#### **CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS**

All-Time Wild Record: 57-29-6 (31-12-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 26-17-3 at Chicago)

**2024-25:** Minnesota went 3-0-1 against Chicago last season...The Blackhawks earned a 2-1 overtime victory in the series-opening game at United Center (11/10) before the Wild posted a 3-2 win in the second game in St. Paul (11/29), a 4-3 win at Grand Casino Arena in the third game (12/23), and a 4-2 victory in Chicago in the fourth meeting (1/26)...LW **Matt Boldy** (1-4=5) led Minnesota with five points in the season series...D **Jared Spurgeon** (4-0=4), LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-3=4) and LW **Marcus Foligno** (2-2=4) registered four points each...G **Filip Gustavsson** went 2-0-1 with a 2.31 GAA and a .904 SV% after starting the first, third and fourth games...G Marc-Andre Fleury saved 21-of-23 shots faced to earn the win for the Wild in the second game...C **Ryan Donato** (2-1=3) and C **Connor Bedard** (1-2=3) led Chicago with three points each in the season series...G Petr Mrazek went 1-2-0 with a 2.35 GAA and a .921 SV% while making three starts for Chicago...G **Arvid Soderblom** 23-of-26 shots faced in the third contest for the Blackhawks.

**WILD LEADERS:** RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads the Wild with 33 points (20-13=33) in 36 career games against Chicago...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 25 points (8-17=25) in 27 career matches...Spurgeon owns 21 points (7-14=21) in 45 games...Kaprizov owns 16 points (6-10=16) in 13 games.

**WILD GOALIES:** Gustavsson is 5-0-1 with a 1.83 GAA and a .931 SV% in six career starts against the Blackhawks...G **Jesper Wallstedt** earned his first career win and shutout by saving all 24 shots faced at CHI (4/7/24) in the second start of his career (and only against the Blackhawks).

**BLACKHAWKS LEADERS:** LW **Andre Burakovsky** leads Chicago with 18 career points (4-14=18) in 30 games against the Wild...LW **Teuvo Teravainen** (4-10=14 in 25 games) and LW **Nick Foligno** (8-6=14 in 30 games) each own 14 points...Donato has 11 points (4-7=11) in 23 games.

**BLACKHAWKS GOALIES:** G **Spencer Knight** has appeared in relief in one game vs. the Wild...Soderblom is 0-2-0 with a 3.55 GAA and a .889 SV%.

**CONNECTIONS:** C **Ryan Hartman** was selected by Chicago in the first round (30th overall) of the 2013 NHL Draft and collected 57 points (27-30=57) in 141 games during four seasons (2014-18) with the Blackhawks...C **Vinnie Hinostroza** is a Chicago native and was selected by Chicago in the sixth round (No. 169 overall) in the 2012 NHL Draft and collected 51 points (17-34=51) in 123 games...Donato tallied 39 points (18-21=39) in 84 games in parts of two seasons with Minnesota (2018-20)...D **Wyatt Kaiser** is from Andover and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota-Duluth (2020-23)...D **Sam Rinzel** is from Chanhassen and played collegiately at the University of Minnesota...C **Oliver Moore** is from Mounds View and played collegiately at the University of Minnesota...Nick Foligno is the older brother of Wild LW **Marcus Foligno**.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota's 57 all-time wins against Chicago are its third-most against an opponent...The Wild has earned points in 16 consecutive meetings (15-0-1) against the Blackhawks dating back to 2/4/20...Minnesota has earned a point in 11 consecutive games played at Grand Casino Arena (10-0-1) dating back to 2/10/18...The Wild has earned points in eight consecutive games played at United Center (6-0-1) since 1/21/22...In 2015-16, the Wild became the first team to win every game in a season series of at least five contests against Chicago since the Boston Bruins went 8-0-0 in 1938-39.

### **NOTES & MILESTONES**

Team: Recorded shutouts in each of its last two games, marking second time in franchise history posting consecutive shutouts with with two different starting goaltenders (Gustavsson/Wallstedt - 11/21-11/23/25; Fernandez/Roloson - 2/10-2/12/03)...Owns an active eight-game point streak (7-0-1), the team's longest run since a 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23... The Wild's current five-game winning streak (5-0-0) is its longest since a six-game run from 12/10 - 12/21/22...Is 9-1-1 (.864) in November, leading the NHL in wins and points (19)...Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team GAA (1.51) and team SV% (.947) and ranks second with a plus-18 goal differential... Since 11/7, Minnesota has not trailed in regulation for eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 480 minutes...The Wild has scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests, extending its franchise record. The run is tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season...Has scored first in 15 games this season, T-2nd in the NHL...Leads the NHL with five shutouts. **Matt Boldy:** With three points (2-1=3) and a plus-3 rating at PIT (11/21), pushed his career totals to 115-154=269 (307 GP) and moved past P.M. Bouchard (77-190=267)in 425 GP) for the second-most points in franchise history before age 25...Notched his 21st career game with three-plus points at PIT (11/21), tying M. Zuccarello for fourth in franchise history...Since Nov. 6, owns eight goals (T-2nd in the NHL) and 12 points (T-12th in the NHL) in nine games...T-1st on team in in goals (13) and second in points (13-12=25) and assists (12)...Ranks T-6th in the NHL in goals (13), T-8th with 11 PPP (5-6=11) and T-9th with five PPG.

**Zeev Bulum:** Owns eight power-play points (2-6=8) this season, leading all NHL rookies and ranking T-2nd among NHL defensemen...Ranks fourth among NHL rookies with an 18:56 TOI/G and T-4th with eight assists and 11 points (3-8=11).

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Posted two points (1-1=2) and a season-high plus-3 rating at PIT (11/21)...Ranks second in the NHL in faceoffs won (258) and total faceoffs taken (493). **Filip Gustavsson:** Stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history...T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts this season...Is 4-1-1 with a 1.95 GAA and .921 SV% in November.

**Brock Faber:** Scored his first career shorthanded goal at WPG (11/23), becoming the youngest defenseman in franchise history to do so (23 years, 93 days)...Posted two assists (0-2=2) and a season-high plus-3 rating at PIT (11/21)...Since 10/26, ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen in goals (five), T-9th in shots (34) and 12th in points (5-8=13).

Marcus Foligno: Currently at 897 career games played...11th in the NHL with 74 hits this season...Sixth in NHL with 41 hits in November.

**Marcus Johansson:** Leads the team with a plus-9 rating and ranks third in points (8-11=19) and goals (eight)...Owns 15 points (7-8=15) in his last 15 games.

**Kirill Kaprizov:** Owns an active four-game point streak (3-2=5)...T-5th in the NHL with six PPG, T-6th with 13 goals and T-10th with 78 shots...Leads the team in points (13-14=27) and assists and ranks T-1st in goals...Currently ranks second in franchise history with 68 career PPG, trailing only Zach Parise (69), and third with 141 power-play points (68-73=141), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145)...Currently owns 198 career goals, one shy of tying Parise (199) for third in franchise history.

Yakov Trenin: Has recorded a season-high eight hits (T-2nd highest in career) in consecutive games, at WPG (11/23) and at PIT (11/21)...Leads the NHL with 107 hits this season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Is 5-0-0 in his last five starts, stopping 163 of 168 shots faced for a 0.99 GAA and a .970 SV%...Owns shutouts in three out of his last four games...For the season, leads the NHL with three shutouts and ranks T-1st with a .935 SV% and second with a 1.94 GAA...Has set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (6-0-2), besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09)...With a 32-save shutout victory at WPG (11/23), became the youngest goaltender in franchise history (23 years, 9 days) to register a five-game winning streak, besting Darcy Kuemper (5 GP in 2013-14, 23 years and 302 days)...Also became the fourth-youngest goaltender in NHL history with a season-opening point streak of at least eight games (G. Fuhr - 8 GP in 84-85 w/ EDM; F. Potvin - 9 GP in 93-94 w/ TOR; P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - all 22 years old)... Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie...Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.

Danila Yurov: Scored his third goal of the season at WPG (11/23)...Ranks T-1st among NHL rookies with two GWG.

**Mats Zuccarello:** Currently at 698 career points (218-480=698)...Owns eight points (1-7=8) in eight games played since making his season debut 11/7 at NYI...Team is 7-0-1 with him in lineup.

### MILESTONE NIGHT FOR WORLEY

Minnesota Wild Head Athletic Trainer John Worley will work his 2,000th game of professional hockey when the Wild takes the ice on Wednesday night in Chicago.

A native of Ridley Park, Pa., Worley owns 33 seasons of experience in professional hockey, including 17 seasons (2009-26) with the Minnesota Wild. Wednesday's contest in Chicago will mark his 1,269th with the organization.

Worley previously spent 16 seasons (1993-2009) with the Philadelphia Flyers, including 10 seasons as Head Athletic Trainer. Worley will serve as an Athletic Trainer for the United States Men's National Team at the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milano-Cortina. He held the same position for the United States Men's National Team at the 2025 NHL 4 Nations Face-Off tournament, helping Team USA to a silver medal

### **WILD AT THE OLYMPICS**

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations Bill Guerin is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach John Hynes, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager Chris **Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer John Worley and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist Travis Green, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon Joel **Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

## **TEAM NOTES**



### ON THE POWER PLAY

- Ranks second in the NHL with 21 PPG and T-4th with a 25.6 PP% this season
- Through the first 23 games of a season, ranks third in franchise history in PP% and T-5th in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

### **LOCKING IT DOWN**

 Leads the NHL with 17 goals allowed and 1.55 goals against/game in November.

- Has killed 26-of-29 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks sixth in the NHL with a 89.7 PK% in that span.

- With a goal vs. PIT (10/30), became the third player in Wild history with a point in each of the team's first six home games to start a season (Zuccarello, 11 GP in 2023-24; Bouchard, 6 GP in 2005-06)
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Currently at 215 career assists, needs four assists to pass Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history.
- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possesion of second-most games in Wild history.

### THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- Filip Gustavsson stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts this season. Is 4-1-1 with a 1.95 GAA and .921 SV% in November.
- Is now 36-26-10 with a 2.54 GAA, .915 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks first in the NHL in road shutouts, T-2nd in road SV% and third in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 79-53-19 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-4th in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-5th with 13 shutouts (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
