

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 19, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] vs. BUFFALO SABRES [2]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames wrapped up a back-to-back set against the Buffalo Sabres on Wednesday night at KeyBank Center, rolling to a 6–2 victory. Calgary jumped ahead 2–0 in the first courtesy of goals from Rasmus Andersson and Joel Farabee, but Buffalo clawed back in the second countering with tallies from Mattias Samuelsson and Tage Thompson to tie the game twos through 40 minutes. The Flames took over from there, first with Morgan Frost restoring Calgary's lead just 2:02 into the third before Mikael Backlund and Joel Farabee's second of the night extended the advantage to 5–2, while Matt Coronato capped the win with his seventh of the year at 17:49. Andersson finished with a goal and two assists, Farabee scored twice, while Johnathan Huberdeau, Nazem Kadri, Yegor Sharangovich, Morgan Frost and Matt Coronato all posted multi-point nights. Devin Cooley was sharp with 28 saves, outdueling Buffalo's Colten Ellis, to earn his first win as a Flame.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Stars. Calgary posted a record of 0-2-1 against Dallas during the 2024-25 season.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 0-9-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 2-12-1 against Western Conference opponents.

BEECH DAY:

On Tuesday afternoon the Calgary Flames claimed forward John Beecher off waivers from the Boston Bruins. Beecher, a native of Elmira, NY, had skated in six games for the Boston Bruins, scoring one goal at the time of Calgary's claim. Beecher was selected in the first round (30th overall) of the 2019 NHL Draft by Boston after three seasons at the University of Michigan where he would be named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2020 and help Michigan win the Big Ten Championship in 2022. The 24-year-old has 137 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 11 goals and 11 assists for 22 points. Beecher made his Calgary Flames debut on Wednesday in Buffalo, skating in 12:47 of ice-time through 17 shifts, posting two shots.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

With his game-opening goal on Wednesday night in Buffalo, Rasmus Andersson became just the third Flames defenseman in the past 15 years to score on consecutive days, joining Noah Hanifin (Mar. 6–7, 2021) and Mark Giordano (3x most recently: Jan. 18–19, 2018). Andersson added a pair of assists against the Sabres to record his eighth career three-point game, tying Dion Phaneuf and Dougie Hamilton for the sixth-most such outings by a Flames blueliner. Across Calgary's back-to-back set in Chicago and Buffalo, Andersson posted a team-leading five points (2G, 3A) and has now recorded points in three straight games and in four of his last five.

RING OF FIRE:

With their six-goal outburst in Buffalo on Wednesday night, the Calgary Flames have now won 40 straight games when scoring four or more goals. Last season, the Flames went a perfect 18-0-0 in such contests and closed the 2024–25 campaign with four consecutive four-plus goal performances: Apr. 11 vs. MIN (4–2 W), Apr. 13 vs. SJS (5–2 W), Apr. 15 vs. VGK (5–4 SOW), and Apr. 17 at LAK (5–1 W).

SHARKNADO:

Yegor Sharangovich recorded a pair of assists in Buffalo on Wednesday, marking his 99th and 100th helpers in the NHL. With the milestone, he becomes just the sixth skater of Belarusian descent in league history to reach the 100-assist mark, joining: Mikhail Grabovski (171), Ruslan Salei (159), Andrei Kostitsyn (119), Sergei Kostitsyn (109) and Vladimir Tsyplakov (101). Sharangovich currently the highest-scoring active Belarusian in the NHL.

KEEP HIS COOL:

Devin Cooley turned aside 28 of the 30 shots he faced on Wednesday in Buffalo to earn his first win in Flames threads. Cooley has appeared in six games for the Flames this season and leads the NHL in both goals-against average (1.80) and save-percentage (.935) among goaltenders who have played at least six games (as of Nov. 21).

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Flames forward Blake Coleman is one of six Texas-born skaters in the NHL this season, and tonight he is set to appear in his 27th career game against his childhood team. The Plano, TX native — born just a 30-minute drive from Dallas — has recorded seven goals and seven assists for 14 points in 26 career meetings with the Stars. Coleman ranks as the fourth-highest scoring Texas-born player in NHL history, trailing only Brian Leetch (1,028), Seth Jones (450), and Tyler Myers (400). Since joining the Flames ahead of the 2021–22 season, he has also tallied 17 game-winning goals, the most by any Calgary skater over that span.

JOEL-SCORER:

With a pair of goals on Wednesday in Buffalo, Joel Farabee earned his seventh-career multi-goal game, and first as a member of the Calgary Flames. Farabee now has 97-career goals and is looking to become the fourth member of the 2018 NHL draft class to reach 100-career goals with the most recent player to do so being teammate Yegor Sharangovich.



BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Calgary Flames are prepared begin their fifth back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season and will travel to Vancouver following tonight’s contest. Calgary’s last back-to-back set came earlier this week during their last two contests when they faced Chicago at the United Center on Tuesday before heading to the KeyBank Center in Buffalo on Wednesday. The Flames have four more back-to-back sets remaining this season after tonight and tomorrow, with their next coming on January 7th when they face the Montreal Canadiens at the Bell Centre before heading to TD Garden to face the Boston Bruins the following night.

HUBY DOO:

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 793 points in his NHL career and is just seven-shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,013) and Mark Scheifele (831) There are 25-active skaters who has surpassed 800 points in the NHL.


Huberdeau recorded two assists in Calgary’s last outing on Wednesday in Buffalo and has now recorded at least a point in 15-straight road games against the Sabres dating back to the 2015-16 season, which is the second-longest active streak against a single opponent. The only player with a longer streak is Leon Draisaitl (16 GP vs. VAN).

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The two captains of tonight’s opponents Mikael Backlund and Jamie Benn were teammates on the Kelowna Rockets during the 2008-09 season. The Rockets would go on to win the WHL Championship that year in six games over the Calgary Hitmen and advance to the 2009 Memorial Cup, where they would fall in the finals to the Windsor Spitfires. The Rockets Head Coach that season was Flames Head Coach Ryan Huska.

The Flames scored four goals in a period for the first time this season. Calgary did so three times in 2024-25 (April 17 at LAK, March 20 at NJD and March 4 at PHI).
