CALGARY FLAMES

All-Time Wild Record: 44-45-17 (26-18-10 at Xcel Energy Center, 18-27-7 at Calgary)

Calgary secured a 4-3 shootout victory in the series-opening game at the Saddledome (11/23) and a 5-4 win at Xcel Energy Center (1/25) in the second meeting...C Marco Rossi leads Minnesota with five points (1-4=5)...LW Matt Boldy owns three assists (0-3=3)...G Filip Gustavsson started the first game and saved 28-of-31 shots faced for the Wild...G Marc-Andre Fleury started the second contest and stopped 24-of-29 shots faced...C Martin Pospisil (2-1=3), C Yegor Sharangovich (1-2=3) and D MacKenzie Weegar (0-3=3) each own three points for Calgary...G Dan Vladar stopped 20-of-23 shots faced to earn the win for Calgary in the first game...G Dustin Wolf saved 21-of-25 shots to earn the victory in the second game.

WILD LEADERS: D Jared Spurgeon leads the Wild with 15 points (5-10=15) in 43 career games against Calgary...C Gustav Nyquist has 14 points (5-9=14) in 23 games...LW Marcus Johansson owns 13 points (4-9=13) in 21 games...LW Marcus Foligno has 12 points (10-2=12) in 26 games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 14-8-1 with a 2.25 GAA, a .926 SV% and five shutouts in 24 career starts vs. Calgary...Gustavsson is 5-0-2 with a 1.43 GAA, a .953 SV% and two shutouts in eight games (seven starts).

FLAMES LEADERS: C Mikael Backlund leads Calgary with 20 points (7-13=20) in 43 career matches against the Wild...C Nazem Kadri owns 19 points (8-11=19) in 36 games...LW Jonathan Huberdeau owns 16 points (7-9=16) in 22 games...D **Rasmus Andersson** (2-10=12 in 17 games) and Weegar (2-10=12 in 14 games) each have 12 points.

FLAMES GOALIES: Vladar is 2-1-1 with a 3.13 GAA and .889 SV% in four starts vs. Minnesota...Wolf is 1-0-0 with a 3.65 FAA and a .842 SV% in two games (one start).

FAST FACTS: The Wild is 15-9-3 in its last 27 games at the Saddledome after starting the all-time series 3-18-4.

CLINCHING SCENARIOS

- The Wild can clinch a berth in the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoff with a win (regulation or extra time) at Calgary (4/11).
- Minnesota's "magic number" to clinch a playoff berth is three points (points earned by Minnesota plus points not earned by Calgary).
- The Wild can clinch the first Wild Card position in the Western Conference by earning four points in its last three games.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Earned a 8-7 overtime victory vs. SJS (4/9), tied for the second-highest singlegame goal total in franchise history...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 49 road points (22-12-5) and a .628 road point percentage and T-4th with 22 road wins...T-5th in the NHL with a .903 team save percentage this season...Has scored first in 44 games this season, tied for second-most in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Owns seven points (1-6=7) in his last two games, the second-highest point total in a two-game span in Wild history (Kaprizov, 4-4-8, 2/19-2/20/24)... Set a career high with four assists (0-4=4) vs. SJS (4/9), T-2nd highest singlegame assist total in Wild history...Leads the Wild with a career-high 71 points (26- $\overline{45}$ =71), 26 goals and 45 assists and ranks second with six PPG...Is the eighth player in franchise history to record 70-plus points in a single season...T-3rd in the NHL with nine GWG and seventh with 264 shots this season...Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Currently at 298 career points (135-163=298)...Returned from injury to score four goals (4-0=4) vs. SJS (4/9), setting a new career-high and becoming the second player in franchise history with four-plus goals in a game (Gaborik, five goals vs. NYG, 12/20/07)...Registered his third career hat trick vs. SJS (4/9), tying Zach Parise and Matt Boldy for third-most in franchise history...Moved his career goal total to 135 vs. SJS (4/9), overtaking Jason Zucker (132) for fifth-most in franchise history.

Brock Faber: Scored his ninth goal of the season vs. SJS (4/9), besting his careerhigh mark set last season, and now leads Wild defensemen in goals scored this season...Ranks fourth in the NHL at 25:21 TOI/G this season...Owns a 25:05 TOI/G average in 159 career games, tied for the second-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since 2000-01.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Recorded his 70th career overtime victory vs. SJS (4/9), moving past Martin Brodeur (69) for most in NHL history.

Marcus Foligno: Ninth in the NHL with 243 hits this season...Owns 28 points (13-15=28) this season, the second-highest total of his NHL career.

Freddy Gaudreau: Ranks T-4th on the team with 18 goals this season, one shy of tying his career high set in 2022-23...Leads the team with 510 face off wins and ranks T-3rd with five PPG.

Filip Gustavsson: Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season...For the season, is 30-18-6 and ranks T-3rd in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.915) and T-6th in wins...Per NHL Stats, his five shutouts this season are tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).

Marcus Johansson: Scored his 10th goal of the season vs. SJS (4/9)...0wns 16 points (5-11=16) in 22 games since 2/22.

Kirill Kaprizov: Returned from injury to record three points (2-1=3) vs. SJS (4/9), including the GWG in overtime...Reached 200 career assists vs. SJS (4/9) and moved within one assist of tying Jonas Brodin and Zach Parise (201) for ninth in franchise history...Extended his franchise record with his 10th career OTG vs. SJS (4/9)... Notched his 39th career game with three-plus points vs. SJS (4/9), furthering his franchise record...Ranks second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-30=55) and fourth in assists (30).

Marco Rossi: Reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SJS (4/9)... Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6), his third GWG of the season...Leads the team in PPG (seven), ranks second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24)...Has played in 164 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 299 career assists...Currently at 132 career powerplay points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history...Leads Wild defensemen and ranks T-6th among Wild skaters with 32 points (7-25=32).

Yakov Trenin: Owns 231 hits this season, which ranks 14th in the NHL and establishes a new career-high.

Mats Zuccarello: Recorded three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (4/9), his ninth game with three-plus assists in a Wild sweater (second-most in franchise history)...Played in the 900th game of his NHL career vs. DAL (4/6)...Ranks third on the team in assists (33) and fourth in points (18-33=51) this season.

TEAM NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 29-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 21-4-2 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 44 games this season, tied for second-most in the NHL, and holds a 30-11-3 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

• The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 49 road points (22-12-5) and a .628 road point percentage and T-4th with 22 road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-4-2 this season (.773) when scoring first in a road game, the sixth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild is 39-8-5 (.798) when scoring two-plus goals in regulation this season, the second-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild is 31-2-4 (.892) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation this season.
- The Wild is 24-16-0 (.600) when allowing fewer than 30 shots on goal this season, the fourth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Wild ranks fifth in the NHL with a 28.8 power-play percentage (17-59) since February 8. Minnesota's 17 total power-play goals rank T-6th in the NHL during that time frame.
- Since March 11, the Wild ranks fourth in the NHL with a 85.7 penalty-kill percentage (30-35).

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** returned from injury to record three points (2-1=3) vs. SJS (4/9), including the GWG in overtime.
- Reached 200 career assists vs. SJS (4/9) and moved within one assist of tying Jonas Brodin and Zach Parise (201) for ninth in franchise
- Notched his 39th career game with three-plus points vs. SJS (4/9). furthering his franchise record.
- Ranks second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-30=55) and fourth in assists (30).
- Recorded his 50th point of the season with a goal vs. CHI (12/23), established a new franchise mark for fewest games to 50 points in a season (34 GP), besting his previous mark set in 2021-22 (38 GP).
- Recorded 56 goals (tied with Sam Reinhart for most in the NHL) and 112 points (56-56=112, sixth in NHL) during the 2024 calendar year.
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) and posted 28:03 of TOI vs. VGK (12/15), the second-highest mark of his career (29:09, OT win vs. MTL, 12/21/23) and the highest in a non-OT game. The total was also the highest by a forward in a non-OT game in Wild history.
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. PHI, tying Marian Gaborik (29 GP in 2006-07) for the franchise mark of fewest games to 20 goals in a season.
- With his first assist at ANA (12/6), reached the 40-point landmark in his 25th game played this season, fastest in franchise history.
- Kaprizov reached 370 career points (176-194=370) with his first assist at ANA (12/6) and surpassed Ryan Suter (55-314=369) for sole possession of fifth place on the Wild's all-time scoring list.
- Kaprizov scored his 61st career PPG vs. Nashville (11/30), moving past Mikko Koivu for second on the Wild's all-time PPG list (Parise, 69 PPG).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) had more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).
- With two goals (2-0=2) at STL (11/19), became one of 19 players in NHL history (29 total occurrences) to record 12 multi-point outings in a team's first 18 games played. He is the first to achieve the feat since Peter Forsberg (2005-06).
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. MTL, became the fastest player in franchise history (16 GP) to reach 30 points in a season, shattering the mark he set in 2022-23 (22 GP). Also became the ninth NHL player born outside of North America to reach the 30-point mark in 16 or fewer games.
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby - 235 games; McDavid - 270 games; Ovechkin - 272 games; Kaprizov - 292 games; Malkin - 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 40 career multi-assist games, needs one more to tie Jared Spurgeon (41) for third-most in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

Has notched a point in 15-of-18 road games played this season (11-19=30), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SIS (4/9)
- Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6), his third GWG of the season.
- Leads the team in PPG (seven), ranks second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24).
- Has played in 164 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24.
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), T-2nd highest single-game assist total in Wild history, to establish new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
