 14 games for Pittsburgh during the 2023-24 season, posting three points (1-2=3)...C Connor Dewar was drafted by Minnesota in the third round (No. 92 overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft and collected 38 points (18-20=38) in 173 across three seasons (2021-24) win the Wild...C Tommy Novak played four seasons at the University of Minnesota (2015-19) and played high school hockey at St. Thomas Acadamy...C Blake Lizotte is from Lindstrom and played two seasons at St. Cloud State University (2017-19).

Team: Leads the NHL with 47 road points (22-10-3) and 22 road wins while ranking second with a .671 road point percentage...T-5th in the NHL with a .904 team save percentage this season...Sixth in the NHL with 33 goals scored by defensemen this season...Has scored first in 38 games this season, most in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Owns nine points (3-6=9) in his last eight games...Currently T-3rd in the NHL with eight GWG this season, tied for the most GWG in a single season in franchise history...Currently tied for seventh in franchise history with 22 career GWG, needs one to tie Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fifth in franchise history...Ranks seventh in the NHL with 217 shots this season...Leads the Wild with 54 points (21-33=54) and 323 assists and is T-2nd with 21 goals.

Justin Brazeau: Made his Wild debut at VAN (3/7), becoming the 324th player (302nd skater) to appear in a regular-season game for Minnesota. Finished with two hits and one blocked shot in 7:11 of TOI.

Brock Faber: Leads Wild defensemen and ranks T-6th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24)...Seventh in the NHL with 25:08 of TOI/G this season.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made the 1,014th start of his career at UTA (2/27), tying Roberto Luongo for second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Made the 1,045th game appearance of his career at DET (2/22) to move past Roberto Luongo for sole possession of second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Recorded the 69th overtime victory of his NHL career at DET (2/22) to tie Martin Brodeur for most in league history.

Marcus Foligno: T-10th in the NHL with 204 hits this season.

Freddy Gaudreau: Owns six points (4-2=6) in his last eight games...Finished with two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4).

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a 24-15-3 record for the season and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and is sixth in wins and save percentage (.914)... Stopped a penalty stop at SEA (3/4) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career...Made 28 saves to record his fourth shutout of the season vs. BOS (3/2), reaching 10 career shutouts with Minnesota and tying Josh Harding for fifth-most in franchise history...Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.

Vinnie Hinostroza: Owns four goals (4-0=4) in nine games played since being claimed off waivers from Nashville on Feb. 5...Currently at 99 career NHL assists. Marcus Johansson: Recorded a three-game point streak (0-4=4) from 2/28 - 3/4. Jake Middleton: Owns seven goals on the season, T-1st among Wild defenseman and tving his single-season career high (also 2023-24).

Marco Rossi: Won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the third-highest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken)...Ranks second on the team in assists (31) and T-2nd in points ((21-31=52) and goals (21).

Jared Spurgeon: Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7)... With two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4), recorded the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defensemen...Ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters. Mats Zuccarello: Posted a three-game point streak (2-2=4) from 2/28 - 3/4... Finished with two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to notch his 79th multi-point game in a Wild sweater, tying Zach Parise for fourth-most in franchise history... Currently owns 321 points (98-223=321) with the Wild, tied with Andrew Brunette (119-202=223) for eighth in franchise history...Currently at 223 assists with the Wild, one short of tying Mikael Granlund (224) for fifth in franchise history.

WILD ACQUIRES JUSTIN BRAZEAU

On March 6 the Wild acquired forward Justin Brazeau from the Boston Bruins in exchange for forwards Marat Khusnutdinov and Jakub Lauko and a sixth-round selection in the 2026 NHL Draft, originally acquired from Boston. He debuted for the Wild at Vancouver (3/7), finishing with two hits and one blocked shot in 7:11 of TOI.

Brazeau, 27 (2/2/98), collected 20 points (10-10=20) including four powerplay goals (third on team) and two game-winning goals, 89 hits and 16 penalty minutes (PIM) in 57 games with the Bruins this season. The 6-foot-6, 227-pound native of New Liskeard, Ont., now owns 27 points (15-12=27), 132 hits, 38 blocked shots and 18 PIM in 77 career NHL games in two seasons with Boston (2023-25) and Minnesota (2025). Brazeau scored a goal in his NHL debut on Feb. 19, 2024, at Dallas (Oettinger) and owns two points (1-1=2) in nine Stanley Cup Playoff games with the Bruins.

He recorded 118 points (53-65=118), 377 shots on goal and a plus-32 rating in 189 career American Hockey League (AHL) games in parts of five seasons with the Toronto Marlies (2019-21) and Providence Bruins (2021-24). Brazeau added three points (2-1=3) in six Calder Cup Playoff games with the Bruins. He also tallied 75 points (37-38=75) in parts of two ECHL seasons with the Maine Mariners (2021-22) and the Newfoundland Growlers (2019-20) and was named to the ECHL All-Rookie Team in 2019-20.

POINT PACE

 With 76 points (36-23-4) this season, the Wild owns the fifth-highest point total in franchise history through a season's first 63 games.

- Is one of 89 teams in NHL history to record 30 points in a season's first 20 games, including the 2024-25 Winnipeg Jets. Of the 87 teams to reach the mark prior to this season, 64 made the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 24-0-0 when leading through two periods, one of two NHL teams (Seattle, 14-0-0) with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 19-4-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 38 games this season, most in the NHL, and holds a 26-10-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

 The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks T-6th in the NHL with 53 goals registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Jiricek, Khusnutdinov, Ohgren, Rossi) and eighth with 143 points (53-90=143).
- Matt Boldy ranks fifth among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 54 points (21-33=54) and T-7th with 21 goals. Marco Rossi is sixth with 52 points (21-31=52) and T-7th with 21 goals.

ROAD DAWGS

- Leads the NHL with 47 road points (22-10-3) and 22 road wins while ranking second with a .671 road point percentage.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-3-1 this season (.825) when scoring first in a road game, the fourth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the
 first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27
 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in
 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy owns nine points (3-6=9) in his last eight games.
- Ranks seventh in the NHL with 217 shots this season.
- Leads the Wild with 54 points (21-33=54) and 323 assists and is T-2nd with 21 goals.
- Posted a game-high eight shots on goal vs. BOS (3/2), tied for the second-highest total of his career.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-4=7) from 2/8 2/27.
- Currently T-3rd in the NHL with eight GWG this season, tied for the most GWG in a single season in franchise history.
- Currently tied for seventh in franchise history with 22 career GWG, needs one to tie Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fifth in franchise history.
- Is the second player in franchise history with three 30-assist seasons before turning 24, joining Pierre-Marc Bouchard (3x) Owns five points (3-2=5) in his last two games.
- Notched a game-high three points (2-1=3) vs. NYI (2/8), tying his season high.
- Boldy tied his single-game career high with three assists at CHI (1/26).
- Skated 26:35 of TOI at COL (1/20), the second-highest total of his season and NHL career.
- Scored his team-leading sixth PPG of the season at NSH (1/18).
- Skated a career-high 26:55 of TOI vs. EDM (1/15) and notched two
 points (1-1=2). He also registered seven shots on net, his secondhighest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career, while his
 15 shot attempts marked a season high and the second-highest total
 of his career.
- Tallied two points (1-1=2) and tied season-high plus-3 rating at SJS (1/11)
- Set a season-high with a plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3).
- Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his secondsuch goal of the season and sixth of his career, and passed Matt Cullen for most game-deciding shootout goals in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 11/23.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the third-highest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken).
- Ranks second on the team in assists (31) and T-2nd in points ((21-31=52) and goals (21).
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime at DET (2/22).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24. Also finished with a plus-2 rating vs. CGY (1/25) and ranks second on the team and T-12th among NHL forwards with a plus-17 rating on the season.
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 10/22, also establishing a career-long mark.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defensemen. Also ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (2-2=4) from 1/25 1/30.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTA (1/23), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon scored the GWG in overtime vs. NSH (11/30) to reach five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29 and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-124), blocked shots (1,569) and minutes skated (20,210:58), second in games played (913), third in assists (289), third in scoring (116-289=405) and fourth in shots (1,513).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (158) by a defenseman playing in 750-plus games.

- With an assist at COL (2/28), became the fastest defenseman in Wild history to reach 70 career points (14-56=70), doing so in his 140th game of his career.
- Logged a game-high 30:05 in ice time at DET (2/22), marking the fourth game this season and ninth game in his NHL career he has skated 30-plus minutes.
- Skated 30:33 at CAR (1/4), his second consecutive game with 30-plus minutes of TOI and fifth-highest total of his career.
- Skated 31:29 of TOI at WSH (1/2), his second-highest total of the season and fourth-highest total of his career.
