**SERIES SUMMARY:** The Avalanche won Game 1, 9-6, in Denver (5/3) as well as Game 2, 5-2, at Ball Arena (5/5), while Minnesota earned a 5-1 win in Game 3 in St. Paul (5/9)...D **Quinn Hughes** (2-3=5) and LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (2-3=5) lead Minnesota with five points each...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns four points (1-3=4)...D **Brock Faber** (1-2=3) and C **Ryan Hartman** (2-1=3) have three points each...G **Jesper Wallstedt**...is 1-1 with a 4.52 GAA and a .885 SV% in two starts...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 18-of-22 shots faced in Game 2...C **Nathan MacKinnon** leads Colorado with seven points (3-4=7) in the series...C **Martin Necas** has five points (1-4=5)...D **Devon Toews** (1-3=4) and LW **Gabriel Landeskog** (1-3=4) have four points each...G **Scott Wedgewood** is 2-1 with a 4.57 GAA and a .861 SV% in starting all three games for the Avalanche...G **Mackenzie Blackwood** stopped 12-of-13 shots faced in a relief appearance in Game 3.

**2025-26 REGULAR SEASON:** Minnesota went 2-1-1 against Colorado...Minnesota won the series-opening game, 3-2, in shootout at Grand Casino Arena (11/28) and the third contest, 5-2, at Ball Arena (2/26), while Colorado earned a 5-1 win in St. Paul in the second meeting (12/21) and a 3-2 shootout win in the final meeting in Colorado (3/8)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** led Minnesota with six points (3-3=6) in the series...LW **Matt Boldy** had four points (2-2=4)...Hartman (1-2=3) and C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (2-1=3) had three points each...G **Jesper Wallstedt** went 1-1-1 with a 2.85 GAA and a .925 SV% in four games (three starts)...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 44-of-45 shots faced to earn the win in the third game before exiting with illness late in the third period...MacKinnon led the Avalanche with seven points (4-3=7) in the season series...Makar (1-3=4) and LW **Gabriel Landeskog** (1-3=4) had four points each...Wedgewood went 1-0-1 with a 1.87 GAA and a .945 SV% in his two starts...G **Mackenzie Blackwood** went 1-1-0 with a 2.05 GAA and a .937 SV% in his two starts.

**WILD REGULAR SEASON LEADERS:** RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Minnesota with 35 points (15-20=35) in 50 career games against Colorado...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 34 points (7-27=34) in 38 matches...Kaprizov has 26 points (15-11=25) in 22 games...Hartman has 21 points (10-11=21) in 42 games.

**WILD REGULAR SEASON GOALIES:** Gustavsson is 3-7-1 with a 3.56 GAA and a .898 SV% in 11 starts against Colorado...Wallstedt is 1-1-1 with a 2.85 GAA and a .925 SV% in four games (three starts), all this season.

**AVALANCHE REGULAR SEASON LEADERS:** MacKinnon leads the Avalanche with 70 points (27-43=70) in 55 career games against Minnesota...Landeskog owns 46 points (21-25=46) in 52 games...D **Brent Burns** has 29 points (5-17=29) in 49 games...Makar has 26 points (6-20=26) in 29 games.

**AVALANCHE REGULAR SEASON GOALIES:** Blackwood has a 3-5-2 record with a 2.59 GAA and a .911 SV% in 10 career starts vs. Minnesota...Wedgewood has a 2-1-3 record with a 2.55 GAA and a .918 SV% in seven games (five starts) against the Wild.

**CONNECTIONS:** LW **Yakov Trenin** recorded three points (2-1=3) in 16 games with the Avalanche in 2023-24...C **Nico Sturm** collected three assists in 21 games with Colorado during the 2021-22 season and helped the Avalanche win the 2022 Stanley Cup with two assists in 13 games during the team's 2022 postseason run...Burns was selected by Minnesota in the first round (20th overall) of the 2003 NHL Draft and collected 183 points (55-128=183) and 325 PIM in 453 games with the Wild across seven seasons (2003-11)...C **Brock Nelson** is from Warroad...D **Sam Malinski** is from Lakeville.

**FAST FACTS:** Minnesota has won four of its last seven meetings with Colorado, including two shootout victories...The Wild's 35 all-time home wins over Colorado is its most against any single opponent, while its 140 overall points and 63 overall wins ranks second...Minnesota's 28 all-time wins in Denver is the team's second-highest road mark against a single opponent...Minnesota defeated Colorado in the First Round of the 2003 and 2014 playoffs, both 4-3...Colorado defeated Minnesota 4-2 in 2008 First Round.

### NOTES & MILESTONES

**Team:** Making its 15th overall appearance in the Stanley Cup Playoffs and 12th in the last 14 seasons...Is playing its fourth head-to-head playoff series against COL, following seven-game series wins in the 2014 First Round and 2003 Conference Quarterfinals and a six-game series loss during the 2008 Conference Quarterfinals. Has won three consecutive home games, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Five games in 2014).

**Matt Boldy:** Leads the SCP with 42 shots on goal and ranks T-1st with seven goals and T-5th with 11 points (7-4=11) and a plus-9 rating...Ranks sixth among SCP forwards with a 23:39 TOI/G average in the postseason...Owns 13 career postseason goals, the third-most in franchise history.

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Led all skaters with 84 face offs won and ranked second with 149 face offs taken in Round 1, finishing with a 56.4 face off percentage...Owns nine career playoff goals, tied with Jason Pominville and Jared Spurgeon for sixth in Wild history.

**Brock Faber:** Ranks first among SCP skaters with a plus-12 rating...Ranks T-1st among SCP defensemen with four goals and third with nine points (4-5=9)...Tallied SCP career-high three points (1-2=3) in Game 3 vs. COL (5/9), tying franchise record for most points in a playoff game by a defenseman...His four SCP goals are tied with Quinn Hughes for the most in a single playoff run by a defenseman in franchise history.

**Marcus Foligno:** Scored the second shorthanded goal of his postseason career in Game 1 at COL (5/3), tying Wes Walz for the franchise record...Ranks T-2nd in the SCP with 48 hits...Owns a franchise-record 233 hits in his postseason career.

**Filip Gustavsson:** Played in his 12th career postseason games for the Wild in Game 2 at COL (5/5), moving out of a tie with Dwayne Roloson and Niklas Backstrom (11 GP each) for sole possession of second in franchise history.

**Ryan Hartman:** Ranks T-7th in the SCP with 29 shots on goal...On a three-game point streak (2-1=3)...Has 23 points (7-16=23) in his last 25 playoff games (since 2022 SCP).

**Quinn Hughes:** Leads SCP skaters with a 30:37 TOI/G average (min. five GP), ranks T-2nd with 13 points (4-9=13) and T-3rd with nine assists and a plus-10 rating...Scored game-winning goal in Game 3 vs. COL (5/9), becoming first defenseman and fifth player in team history to record multiple game-winning goals in a single postseason...His four SCP goals are tied with Brock Faber for the most in a single playoff run by a defenseman in franchise history.

**Kirill Kaprizov:** With three points (1-2=3) in Game 3 vs. COL, reached 14 points (4-10=14) this postseason, tying Zach Parise for second-most points in single postseason in team history...Also recorded fifth career postseason multi-assist game, passing Parise and Mikko Koivu for the most in Wild history...Is the Wild's all-time leader in playoff goals (19) and multi-point games (10) and ranks T-1st in GWG (three)...Ranks first in the SCP with 14 points, T-1st in assists and second with a plus-11 rating...On a three-game point streak (2-3=5).

**Jared Spurgeon:** Holds franchise records with 82 postseason games played and 22 postseason assists and ranks third with 31 postseason points (9-22=31)...Is the Wild's all-time leader for playoff goals and points among defensemen.

**Vladimir Tarasenko:** Owns 51 career goals in the postseason, the fifth-highest total all-time among Russian-born players...His 77 points (51-26=77), 51 goals and 130 career postseason games are all tops among rostered Wild players.

**Jesper Wallstedt:** Is 5-3 with a 2.61 GAA and a .913 SV% this postseason...Earned fifth win of playoffs in Game 3 vs. COL (5/9), tying Dwayne Roloson for the most in a single postseason...Posted a 4-2 record with a 2.05 GAA and a .924 SV% in Round 1.

**Mats Zuccarello:** Has recorded a point in all six games played this postseason (2-7=9) and owns a five-game point streak (2-4=6)...Recorded 19th postseason assist with Wild in Game 3 vs. COL (5/9), passing Mikko Koivu for third-most in franchise history.

## STANLEY CUP PLAYOFF NOTES

- In its 25th anniversary season, the Wild is making its 15th postseason appearance. Among franchises to debut in the 1990s or later, Minnesota is the fourth with 15-plus Stanley Cup Playoffs appearances through its first 25 seasons (also SJS: 19, OTT: 16 & NSH: 16).
- The Wild is making its 12th playoff appearance since 2013, the most among all teams.
- Minnesota is one of four franchises in NHL history that has claimed all of its series wins as the lower-seeded team (5 of 5). The others: Columbus (2 of 2), New York Americans (1 of 1) and Seattle (1 of 1).
- Is playing its fourth head-to-head playoff series against COL, following seven-game series wins in the 2014 First Round and 2003 Conference Quarterfinals and a six-game series loss during the 2008 Conference Quarterfinals.
- Has won three consecutive home games, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Five games in 2014).
- Has scored multiple goals in 15 straight playoff games (all six in 2025 and all nine this postseason), the longest active streak by any team and the longest in franchise history.
- Scored six goals in Game 1 vs. COL (5/3), tied for the franchise's second-highest single game playoff total.
- Won 41-of-65 face offs (63.1 pct.) in Game 1 vs. COL (5/3), the highest single-game faceoff percentage in franchise postseason history.
- Recorded a plus-14 even-strength goal differential in Round 1 vs. DAL, tops in the 2026 SCP, and allowed only five even-strength goals.
- Allowed 22 shots on goal in Game 5 at DAL(4/28), the team's lowest total in the postseason since 5/22/21 vs. VGK.
- Notched a plus-17 blocked shot differential (MIN 26, DAL 9) in Game 5 at DAL (4/28), the highest by any team this postseason and tied for the 6th highest playoff mark in the NHL since the 2006 postseason.
- Minnesota's victory in Game 4 vs. DAL marked the fifth overtime win at home in franchise history and first since Game 3 of the 2014 First Round.
- Game 3 marked the third double-overtime game in franchise history and the second-longest game overall, ending at 92:10
- The Wild won 34-of-28 face offs (55 pct.) in Game 2 at DAL (4/18), with six of eight Wild players who took draws winning 50 pct. or more
- Minnesota's six-goal total in Game 1 marked its highest ever in a postseason-opening game and tied for the second-highest single game goal total in Wild playoff history (7-2 win at VAN, 5/5/03).
- The Wild's five-goal differential in Game 1 at DAL tied for its largest in franchise postseason history (7-2 win at VAN, 5/5/03).
- Minnesota finished with 49 hits in Game 1 at DAL, the fourth-highest single game total in franchise playoff history.
- The Wild had five players record multiple points in Game 1 at DAL, the fourth time ever with as many in a single playoff game.

# REGULAR-SEASON TEAM NOTES



## LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranked second in the NHL with eight shutouts this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranked third in the NHL with 2.69 goals against/game since November 1.

- Went 43-3-10 (.857) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the second-best point percentage in the NHL.

## BY THE PERIOD

- Ranked eighth in the NHL with a plus-9 first-period goal differential this season and 10th by allowing 0.80 first-period goals per game.
- Ranked T-3rd in the NHL by allowing 0.88 second-period goals per game this season and fifth with a plus-18 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranked T-7th in the NHL by allowing 0.96 third-period goals per game and eighth with a plus-13 third-period goal differential.
- Ranked third in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW).

## OUT IN FRONT

- Scored first in 45 games this season, T-8th in the NHL.
- Owned a 33-6-6 record (.800) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 689-182-112 all-time record (.758) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

## STEERING THE SHIP

- The Wild owns 274 points (124-78-24) since John Hynes debuted as Head Coach on 11/28/23, the eighth-best mark in the NHL.

- Saved all 25 shots faced vs. Utah (3/10) to earn his 15th career shutout, tying Dwayne Roloson for third in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, Gustavsson (210 GP) became the second-fastest Swedish goaltender in NHL history to 15 career shutouts behind only Henrik Lundqvist (178 GP).
- Made a season-high 44 saves at COL (2/27), the fourth-highest save total of his NHL career.
- Appeared in 16 consecutive home games (15 starts) without a regulation loss (10-0-5) from Nov. 1 - Feb. 2, tied for the longest streak in franchise history (Dubnyk, 12-0-3, 2017-18 season).
- With a 30-save victory vs. DET (1/22), earned the 100th win of his NHL career.
- Recorded an assist at BUF (1/17) to push his career point total to five (1-4=5).
- Tied the franchise record for longest home point streak when recording a point in 11 straight starts earlier this season (7-0-4, 11/1/25 - 1/10/26). Appeared in the home game on Jan. 15 but did not register a decision, ending his streak at 11 (also N. Backstrom, 11-game home point streak in 2006-07, 8-0-3).
- Recorded an eight-game point streak (7-0-1) from Dec. 8 - Jan 2.
- Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history.
- Is 47-32-10 with a 2.68 GAA, .910 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks second in the NHL in road shutouts, T-5th in road SV% and T-7th in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 101-61-23 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with 15 shutouts, T-5th with a .912 SV%, and T-10th with a 2.61 GAA (min. 75 games).
