DETROIT RED WINGS

All-Time Wild Record: 27-31-12 (15-11-9 at Grand Casino Arena, 12-20-3 at Detroit)

2025-26: The Wild won the series-opening game, 4-3, in overtime at Grand Casino Arena...D **Quinn Hughes** (0-3=3), LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (2-1=3) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (2-1=3) all recorded three points...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 31-of-34 shots to earn the win for Minnesota...LW **Lucas Raymond** led the Red Wings with two goals...LW **James van Riemsdyk** also scored a goal for Detroit...G **Cam Talbot** stopped 35-of-39 shots faced for the Red Wings.

WILD LEADERS: Zuccarello leads Minnesota with 21 points (8-13=21) in 26 career games against Detroit...LW **Marcus Johansson** owns 20 points (6-14=20) in 34 games...D **Jeff Petry** has 17 points (4-13=27) in 38 matches...RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** has 14 points (6-8=14) in 24 games.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 3-3-0 with a 2.54 GAA and .894 SV% in six starts againsts Detroit...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced Detroit.

RED WINGS LEADERS: RW **Patrick Kane** leads the Red Wings with 55 career points (25-30=55) in 61 career games against the Wild...LW **David Perron** owns 40 points (17-23=40) in 51 games...D **Justin Faulk** has 23 points (3-20=23) in 40 games...LW **J.T. Compher** has 18 points (7-11=18) in 31 games.

RED WINGS GOALIES: Talbot is 9-8-3 with a 2.51 GAA and a .922 SV% in 20 career starts against Minnesota...G **John Gibson** is 7-8-4 with a 2.67 GAA, a .920 SV% and three shutouts in 20 starts.

CONNECTIONS: Tarasenko collected 33 points (11-22=33) in 80 games with Detroit during the 2024-25 season...Petry is an Ann Arbor, Mich., native, played three seasons and Michigan State (2007-10), and notched 32 points (4-28=32) in two seasons (2023-25) with the Red Wings...F **Robby Fabbri** collected 127 points (66-62=127) in 234 games across five seasons (2019-24) with Detroit...C **Michael McCarron** is a Grosse Pointe, Mich., native... Detroit Head Coach **Todd McLellan** served as Head Coach for the IHL's Cleveland Lumberjacks for one season (2000-01) and Head Coach for the AHL's Houston Aeros for four seasons (2001-05) when each team served as the Wild's primary minor league affiliate...Red Wings Assistant Coach **Alex Tanguay** spent two seasons as an Assistant Coach for the Iowa Wild (2019-21)...Faulk is from South St. Paul and played one season (2010-11) at the University of Minnesota...Talbot posted a record of 51-20-9 with a 2.71 GAA, a .913 SV% and five shutouts in 82 games (81 starts) over two seasons with Minnesota (2020-22).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 9-3-0 in its last 12 games against Detroit (since 2/22/19), outscoring the Red Wings 48-33...The Wild has earned a point in eight of its last 12 games in Detroit (6-4-2)...Minnesota has earned a point in 18 of the last 22 meetings at Grand Casino Arena (12-4-6) and is 8-2-0 in the last 10 games played in Saint Paul.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has clinched its 15th overall appearance in the Stanley Cup Playoffs and 12th in the last 14 seasons...At 43-21-12, ranks third in the Western Conference with 98 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 76 games in franchise history...Has scored first in 45 games, tied for third-most in the NHL this season...Leads the NHL with a .905 team SV% and ranks second with eight shutouts (NYI, nine), tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences)...Ranks second in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and with 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW)...Ranks third in the NHL with 60 PPG, fourth with a 24.7 PP% (60/243) and fifth with 15.5 blocked shots per game.

Matt Boldy: Is the fourth player in Wild history to hit the 40-goal mark in a single season, joining Kirill Kaprizov (4x), Eric Staal and Marian Gaborik...Owns 79 points (40-39=79) on the season, a new career high, and can join Kaprizov (3x), Gaborik (1x) and Kevin Fiala (1x) as the only players in franchise history with a 80-point season...For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG and T-6th with 40 goals...Ranks T-1st on the Wild in goals, second in points and PPG (11), T-2nd in plus-minus (plus-17) and third in assists.

Bobby Brink: Owns 98 career points (38-60=98).

Brock Faber: Owns a career-high 50 points (15-35=50) and needs one point to tie Ryan Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) and Quinn Hughes (51 points, 2025-26 season) for the single-season franchise record among defensemen...For the season, ranks T-8th among NHL defensemen in goals and third among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:09) and 11th in TOI/G (24:41)...His 13 even-strength goals rank T-5th among NHL defensemen this season and mark a single-season franchise record among Wild defensemen.

Filip Gustavsson: Became the fourth goaltender in franchise history to reach 100 wins with a 30-save victory vs. VAN (4/2)...Owns a point in 14 of his last 18 games overall (13-4-1) and 15 of his last 19 starts (13-4-2)...In 34 games (33 starts) since Nov. 16, is 23-6-4 and ranks fourth in the NHL with a .916 SV%, T-4th with a 2.35 GAA and three shutouts, and T-5th in wins (min. 14 GP)...For the season, holds a 27-12-6 record and ranks T-3rd in shutouts (four), T-7th in SV% (.910), eighth in GAA (2.56) and T-9th in wins.

Ryan Hartman: Has tallied multiple goals in consecutive games (vs. VAN, 4/2; at OTT, 4/5) for the first time in his career and owns a career-long, four-game goal streak (6-1=7)...Owns an active five-game point streak (6-2=8) and 11 points (7-4=11) in his last nine games...With his second goal at OTT (4/5), reached 119 with the Wild and tied Andrew Brunette for ninth-most in franchise history.

Quinn Hughes: Posted his 68th assist of the season at OTT (4/3), tying Phil Housley (68 in 1992-93) and Brian Leetch (68 in 1991-92) for the most assists through 70 games in a season by an American defenseman...Owns 51 points (4-47=51) in 44 games with the Wild this season, tied with Ryan Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) for the single-season record among franchise defensemen...His 47 assists with the Wild this season mark a single-season record among defensemen...Reached 50 points (4-46=50) in his 43rd game with Minnesota (vs. VAN, 4/2), becoming the fastest player to the 50-point mark in franchise history...Since Jan. 17, ranks T-2nd in the NHL (T-1st among defensemen) with 32 assists and 13th (third among defensemen) in points (3-32=35)...Leads NHL defensemen this season with 68 assists (T-4th among all skaters) and 33 PPP (2-31=33, T-7th among skaters) and ranks T-4th with 74 points (6-68=74)...Leads all NHL skaters in TOI/G (27:43) and even strength TOI/G (23:23) and ranks third in power-play TOI/G (4:14) this season...In 44 games since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (third among all skaters) with 47 assists and ranks second (T-12th among skaters) with 51 points (4-47=51).

Marcus Johansson: Currently owns 199 career goals, can become the 33rd Swedish-born player to reach the 200-goal milestone.

Kirill Kaprizov: With a goal vs. VAN (4/2), reached the 40-goal mark for the fourth season in his career. Per NHL Stats, he tied Nikita Kucherov for the third most 40-goal seasons by an active player born outside North America (Ovechkin, 14x; Draisaitl, 6x)...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 16 PPG, T-6th with 40 goals, and T-8th with 255 shots...Ranks first on Wild in points, PPG, GWG (6) and shots, T-1st in goals and second in assists.

Jared Spurgeon: Owns 436 points (123-313=436), two shy of passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history...Needs two assists to pass Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Played in his 900th career NHL game at OTT (4/4)...Ranks fourth on the Wild in goals (21).

Yakov Trenin: Owns an NHL-leading 380 hits on the season, a Wild single-season record and the fourth-highest single-season total since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06...Needs three hits to pass Matt Martin (382, 2014-15) for third and four hits to pass Jeremy Lauzon (383 hits, 2023-24).

Jesper Wallstedt: Owns a 9-3-2 record against teams currently in a playoff position through games played April 4 and leads the NHL with a .931 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP)...Is 9-3-4 with a 2.46 GAA, .920 SV% and two shutouts in 16 road starts this season...Is 16-8-6 on the season, tied with Kaapo Kakkonen (16 wins, 2020-21) for the single-season record by a Wild rookie goaltender...Ranks second in the NHL with a .914 SV% and T-3rd with four shutouts this season.

STANLEY CUP PLAYOFF NOTES

- In its 25th anniversary season, the Wild is making its 15th postseason appearance. Among franchises to debut in the 1990s or later, Minnesota is the fourth with 15-plus Stanley Cup Playoffs appearances through its first 25 seasons (also SJS: 19, OTT: 16 & NSH: 16).
- The Wild is making its 12th playoff appearance since 2013, the most among all teams.
- Minnesota is one of four franchises in NHL history that has claimed all of its series wins as the lower-seeded team (4 of 4). The others: Columbus (2 of 2), New York Americans (1 of 1) and Seattle (1 of 1).
- Kirill Kaprizov (15-6=21 in 25 GP) needs two goals to overtake Zach Parise (16) for the most in Wild playoff history. After claiming the club's regular-season goals record March 3, Kaprizov can become the 16th player to hold an active franchise's all-time outright regular-season and playoff goals records – Filip Forsberg (NSH), Alex Ovechkin (WSH) and Mark Scheifele (WPG/ATL) are the only active players to do so.

TEAM NOTES



LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks second in the NHL with eight shutouts this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks second in the NHL with 2.61 goals against/game since November 1.

- Is 41-2-10 (.868) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the second-best point percentage in the NHL.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks T-7th in the NHL with a plus-10 first-period goal differential this season and by allowing .78 first-period goals per game.
- Ranks third in the NHL by allowing 0.87 second-period goals per game this season and T-5th with a plus-14 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks T-4th in the NHL with a plus-16 third-period goal differential and T-6th by allowing 0.92 third-period goals per game.
- Ranks second in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW).

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 45 games this season, T-3rd in the NHL.
- Owns a 33-6-6 record (.800) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 689-182-112 all-time record (.758) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

STEERING THE SHIP

- The Wild owns 268 points (122-74-24) since John Hynes debuted as Head Coach on 11/28/23, the seventh-best mark in the NHL.

- Since Dec. 14, ranks third in the NHL in PPG/G (0.82), PPG (36), PP% (27.1, 36/133) and shots per game (30.6).
- The Wild scored a power-play goal in a season-long eight consecutive games from 1/29 - 3/3, tied for the second-longest streak in the NHL this season and tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- The Wild ranks second the NHL with 104 assists and fourth with 126 points (22-104=126) recorded by defensemen since Dec. 14.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 43-21-12, ranks third in the Western Conference with 98 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 76 games in franchise history.
- Is 40-15-9 (.695) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in point percentage, T-4th in points (89) and fifth in wins.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.912), second in team GAA (2.56) and T-3rd in goal differential (plus-49).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, 22).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 16 PPG, T-6th with 40 goals, and T-8th with 255 shots.
- Ranks first on Wild in points, PPG, GWG (6) and shots, T-1st in goals and second in assists.
- Reached the 40-goal mark for the fourth season in his career with a goal vs. VAN (4/2). Per NHL Stats, he tied Nikita Kucherov for the third most 40-goal seasons by an active player born outside North America (Ovechkin, 14x; Draisaitl, 6x).
- Tied his season high with a plus-3 rating vs. VAN (4/2).
- Scored a goal in six consecutive home games from 1/29 - 3/12, tied for longest home goal streak in Wild history.
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. UTA (3/10), reached 242 career assists and moved past Pierre-Marc Bouchard (241) for fifth in franchise history.
- Scored the 220th goal of his NHL career vs. TBL (3/3), moving past Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record.

- With an overtime assist at NSH (2/4), recorded his ninth overtime point (4-5=9) of 2025-26 and tied Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl (both w/ 9 in 2024-25) for the most overtime points in a single season in NHL history.
- Scored his fourth OTG of the season vs. MTL (2/2), T-1st in the NHL, and now ranks T-1st in the NHL since debuting in 2020-21 with a franchise-record 14 career OTG.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 153).
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded an eight-game point streak (7-4=11) from 1/29 - 3/3, his longest of the season.
- Kaprizov posted multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12) from 1/17 - 1/24, marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.

A QUINN-TESSENTIAL ADDITION

- **Quinn Hughes** posted his 68th assist of the season at OTT (4/3), tying Phil Housley (68 in 1992-93) and Brian Leetch (68 in 1991-92) for the most assists through 70 games in a season by an American defenseman.
- Owns 51 points (4-47=51) in 44 games with the Wild this season, tied with Ryan Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) for the single-season record among franchise defensemen.
- His 47 assists with the Wild this season mark a single-season record among defensemen.
- Tied his season high with a plus-4 rating vs. VAN (4/2).
- Reached 50 points (4-46=50) in his 43rd game with Minnesota (vs. VAN, 4/2), becoming the fastest player to the 50-point mark in franchise history.
- Since Jan. 17, ranks T-2nd in the NHL (T-1st among defensemen) with 32 assists and 13th (third among defensemen) in points (3-32=35).
- Leads NHL defensemen this season with 68 assists (T-4th among all skaters) and 33 PPP (2-31=33, T-7th among skaters) and ranks T-4th with 74 points (6-68=74).

- Owns 79 points (40-39=79) on the season, a new career high, and can join Kaprizov (3x), Gaborik (1x) and Kevin Fiala (1x) as the only players in franchise history with a 80-point season.
- For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG and T-6th with 40 goals.
- Ranks T-1st on the Wild in goals, second in points and PPG (11), T-2nd in plus-minus (plus-17) and third in assists.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** owns a 9-3-2 record against teams currently in a playoff position through games played April 4 and leads the NHL with a .931 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP).
- Is 9-3-4 with a 2.46 GAA, .920 SV% and two shutouts in 16 road starts this season.
- Is 16-8-6 on the season, tied with Kaapo Kahkonen (16 wins, 2020-21) for the single-season record by a Wild rookie goaltender.
- Ranks second in the NHL with a .914 SV% and T-3rd with four shutouts this season.
- Posted 39 saves at EDM (1/31), tied for the second-highest single-game total of his career and season, while tallying his first career assist, the 13th goalie in team history to do so.
- Made 29 saves vs. CHI (1/27) while also stopping all three Blackhawks shootout attempts to surpass Darcy Kuemper (2013-14) and Kaapo Kahkonen (2021-22) for the second-most wins by a rookie goaltender in a season in Wild history.

- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Went 7-0-0 from in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.
- Became the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21).
- Set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2) from 10/13 - 12/2, besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09).
- Wallstedt's 10-game point streak from 10/13 - 12/2 is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history.
- Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old).
- Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.
- Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie.
- Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** became the fourth goaltender in franchise history to reach 100 wins with a 30-save victory vs. VAN (4/2).
- Owns a point in 14 of his last 18 games overall (13-4-1) and 15 of his last 19 starts (13-4-2).
- In 34 games (33 starts) since Nov. 16, is 23-6-4 and ranks fourth in the NHL with a .916 SV%, T-4th with a 2.35 GAA and three shutouts, and T-5th in wins (min. 14 GP).
- For the season, holds a 27-12-6 record and ranks T-3rd in shutouts (four), T-7th in SV% (.910), eighth in GAA (2.56) and T-9th in wins.
- Saved all 25 shots faced vs. Utah (3/10) to earn his 15th career shutout, tying Dwayne Roloson for third in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, Gustavsson (210 GP) became the second-fastest Swedish goaltender in NHL history to 15 career shutouts behind only Henrik Lundqvist (178 GP).
- Made a season-high 44 saves at COL (2/27), the fourth-highest save total of his NHL career.
- Appeared in 16 consecutive home games (15 starts) without a regulation loss (10-0-5) from Nov. 1 - Feb. 2, tied for the longest streak in franchise history (Dubnyk, 12-0-3, 2017-18 season).
- With a 30-save victory vs. DET (1/22), earned the 100th win of his NHL career.
- Recorded an assist at BUF (1/17) to push his career point total to five (1-4=5).
- Tied the franchise record for longest home point streak when recording a point in 11 straight starts earlier this season (7-0-4, 11/1/25 - 1/10/26). Appeared in the home game on Jan. 15 but did not register a decision, ending his streak at 11 (also N. Backstrom, 11-game home point streak in 2006-07, 8-0-3).
- Recorded an eight-game point streak (7-0-1) from Dec. 8 - Jan 2.
- Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history.
- Is 46-30-10 with a 2.61 GAA, .913 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks second in the NHL in road shutouts, third in road SV% and fourth in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 100-59-23 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-3rd in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV%, fourth with 15 shutouts and T-8th with a 2.58 GAA (min. 75 games).
