

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****February 12, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [0] at NEW YORK RANGERS [2]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames finished off a four game Eastern Conference road swing on Monday night at Madison Square Garden for a meeting with the New York Rangers. Jacob Markstrom was tested early and stood tall with 11 opening frame saves as the two clubs were unable to solve the goaltenders through 20. New York would score the only goal of the second period as the Rangers held a 1-0 advantage through 40. In the third, the Flames pushed for an equalizer, but were unable to solve Igor Shesterkin and the Rangers added an empty netter to knock off Calgary 2-0.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Sharks. The Flames swept the season-series in 2022-23, outscoring the Sharks 20-9 over their four meetings.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 6-5-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 15-13-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST SEASON VERSUS SAN JOSE:

The Calgary Flames and San Jose Sharks met four times last season, with the Flames winning all four matchups. The Flames outscored the Sharks 20-9 over their four tilts, with Nazem Kadri (2-5 – 7) and Jonathan Huberdeau (0-5 – 5) both registering over a point-per game against San Jose. The Flames and Sharks will meet three times this season, with two of them coming at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

MARKY MARK:

Jacob Markstrom was named the NHL's First Star for the week ending on February 11th. The Gavle, SWE native started all four games for the Flames during their four-game road swing, going 3-1-0 with a .945 save-percentage and a 1.76 goals-against average and registered two assists over the trip. Since Feb. 1, Markstrom has an NHL-leading 121 saves and has seen the third-most ice time at 238:19, trailing only Alexander Georgiev (238:56) and Thatcher Demko (244:33). Over his last five starts, Markstrom is 4-1-0 with a shutout and a .956 save-percentage. With a record of 99-68-25 in 197 games as a Flame, Markstrom is just one win shy of becoming the fifth goaltender in Flames history to record 100 victories with the franchise.

HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau is currently at 699 points in his NHL career and is looking to become just the third skater to reach the 700-point plateau from the 2011 draft class along with Nikita Kucherov (819), and Johnny Gaudreau (718). Huberdeau has recorded five points (2-3 – 5) over his last four contests and 17 points (3-14 – 17) in 18 career meetings with the San Jose Sharks.

BETTER CALL PACHAL:

Earlier this season on October 12th, Brayden Pachal scored his first NHL goal against the San Jose Sharks while also skating at a career-best +3. Pachal was a waiver claim by Calgary back on February 4th, and the blueliner is slated to skate in his fifth game as a member of the Flames.

DOMESWEET DOME:

The Calgary Flames return home after a four game Eastern Conference road trip where they went 3-1-0. Over the four games, Calgary outscored their opponents 14-8 with MacKenzie Weegar leading the charge with three goals, while nine different skaters found the back of the net and 15 different Flames registered points. Jonathan Huberdeau and Nazem Kadri are tied with the team lead with five points since the start of February as the Flames get set to play their next four games on home ice starting tonight against San Jose before welcoming Detroit on Saturday, Winnipeg on Monday and finishing off against Boston a week from today.

DEFENSIVE SCORING:

After MacKenzie Weegar's hat trick on Saturday in Long Island, Calgary Flames defencemen have now scored 35 goals which is the second-most by a defensive core in the league so far this season, trailing only Colorado (44). Weegar leads the charge with 16 tallies, while Noah Hanifin (9), and Rasmus Andersson (7) are currently second and third in scoring among blueliners on the Flames.

COLTS CONNECTIONS:



Flames forward Andrew Mangiapane and defenseman Rasmus Andersson along with Sharks winger Kevin Labanc were all teammates on the Barrie Colts for two seasons in 2014-15 and 2015-16. The trio were all in the top five of Colts scoring in both seasons, with Andersson leading all Colts defenders in scoring over the two-year span with at least 60 points in both seasons. Labanc and Mangiapane would both break the 100-point plateau in the two campaigns and Mangiapane would be tied for second in goals (51) with fellow NHLer Alex DeBrincat in 2015-16 while Kevin Labanc led the OHL in assist that season (88). Mangiapane and Labanc also played together in Barrie in the 2013-14 season while Andersson was a member of the Malmo Redhawks.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Walker Duehr recorded his first career multi-point game at the Scotiabank Saddledome against the San Jose Sharks back on March 25th, 2023.

Mikael Backlund skated in his 900th NHL game against the San Jose Sharks last season on March 25th.
